THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: MATTHEW 23:1-12

Jesus spoke to the crowds and to his disciples, saying, "The scribes and the Pharisees have taken their seat on the chair of Moses. Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice. They tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels. They love places of honor at banquets, seats of honor in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and the salutation 'Rabbi.' As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven. Do not be called 'Master'; you have but one master, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

MONTH OF NOVEMBER



Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. As a reminder of our duty to pray for the suffering faithful in Purgatory, the Church has dedicated the month of November to the Holy Souls. The Holy Souls are those who have died in the state of grace but who are not yet free from all punishment due to their unforgiven venial sins and all other sins already forgiven for which satisfaction is still to be made. They are certain of

entering Heaven, but first they must suffer in Purgatory. The Holy Souls cannot help themselves because for them the night has come, when no man can work (John 9:4). It is our great privilege of brotherhood that we can shorten their time of separation from God by our prayers, good works, and, especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA – NOVEMBER 9TH:

Today the liturgy celebrates the dedication of the Lateran Basilica, called "mother and head of all the churches of the city and the world", the oldest and highest ranking of the four major basilicas in Rome. The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of the diocese of Rome, the official ecclesiastical seat of the Holy Father, the Bishop of Rome.

On this day we celebrate a mystery that is always relevant: God's desire to build a spiritual temple in the world, a community that worships him in spirit and truth (cf. John 4:23-24). But this observance also reminds us of the importance of the material buildings in which the community gathers to celebrate the praises of God. Every community therefore has the duty to take special care of its own sacred buildings, which are a precious religious and historical patrimony. Also the gathering at the courthouse square will be at 11 a.m. for its program. Please come and honor all our veterans, living and deceased.

On this 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Church urges us to hold firm to the message of eternal life. This is what safeguards our faith, especially in these perilous times. God will continue to strengthen us in our daily struggles through the message of eternal life. In our first reading today, through prophet Malachi, God warns us about the dangers of straying from the right part. While it is important to note that this message is meant as it were for "priests" and all "pastors of souls," God is equally speaking to each Christian. We are all expected to live good lives to the glory of God. Most importantly, it is a call to glorify God through our various calls. In the second reading, Paul and his companions were faithful pastors. They are role models for all of us pastors of souls. They preached and lived the message of eternal life, bringing it with faith, sincerity, and honesty. So, it was also received with honor and reverence. In today's Gospel, Jesus warns us of the hypocrisy and denounces religious show-offs and bigotry, which is opposed to the message of eternal life. One must be faithful to his calling and duty and not occupy a position just for the pride of being called father, sister, pastor, evangelist, minister. So, what Jesus is denouncing here is earthly pride. He wants us to be faithful to our Christian calling. Also, He wants us to be true to the message of eternal life. Fr. Bose

As stewards of the gifts we have been blessed with, we are called to follow his example. Pope Francis does the same. He tells church leaders to smell like the sheep and he lives those words. We are to pay attention to and be with people, like the nursing mother in the second reading who cares for her children. If we do as we say, others will want to do as we say and do, too.
