TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: LUKE 14:1, 7-14

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully.

He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table.

"When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. Rather, when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then he said to the host who invited him, "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

CHILDREN: Does it make you a better person to be chosen first for a team or some other honor? Why or why not?

"Do it Anyway" Poem-Prayer

This poem-prayer was found on a wall inside Mother Teresa's home in Calcutta.

People are often unreasonable, irrational, and self-centered.

Forgive them anyway.

If you are kind, people may accuse you of selfish, ulterior motives.

Be kind anyway.

If you are successful, you will win some unfaithful friends and some genuine enemies.

Succeed anyway.

If you are honest and sincere people may deceive you.

Be honest and sincere anyway.

What you spend years creating, others could destroy overnight.

Create anyway.

If you find serenity and happiness, some may be jealous.

Be happy anyway.

The good you do today will often be forgotten.

Do good anyway.

Give the best you have, and it will never be enough.

Give your best anyway.

In the final analysis, it is between you and God.

It was never between you and them anyway.

At a crowded wedding in a village, a poor farmer once sat at the front. As the wealthy guests arrived, he was quietly asked to move back. That sting of shame lingered longer than the feast. Today, Jesus tells a similar story—not to shame us, but to invite us into a new kind of banquet: the Reign of God. In Sirach, we hear, "The greater you are, the more you must humble yourself." The Gospel reverses the ladder. Jesus says: don't wait to be humbled; choose the lowest place, not as false modesty, but as radical humility. Hebrews reminds us that we're not approaching a fearsome God on a fiery mountain, but at a festal gathering—welcomed not by merit, but by mercy. The poor, the differently abled, the migrant—how often do they find no seat at our tables? We invite those who repay us. But Jesus challenges us to host those who cannot—because in doing so, we become like God, who gives freely. Imagine our churches, schools, even weddings, shaped not by status but by inclusion. Today, Jesus isn't teaching etiquette. He's offering a glimpse into heaven's banquet. Will we take the lower place... so that all may have a place? Pray and Practice: Lord, teach us to take the lower place that we may make room for those the world forgets. Have a great week Fr. Bose

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - "Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you." Luke 14:13-14 - One of the main principles of living a stewardship lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.
