

The People Who Walk in Darkness Kave Seen a Great Light



Today's Liturgy focuses our attention on the beginning of Jesus's ministry. Upon learning that John the Baptist has been arrested, Jesus knows the time has come for him to begin his own work. And so, he withdraws to Galilee where he begins his preaching and calls his first disciples.

Jesus's message is clear and direct: "Repent for the kingdom of God is at hand." This is the message he preaches over and over again. God is about to do something new, something that the prophets of Israel longed and hoped for. God is about to establish his rule over humanity and all history in a new and marvelous way. But if we hope to enter the new creation God is bringing about in Christ, we must *repent*. We must change our old way of thinking so that it allies with Jesus's way of thinking. We must turn from one path and take another. Something must change in our lives.

St. Matthew understood the importance of Jesus's ministry. He sees it as the fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah that we hear in today's first reading: "the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death light has arisen."

Dear friends, without Christ in our life we sit in the darkness of sin overshadowed by the threat of eternal death that separates us from God. But when we are in Christ, when we walk with Christ, when Christ is at the center of our life, then we stand in the glorious light of Christ that is the life of God. We live in God's new creation; we have entered in the kingdom of God. We live in the light. We live in the kingdom of God. And so, we must follow Jesus in the way of discipleship.

The first thing Jesus does after his initial preaching of the gospel is to call his first disciples: "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." All of us who have been baptized into Christ are disciples of the Lord. Jesus has called us by name to follow him, to learn from him, and to preach the gospel.

To be a Christian is to be a disciple who lives in the light and proclaims the gospel to others. That is why all of us, without exception, must take responsibility for the growth and life of the church. All of us must call others to live in the glorious light of the kingdom. After all, if we experienced the new life of the gospel, why wouldn't we share it with others?

Here is something you can do this week that will make you more fully alive in Christ. Think of one person with whom you would like to share your faith and the new life you have in Christ. Pray for that person. Raise that person up in your daily prayer. And then, when the occasion arises, speak the word that the Lord will give you. If you pray for that person, the Lord will give you the word you need.
