St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church

This past year (FY July 2020 through June 2021) has certainly been a year of challenges. I am amazed and grateful for the response of so many who stepped out of their comfort zones — volunteering, serving others, working for the poor, serving at our liturgies (serving at Mass, singing, arranging decorations) and doing untold acts of kindness.



We worked hard to stay in touch with you throughout the year. We live-streamed more than **365** Masses (Sundays, weekdays, First Communion, Graduation, etc.); we produced **411** videos to help bring you the Good News of our Lord. Thank you for subscribing to our YouTube channel to the tune of **2,520** subscribers.

We trained **38** altar servers, **50** extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, **15** ministers of Charity and **13** Acolytes. We created a socially distanced choir for Masses, which continued throughout the year. We baptized **99** children, celebrated **68** funerals and **35** weddings, prepared **42** couples for marriage, and prepared **11** people who joined the Church at Easter time.

Formation served 256
children and their families in the Under Thy
Roof program, prepared
147 children for First
Penance and First Communion, and over 100
teens and 11 adults for
Confirmation. 60 teens
and 35 middle school
youth participated in
youth ministry and 14
youth attended the trans-

formative summer camp, Covecrest, in Tiger, Georgia. Hundreds of adults continued to meet virtually and in person for bible studies and programs.

We had several special activities such as distribution of **450** bags of the Epiphany chalk to "chalk" the doors, and production of videos for our yearly Divine Novena. **150** participated in our outdoor Divine Mercy celebration, and **200** participated in our Feast of Corpus Christi Celebration.

We helped many mothers through our Gabriel project, and on Giving Sunday, some **500** families received gifts. Through the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, we gave aid to hundreds of families through direct service to help with rent and food.





We also updated our website, launched a new parish app, revitalized our Facebook page, and changed our weekly email communication provider.

Although our offertory income was below what we hoped and budgeted, we kept our expenses tight and finished the year within our means. The income from the negotiated easement will help in the coming years with major repairs and equipment replacement. We have taken on \$1.5m in debt to complete Our Lady of Lourdes Chapel and will work through that debt in the coming years as well.

We so look forward to normalization of our parish life. Please join us for our






Out of Fiscal Year 2022

Capital Projects Vear 2020-2021

Our Lady of Lourdes Chapel

At long last, Our Lady of Lourdes Chapel was dedicated on September 8, 2020. His Eminence Daniel Cardinal Dinardo presided over the beautiful Mass. The Mass is still available to watch on the parish's You-Tube channel. We will be adding benches, a Pietà statue, and a few more trees and roses to the prayer garden this fall. We continue to raise funds for the chapel.



Locker Room Renovation

With the financial support of the school we were able to manage and complete this renovation of the locker rooms, coach offices, and concession area behind the gym. The renovation also added much needed new restrooms for the primary and gym area. We added LED lighting to the gym.



Drainage Project and Easement

The City of West University along with TXDOT and its contractors have begun the project to replace the underground drainage system along Buffalo Speedway. The project began across our football field as the outfall for the drainage is into Poor Farm Ditch on the west side of our field. Since there was no recorded easement on the property, we negotiated this easement with the City of West University.

Major Repairs

We made much needed repairs to one area of the Church roofs. We also replaced the roof of the Primary Building which will enable us to continue its use for multiple purposes after the new building is constructed. We have replaced much of the campus landscaping which did not recover from the freeze. We have also been updating our security system. We also did some drainage and gutter work around Apostolic Center and the Rectory to improve runoff.

Building Bright Futures Campaign

This campaign for \$10.8m for a new Catholic Education Building was launched in October 2018. We have collected \$8.1m to date in payments with \$2m in pledges outstanding. Money was spent this year on architect fees, permitting, platting, construction planning and Ignite payments. We have 6 Ignite payments remaining (\$644K) of the 16 total payments.

The groundbreaking ceremony was held May 21, 2021. School students attended as well as the campaign chairs, parish leadership committees, lots of former students and even some former teachers. It was a true celebration of lots of hard work by so many. Thank you to all the donors and volunteers that have supported the campaign. We continue to raise funds to close the gap. Construction work on this building will begin soon.
