What to do with blessed palms from Palm Sunday?

According to the Code of Canon Law, blessed items are not to be discarded in a trash can, but treated with respect. At Mass these palm branches were set apart by a blessing from the priest and made into a "sacramental", an object that is meant to draw us closer to the celebration of the seven sacraments. Throwing them in the trash ignores their sacred purpose and treats them like any other object we no longer need. Most sacramentals, like palm branches, can be burned or buried in order to properly dispose of them. This type of disposal honors their sacred purpose and returns them to the earth in a dignified way. Anyone can do this, but if you don't have the ability to burn or bury them, simply drop off your palm branches at the parish office.



From The Pastor's Desk . . .

Raised From Death

On this Fifth Sunday of Lent our Gospel is the third and final of the triad of special



Gospel selections calling us to deeper faith on our Lenten journey. We've witnessed the budding faith of the Samaritan woman at the well, and that of the man born blind, healed by Jesus. Now we hear the familiar story of Jesus raising his friend Lazarus from the dead. Although Jesus has healed many people during his ministry, he does not get to Lazarus in time. However, he uses the opportunity to elicit from his disciples, his friends Martha and Mary, and many in the crowd, a deeper faith in him. "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, even if he dies will live." Jesus asks Martha (and us), "Do you believe this?" Most of us struggle with the death of a loved one. We might even blame Jesus for not doing enough in response to our prayers, like Martha does: "Lord, if you had been here my brother would not have died." All of this is a natural reaction arising out of our own grief. The Lord certainly understands our grief. Even he wept when he saw where Lazarus was buried. They were good friends. Jesus is "perturbed" when he sees Mary's grief and again when he comes to the tomb. Death is an enemy, and standing face to face with death, Jesus becomes more than perturbed, he is downright angry. The Greek word behind our translation "perturbed" actually refers to the snorting of an angry bull that is ready to charge. Jesus' experience of death robbing his dear friend of life, foreshadows his own pending wrestling match with death. What we already know, is that Jesus will emerge with the victory!

Therefore, Jesus isn't content to leave us in our grief. He challenges us to ponder his victory over death and to believe in his promise of life. As we approach Easter, this gospel can help us put the events in Jesus' life into perspective. On Good Friday we will remember again the terrible agonizing death of Jesus on the cross. But that is not the final story. After the darkness of Good Friday dawns the beautiful morning of Easter and the empty tomb. Death cannot hold Jesus prisoner. And just as Jesus moves through death to eternal life, we too enjoy that same promise. St. Paul in his letter to the Romans writes, "Are you unaware that we who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life." May this promise of life, foreshadowed in the raising of Lazarus and made firm in the death and resurrection of Christ, give us all hope and courage to face our own death and the deaths of those we love, with firm belief that the One who is the resurrection and the life, will raise us also to everlasting life!

Palm Sunday Procession 9:30 AM Mass

On Palm Sunday, April 2nd, at the 9:30 Mass, we will gather outside the Parish Center entrance for the blessing of palms and the reading of the Gospel that recalls Jesus'



triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We will then form a procession from that place across the front parking lot and into the main entrance to the church. We are particularly inviting children of any age from both our school and faith formation program to join in the procession along with an older sibling or parent. However, anyone who wishes to join in is welcome. Once we are in church, following the opening prayer of the Mass, the children (K-6) will be invited to go to the lower church for a Children's Liturgy of the Word, which will be more engaging for them while the reading of the Passion is being done upstairs during the Mass for the older children and adults. The younger children will then process back upstairs during the Preparation of the Gifts (Offertory) to rejoin their families.. If they have brought a non-perishable food item to donate, it can be brought up to the altar at that time.

- The priest will then absolve you of your sins and send you forth FORGIVEN!

The Annunciation of Mary March 25



March 25th, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation. While not a feast day for a saint per se, it gives us the opportunity to reflect on Mary's role in salvation history. Her Fiat, her "yes," in response to the Angel Gabriel as he announces that she will conceive and bear a son by the power of the Holy Spirit, echoes across generations: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). Pope Francis refers to this day as a "feast of 'yes'" (Vanessa Corcoran, "A Pregnant Pause: Mary's Fiat and the Annunciation," America Magazine, December 10, 2018). The Holy Father said that Mary's response is the lynchpin to this crucial moment in salvation history.

Mary is a young Virgin betrothed to Joseph; the Angel Gabriel announces that "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the child to be born will be called Holy, the Son of God" (Lk.1:35).

Reflecting on Mary's "yes," we can apply it to our own lives: in what ways do I cooperate with God's will? As a parent, a single person, a priest or a religious...young people, adults, seniors, empty nesters, grandparents? Corcoran tells us: "Reply in haste to the angel, or rather through the angel to the Lord. Answer with a word, receive the Word of God. Speak your own word, embrace the eternal Word."

The Annunciation provides a framework for radical reliance upon the Holy Spirit alive in our midst. Are we guided by the Spirit as disciples? Does Mary's "yes" resonate with us, especially during this Lenten season? "When we listen to the Annunciation story, it is evident that inner contemplation has always been an integral aspect of Christian devotion. We would all do well to imitate Mary with such thoughtfulness in our own challenging moments." (Corcoran)

When the "Anno Domini" calendar was first introduced in the year 525, March 25 was the first day of the year. A prominent monk argued that this event commenced the age of grace. While our year no longer begins here, it is fitting to meditate on this great event as a model for discipleship.




