



SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

Dear Friends in Christ,

The Fourth of July, also known as Independence Day or July 4th, has been a federal paid holiday in the United States only since 1938. In 1870, Congress made it a federal unpaid holiday. But the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution. On July 2nd, 1776, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence from England, and 2 days later on July 4th delegates from the 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence, a historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson. From 1776 to the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of United States independence, with festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues.

So for 241 years, the U.S. has experienced many great achievements & at times experienced realities that are not so complimentary of our country. But that should not surprise us since we all make good & bad decisions, sometimes intentionally and other times we thought it was a good decision that yielded negative consequences.

We need to pray for our nation. For a variety of reasons, there is much anger amongst people. We are a people divided. In my opinion, it seems that we are very intolerant of others, though we claim to cherish freedom of speech & a plurality of opinions. But do we really? So often, we are even afraid to share our differences because we do not want to cause problems. But by not doing so, we are causing tension since “unaddressed” differences normally come out in unhealthy ways. Are we willing to dialogue and accept differences? Are we willing to compromise yet still remain convicted to morals? This has to happen amongst our families & friends, our church, as well as on all levels of government. I feel so strongly on this concern that many times the penance I give in Confession is prayers for the healing of our nation & families. Pray for our nation (p. 7), church & families, as well as our unique challenges that so often others do not know about. So many people struggle in silence.

Let us pray for our bishops as they strive to lead and teach. They have an instrumental role when many people are skeptical of all types of leadership, so many people have an “opinion” of every topic, and how some people do not seem to believe there are objective truths and / or “one cannot impose a moral truth or value on others.” Yet all our laws incorporate a value or moral truth. It is a crime to steal or to murder someone (unless self-defense). Even traffic laws are value based. Though we believe the Holy Spirit will guide the bishops, they are still regular people, trying to do their best and at times literally do not know what is the best course of action.

It has been one year as of July 1st that I came to serve you as your pastor. What a year it has been! Covid has made everyone’s life a challenge. And making a change in pastor-ship during such a year has been interesting. I am learning so much, but it has re-enforced the reality that it takes much time to build relationships, build and earn trust, and to learn who you are collectively as a parish and individually. It takes time for you to learn who I am, to adjust to a new personality, leadership & liturgy style, to trust me. I have tried not to make too many changes, and when I have, I tried to give explanations for such changes. I love the liturgy of the Church, and I am firmly committed to celebrating the liturgy as the Church directs. Hopefully I am teaching along the way. FYI: I am adding Confession time immediately after the Friday 8:30 am Mass so as to make the Sacrament of Penance more available.

After one year, I am glad that I listened to God’s Spirit guiding me to this parish. I am glad that I wanted to come to serve you and am most grateful that I was assigned here. I am looking forward to my 2nd year, especially with less Covid restrictions that will allow more parish activities. That is where we get to know each other, work & play together. I hope that I will be able to come to your homes more and / or go out and have a meal with you.

In the past year, I have not taken any vacation at all, nor taken any extra days off, even after Christmas or Easter or even when my mother died. Some of that was due to Covid and some of it I felt it was important to be present to you. But I do have to start making vacation plans. When that occurs, I will let you know.

SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following:

1) A **bow of the head** is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A **bow of the body** (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words “**and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.**”

—General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275

NO BAD NEWS

There are many times when we say, “Tell me what I want to hear, and don’t confuse me with facts.” And we don’t take kindly to someone who might be bold enough to snuff out our expectations. The biggest problem with such an attitude is not that we miss out on the truth or the facts, but that we miss out on the new and surprising gifts others can give us. Like the townspeople in today’s Gospel story, we too often refuse to allow others to display the talents that can be good news for us. Today’s readings call for hospitality and faith and discernment. Hospitality opens the doors of our hearts and minds to the “stranger” among us, no matter how familiar he or she may seem to be. Faith enables us to accept the gifts of others, no matter how alarming or “strange” they may seem to be. Discernment helps us discover the prophets in our midst, no matter how amazing they may seem to be. Hospitality, faith, and discernment—cultivate these. Then, nobody can bring bad news.




