



SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

Sts. Joachim & Anne; Feast Day: July 26

They are the patrons of married couples; Anne is the patron of childless women, housewives, expectant mothers & grandmothers. "Mary grew up in the home of Joachim & Anne; she was surrounded by their love & faith: in their home she learned to listen to the Lord & to follow his will. Saints Joachim & Anne were part of a long chain of people who had transmitted their faith & love for God, expressed in the warmth & love of family life, down to Mary, who received the Son of God in her womb & who gave him to the world, to us. How precious is the family as the privileged place for transmitting the faith!"—*Pope Francis*

SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following:

1) A **bow of the head** is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A **bow of the body** (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "**and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.**"

July 24, 2022

Dear Friends in Christ,

Pope Francis established a World Day for Grandparents & the Elderly which took place for the 1st time last year. This year the celebration falls today, Sunday July 24th, on the 4th Sunday closest to the Feast of Saints Joachim & Anne celebrated on July 26th, Grandparents of Jesus, parents of Mary. See p. 8 for a prayer for Grandparents & the Elderly.

The theme chosen by Pope Francis for this year is: "In old age they will still bear fruit" (Psalm 92:15). The theme "intends to emphasize how grandparents and the elderly are a value and a gift both for society and for ecclesial communities." It is to emphasize the pastoral care of the elderly as a priority. Not only are grandchildren and young people called upon to be present in the lives of older people, but older people and grandparents also have a mission of evangelization, proclamation and prayer, and of encouraging young people in their faith.

Pope Francis stated that the elderly "should be cared for like a treasure of humanity: they are our wisdom, our memory. It is crucial that grandchildren remain close to their grandparents, who are like roots from which they draw the sap of human and spiritual values."

The Church states this year's theme "is also an invitation to reconsider and value grandparents and the elderly who are too often kept on the margins of families, civil and ecclesial communities. Their experience of life & faith can contribute, in fact, to building societies that are aware of their roots and capable of dreaming of a future based on greater solidarity."

If your grandparents or other elderly people are living, visit them. If that is not possible, call them. If they are not living, remember to pray for the repose of their souls. If possible, visit their graves.

This week, July 24-30, is National Natural Family Planning Awareness Week, an educational campaign of the USCCB to celebrate God's vision for marriage & promote the methods of Natural Family Planning (NFP). NFP is a general title for ethical, natural, safe & effective methods for family planning, both achieving & avoiding pregnancy in marriage. The date for this week highlights the anniversary of the papal encyclical *Humanae Vitae* (July 25th) which articulates Catholic beliefs about human sexuality, conjugal love, and responsible parenthood.

NFP is a topic that cannot be explained in a "sound bite." People do not always understand the differences between *artificial* means of contraception & NFP. People confuse NFP, a *scientific* based process which does take into account the unique nature & variations of a woman's menstrual cycle vs. the inaccurate Rhythm (or Calendar) method. See p. 5 for an attempt to discuss NFP, a wonderful testimonial letter & an excellent YouTube video on NFP. (If you are receiving this message as a Flocknote, just tab in on: <https://youtu.be/F9eUDrdJPog>) I am amazed how health conscious we are about foods & medicine, but at times we may not be as knowledgeable about chemicals used in artificial contraception versus none with NFP. I challenge all to become more informed on this Church teaching which is both beautiful & challenging!

One unfair & inaccurate criticism of the Church & others who support life & are opposed to abortion is that we "only care about the pregnancy & do not support the life once born." The Church & many other organizations are supporting mothers in need, while pregnant & once the child is born. In May, our parish held the very successful baby shower for mothers in need. In the last few weeks, we have been helping some specific mothers in need with diapers & other baby items, etc. Much is going on. And as so often is the case, the Church is working quietly behind the scenes to help mothers / families in need. Quietly so as to respect their privacy & their integrity.

Another way to support are Houston Pregnancy Help Centers, attend the musical Concert for Life 2022. One of our younger priests ordained for 3 years is singing at this concert. In fact, he has coordinated this concert even prior to his ordination and has raised over \$450,000 for organizations in Houston that help women in crisis pregnancies. If you are not a Catholic or a Catholic who is baptized only, do you have an interest to study the Catholic faith to see if you want to become a Catholic? The process to assist you is RCIA and will begin soon. Contact Molly Smith, our Director of Evangelization & Catechesis, in our office (281-955-7324 or mollys@stmaximilian.org). For the past few years, Deacon Matt Rust has coordinated RCIA. But he felt it was time for new leadership. Thank you Deacon Matt for your RCIA role. Thank you David & Lori for saying yes, as well as Molly who has been involved in RCIA for several years.

Let's reverence more the Word of God by refraining from being seated until....

Once the readings begin, you will notice some signs at the entrance doors. We are returning to a former practice used here & in some other parishes, asking *respectfully* that if you arrive after the Scriptures have begun, to *refrain* from seating yourselves *until during* the sung Alleluia or after the Gospel. Why? To respect the integrity of the Word of God & not to disturb others who are listening to the Word. We understand there may be exceptions that you have to be seated ASAP (like a person who is physically challenged) or to return to someone who needs your presence. The ushers have been instructed to ask *respectfully* but will not prevent you from entering. I ask you likewise to respect the rationale behind this practice: to respect the Word of God & others.

When we first married, my wife, Misty, and I were the typical secular couple. We relied on hormonal contraception. Due to bad side effects, that didn’t last long. Misty found out about Natural Family Planning (NFP) through a Catholic friend. Admittedly, I was suspicious of all the “hocus pocus” involving thermometers at o’ dark-thirty in the morning and observations written down in cryptic symbols on the NFP chart. That would all change in surprising ways once we got into living the NFP lifestyle.

Before having children, Misty had been an atheist and I had been an agnostic. With our first child, the miracle of life spurred a spiritual awakening in us. We realized the Holy Spirit had already led us into a Catholic life. Even after our conversion, however, NFP grew our relationship with each other and with God in ways we never expected.

We studied Pope John Paul II’s “theology of the body” and became excited about living out our faith and sharing it. It was thrilling to learn the compelling reasons behind the Church’s beautiful teachings on sex and marriage.

Much to my surprise, I also learned how grateful my wife was that I was willing to learn how her body worked. Sharing the family planning responsibility, as well as finding non-sexual ways of expressing affection and intimacy when we had good reasons to postpone pregnancy, strengthened our marriage and made me a better husband and father.

When we became Catholic, I knew I wanted to be the spiritual leader of our family, but I didn’t understand what that entailed besides herding our children to church on Sundays. Through NFP and Scripture, I discovered that I had a choice in the kind of man—the kind of husband—I was going to be.

We often blame Eve for eating the forbidden fruit. But in Genesis, we learn that after taking a bite, she turned & offered the fruit to Adam, who was with her. Adam didn’t stop her and say, “This is a bad idea, let’s go.” He did not protect his wife, but stood by silently while the serpent convinced her to surrender her holiness & damage her relationship with God.

Then there was St. Joseph. When Joseph obeyed the angel who told him to bring Mary into his home, he was accepting the public shame and embarrassment of a pregnant fiancée. He sacrificed his personal honor and reputation to obey God and protect Mary and Jesus.


The choice for a husband is clear: he can be his wife’s Adam or he can be her Joseph. A man can stand by silently and allow his wife to suffer the physical and spiritual consequences of contraception. Or he can defend her virtue, body, and soul by using NFP. Today, contraception is accepted and expected. Any man who forgoes it for NFP will likely be exposed to ridicule & criticism. But as St. Joseph taught us, there are some things more important than the opinion of others. May we husbands choose to be Joseph to our wives! (Tom & Misty Mealey have 4 children & live in the Diocese of Richmond.)



CONVERSATION WITH GOD

Prayer is our focus this weekend. In the Gospel, Jesus gives his disciples, and us, the Lord's Prayer, which we have cherished through the centuries. The first two words encompass much about our faith—unity among all Christians (Our), and a sense that we are in a deeply bonded relationship with God (Father).

In Genesis, we see Abraham in conversational prayer, in his creaturely humility before his Creator, seeking mercy and compassion for the innocent. The psalm is a lyrical prayer of thanksgiving and praise for the God who answered the sincere prayers of a people who had called out for help, showing them mercy. In Luke's Gospel, the disciples want to pray like Jesus, with the same intimacy—to experience God as Abba in the depths of their being.

Do we try to talk to God? Do we listen for answers? This relationship is always a work in progress.

JULY: For the Elderly
We pray for the elderly, who represent the roots and memory of a people; may their experience and wisdom help young people to look towards the future with hope and responsibility.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

That we may learn to see the difference between the things we need and the things we want.

“Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.” Luke 11:9

Jesus assures us that if we ask, God will take care of what we need. The problem is that our culture often confuses what we really need with what we simply want. The truth is that many of us need very little. However, we usually want so much more! 


