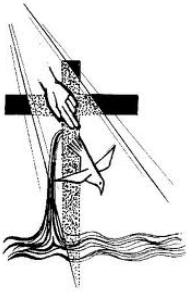

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY: JOHN 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples: "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming. He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you."

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

The dogma of faith which forms the object of the feast is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! The Father is not more God than the Son, neither is the Son more God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth. But I submit humbly and say: *Lord, I believe, help my weak faith.*

Why is this feast celebrated at this particular time? It may be interpreted as a finale to all the preceding feasts.

All three Persons contributed to and shared in the work of redemption. The Father sent His Son to earth, for "God so loved the world as to give His only-begotten Son." The Father called us to the faith. The Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, became man and died for us. He redeemed us and made us children of God. He ever remains the liturgist *par excellence* to whom we are united in all sacred functions. After Christ's ascension the Holy Spirit, however, became our Teacher, our Leader, our Guide, our Consoler. On solemn occasions a thanksgiving *Te Deum* rises spontaneously from Christian hearts.

The feast of the Most Holy Trinity may well be regarded as the Church's *Te Deum* of gratitude over all the blessings of the Christmas and Easter seasons; for this mystery is a synthesis of Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, Ascension and Pentecost. This feast, which falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost, should make us mindful that actually every Sunday is devoted to the honor of the Most Holy Trinity, that every Sunday is sanctified and consecrated to the triune God. Sunday after Sunday we should recall in a spirit of gratitude the gifts which the Blessed Trinity is bestowing upon us. The Father created and predestined us; on the first day of the week He began the work of creation. The Son redeemed us; Sunday is the "Day of the Lord," the day of His resurrection. The Holy Spirit sanctified us, made us His temple; on Sunday the Holy Spirit descended upon the infant Church. Sunday, therefore, is *the* day of the Most Holy Trinity. —Excerpted from *The Church's Year of Grace*, Pius Parsch-

Prayer for Fathers on Father's Day

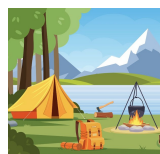

The Gospel reminds us that God’s love is not reserved for a few but offered to all: “God so loved the world...” (John 3:16). The Trinity is not a distant doctrine—it is the very life of God poured into us through baptism and lived through charity. **Pray and Practice:** *Lord, draw us into your divine communion. Teach us to love as you love, to forgive as you forgive, and to live as one.* Wishing you a week filled with unity, grace, and peace. **Fr. Bose**

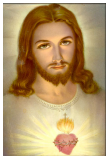
CHRISTIAN INITIATION AND MARRIAGE

Persons married to a divorced person or a person remarried after divorce(s) are required to receive a “decree of invalidity” for former marriage(s) before entering into full communion of the Catholic Church. This process may take more than a year. If a person is presently married to a Catholic, but not according to the proper norms required by the Catholic Church, these norms must first be fulfilled before the initiation sacraments of baptism, confirmation and Eucharist can be received. Marriage already contracted between the couple, though unlawful, is of such great importance to their lives as a couple that the Catholic Church places the highest priority in validating it as soon as possible. By validating their marriage first, the Catholic Church honors the couple so that they are now properly prepared to receive the other sacraments of the Catholic Church. In the meantime, the couple is encouraged to continue worshipping with our faith community each Sunday. *However, they are asked to suspend receiving all the sacraments until after their present marriage is validated.*

JUNE DEVOTION: THE SACRED HEART

Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of June is set apart for devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. "From among all the proofs of the infinite goodness of our Savior none stands out more prominently than the fact that, as the love of the faithful grew cold, He, Divine Love Itself, gave Himself to us to be honored by a very special devotion and that the rich treasury of the Church was thrown wide open in the interests of that devotion." These words of Pope Pius XI refer to the Sacred Heart Devotion, which in its present form dates from the revelations given to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1673-75.

The devotion consists in the divine worship of the human heart of Christ, which is united to His divinity and which is a symbol of His love for us. The aim of the devotion is to make our Lord king over our hearts by prompting them to return love to Him (especially through an act of consecration by which we offer to the Heart of Jesus both ourselves and all that belongs to us) and to make reparation for our ingratitude to God. **Our parish "Feast Day of the Sacred Heart" is June 27th.**
