



SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Refer to p. 5 for more info on the Trinity. Today's gospel (Mt. 28: 16-20) has Jesus saying: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." Though Jesus was clear in his directive, it took the Church some 4 centuries plus to define the Trinity. Remember the word "Trinity" does not appear in the Bible. Plus, the Church had to decide upon if one is baptized "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit (Mt. 28:19) or only "in the name of Jesus Christ" as noted in Acts 2:38—"Peter said to them, 'Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the holy Spirit.'"

These 2 challenges in the early Church pointed out the need for a church authority to guide the Church to remain faithful to the truth. Thus we have the Pope & all the bishops, called the magisterium, based upon: "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. (Mt. 16:18)" "But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. (John 16:13)" In describing the role of the magisterium, I use the "rough" analogy of the U.S. Supreme Court. Their role is to interpret the meaning of the U.S. Constitution. Likewise, the Church's magisterium has the role to remain faithful to the teachings of Christ, to be guided by the Holy Spirit "into all the truth."

In today's gospel, we hear Jesus' directive to go and baptize. Today, the ordinary minister to baptize is a bishop, priest or deacon when one is available (Canon 861, §1). If clergy is not available, especially in mission areas, a bishop can designate a lay missionary or another trained lay person to baptize. But "in the case of necessity

any person with the right intention confers baptism (Canon 861, §2)." The Catechism of the Catholic Church #1256 states: "In case of necessity, any person, even someone not baptized, can baptize, if he has the required intention." So an unbaptized doctor or nurse in a Catholic hospital could baptize validly with the Church's intention.

"Pastors of souls, especially the pastor of a parish, are to be concerned that the Christian faithful are taught the correct way to baptize. (Canon 861, §2)." So in the event of a true emergency, a lay person can baptize pouring water over the head of the non-baptized (or at least chest or back), saying "(Name—not required), I baptize you, in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit." In an emergency, if available, blessed water is to be used but not required. The water is poured 3 times with each of the names of the Trinity, but only 1 pouring is sufficient for validity. The same person must pour the water and say the words. The child's parents are to notify a Catholic parish that an emergency baptism has occurred. Parents are encouraged/should bring the baptized child to one's parish so that a ceremony can occur supplying all the other parts of a baptismal ceremony, but naturally no "re-baptism" will occur. Our understanding is that once a valid baptism occurs, one is not to be "re-baptized." That is why we accept the valid baptisms of other Christian faith traditions when he or she chooses to become a Catholic.

This Monday is Memorial Day. Come and participate in the Holy Eucharist. Due to the holiday, the parish office is closed. Memorial Day is a U.S. federal holiday in remembrance of all the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. Armed Forces. It is celebrated on the final Monday of May and was known formerly as Decoration Day. It originated after the U.S. Civil War to commemorate both the Union and Confederate soldiers who died in that war. By the 20th century, Memorial Day was extended to honor all men and women who died in military service. Memorial Day remembers those who *died* in service in the military while Veterans Day on November 11 remembers all U.S. veterans who *served* in the military. See p. 7 for a prayer. Since holidays involve more travel & seem to "encourage" more drinking (& other substance usage), let us be mindful of driving more carefully.

SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following:

1) A **bow of the head** is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A **bow of the body** (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "**and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.**"

—General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275



“The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity leads us to contemplate the mystery of God who unceasingly creates, redeems and sanctifies, always with love and through love.” – Pope Francis

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith.

First, the Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but of one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature.

Second, the Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others.

Third, the Divine Persons are in relation to each other. The distinction of each is understood only in reference to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send him forth.

THE MYSTERY OF THE BLESSED TRINITY

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Church sets aside this Sunday to focus our attention on the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, God who is one, but three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The first reading from Deuteronomy emphasizes both God’s awesome greatness and amazing nearness. It might seem beyond belief, but the God of all creation speaks to us, protects us, and guides us. The second reading from Saint Paul’s Letter to the Romans describes how we are to relate to the three persons who are one God. We are led by the Spirit to meet God the Father as adopted children. Our adoption is such that we are even heirs with our brother, Christ, the second person of the Trinity, in whose sufferings we must also share. In Matthew’s Gospel, Jesus speaks with his authority as God and sends us to teach and baptize in the name of the Trinity.

FEAST OF FAITH Liturgy and the Holy Trinity

The Trinity is the central mystery of our faith. We believe that God is one, yet three: total unity and rich diversity. God is not a monolith, but a dynamic community of persons, a perfect, loving harmony of three. And the liturgy is the work of the Trinity. We begin all our liturgical celebrations with the sign of the cross, a reminder of our Trinitarian baptism, and the simplest of all professions of our faith. We believe that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and we gather in the name of this triune God. Throughout the Mass, we address our prayers to God the Father, through Christ our Lord, in the Spirit’s power. And the Father hears our prayer, transforming bread and wine into the Body and Blood of his Son by the Holy Spirit. The Church is “the sacrament of trinitarian communion” (Sacramentum Caritatis, 16). It is the Trinity who holds us together as well. In the words of Saint Cyprian, we are “a people made one by the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit” (quoted in Sacramentum Caritatis, 16).

- Church capacity is now 100%. Every pew may be used.
- Masks are not required but are encouraged.
- Use hand sanitizer upon entrance.
- All the church doors, including those in the transepts, are available for entrance / exit.
- Current practice continues of dropping offerings in the baskets at the entrances / exits.
- Presentation of the Gifts at Offertory resumes. Presenters are to sanitize their hands before touching the Offertory gifts. Both the ciborium (container for hosts) & wine cruet will have a lid.
- Holy Communion may be received on the hand or tongue.
- The distribution of the Chalice remains suspended.
- Those who are distributing Holy Communion (clergy & extraordinary distributors) will continue to wear masks & use hand sanitizer.
- Obligation to attend Mass still remains dispensed for now.
- Live streaming of the Saturday 5 pm Vigil Mass will continue.
- Confessions are now heard in the main confessional.
- No Holy Water will be available in the respective fonts for now, per Cardinal's directives. But if you who want to take Holy Water home (with your own bottles), you may use the Holy Water stainless steel dispenser now located in the narthex, nearest to the women's restroom.
- Sanitizing the pews will continue, but we are no longer required to sanitize after every Mass.
- Parish ministry meetings are now allowed on parish campus. Call parish office for scheduling.

The residence comfortably serves 24 priests, each with a suite. Full-time cooks provide three meals a day, 7 days a week; & full-time housekeepers provide daily housekeeping & laundry services. The residence also includes a beautiful Chapel, outdoor spaces, a media room, a work-out room, a library, & a dining room.






