





#### SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

**ADULT BAPTISM:** Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

**INFANT BAPTISM** (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

#### SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

#### SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

#### **SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:**

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

It seemed like we had more people attending as compared to last year's festival. People were in such a joyful, upbeat & light hearted mood due to the weather & really enjoyed the festival. Thank you to all who worked so hard to plan, coordinate & execute the festival. Thank you to all who volunteered to work in any capacity. I am amazed how clean the parish campus is the Sunday morning after the festival. Thank you to all who cleaned up the campus so quickly. It is too early to give you any financial results on the festival. But as soon as we can, we will provide such figures.

This coming Tuesday, October 17<sup>th</sup>, Cardinal DiNardo will celebrate the 7 pm Mass and administer the Sacrament of Confirmation to some 30+ high school candidates. Note: the Tuesday Mass is normally at 6:30 pm. But for this one Tuesday only, the Mass will be at 7 pm. I am inviting the entire parish to come to this Mass since the Cardinal will be the celebrant, even though most of you have no connection to those who are being confirmed, other than they are our parishioners.

Mark your calendar to attend our parish International Festival after the Saturday 5 pm Vigil Mass on Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> in Kolbe Hall. This is the first time this International Festival is occurring since it was suspended when Covid occurred. It is a wonderful opportunity for our parish to come together to celebrate our cultural diversity with a food tasting from various cultures & live music. Our next blood drive is Sunday, Nov. 5<sup>th</sup>. See p. 5 on how you can make an appointment to give blood. Though walk ins will be welcomed, you are encouraged to make an appointment ASAP. Please give the gift of life by donating blood. Remember: blood cannot be manufactured. The blood banks are always in need of more blood. How would you feel if you are seriously ill and had to wait until more people donated blood?

Recently, our Auxiliary Bishop, Italo Dell'Oro, issued a letter, reminding that the November elections are coming. Naturally, the Church cannot endorse any particular candidate. But Bishop Italo stated the Church can advance the Church's position on nonpartisan issues that may be decided by voters. That includes taking a position on the Harris Health Bond Proposal that will appear on the November ballot. If this bond proposal is approved by the voters, \$2.9 billion would be added to improve health care & mental health services for the 1.2 million residents of Harris County who do not have health insurance.

Bishop Italo reminded us that 30 years ago, the U.S. Catholic Bishops issued a statement entitled "A Framework for Comprehensive Healthcare Reform," affirming that "every person has a right to adequate healthcare." They added that "this flows from the sanctity of life and the dignity that belongs to all human persons, who are made in the image of God."

This bond proposal will assist the Harris County Hospital District, doing business as the Harris Health System, as the public healthcare provider serving the residents of Harris County through an integrated network of 2 hospitals (Ben Taub & Lyndon B. Johnson) & nearly 40 clinics, health centers & specialty facilities. Its mission is to improve the health & well-being of all residents, through comprehensive medical services & programs delivered in collaboration with academic & medical school partners: Baylor College of Medicine, UTHealth Houston & MD Anderson Cancer Center.

Pending approval of the bond, construction of a new LBJ Hospital & planning of and design for the new community clinics & upgrades to Ben Taub Hospital can begin in 2024. More info will be included in a coming bulletin to explain how this \$2.9 billion will be spent to meet the growing need for more health care in Harris County.

What will this cost the property owner to fund such a bond proposal? If approved, financial support of the bond translates to about a two cent tax increase for property owners—meaning an owner of a \$300,000 property would pay about \$6 a month for the bond. Although most people do not want more taxes, we have to ask ourselves how important is health care to people who are in need. And what can we do to help others in need?



#### Do This in Remembrance of Me, Part 15: The First Reading By Fr. Luke Spannagel: Step-by-Step through the Mass

After spending some time reflecting on the Liturgy of the Word as a whole, this week we begin looking more closely at each part, beginning with the **First Reading**. We might hear the lector proclaim, "A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. In the days of Ahaz, king of Judah, son of Jotham, son of Uzziah, Rezin, king of Aram, and Pekah, king of Israel, son of Remaliah..." (Isaiah 7:1-9). With all these names, which many of us may not even know how to pronounce, we might wonder: Why do we use the Old Testament at Mass, anyway?

**A Witness to God's Faithfulness** As we said earlier, the First Reading at Mass is generally from the Old Testament. When we hear the stories of the Old Testament, we hear about how God called and began to form his people. If you are familiar with the Old Testament, you know there are times of faithfulness and falling away. There are prophets, judges, and other leaders that help call the people back to



faithfulness. There are times where God is clearly directly involved and times where he seems to be more in the background. We learn about God's faithfulness, even in the midst of our unfaithfulness. I am often struck by that faithfulness of God: we know we don't deserve it, and yet there he is, consistently loving, forgiving, leading, providing, and protecting, doing all the things that good fathers do for their beloved children. Hopefully, as we hear those words each week, they remind us we can always go to our loving God and Father.

As we reflected before, generally when we talk about the Old Testament, we talk about a preparation. Through Moses, the prophets, and other writers, God was preparing his people (and us) to receive the truth about Jesus—that he truly is the Messiah who came to set us free from sin and death so that we might live with the Father forever. The Old and New Testament work together: the Old prepares for the New, and the New tells us what we've been waiting for, namely, Jesus Christ (cf. Dei *Verbum*, no. 15).

The Family of God But why do we need all those names? The whole Bible, even parts we don't understand or that don't seem helpful, is part of God's precious word to his people. Charles Belmonte reminds us that, just as every particle of the Body of Christ is precious, so too is every word (and name) of the Bible. Sometimes the readings may seem "obscure" to us because we don't understand the ancient cultures of the Middle East. Sometimes they just mildly hint at one of the great mysteries of God and their importance can be easily overlooked. Sometimes we stumble over the names or we don't understand the poetic language. "Nevertheless, we can be sure that if we do our best, the Holy Spirit will give us enough capacity to grasp whatever we may need for our sanctification and mission in life. And even if what we have read [or heard] does not stay in our memory, the Word of God has purified and nourished our souls" (Understanding the Mass, p. 85)



We might think that the names aren't that important, but what they show us is a continuous string of people who are in relationship with God, an ongoing family which the Lord is building over time. Just like we remember the names of our grandparents and great-grandparents because they are part of our family tree, so too do we remember the names of these people who in some way had (and still have) an important part to play in God's family tree. As the Church teaches, "Christians should

accept with veneration these writings which give expression to a lively sense of God, which are a storehouse of sublime teaching on God and of sound wisdom on human life, as well as a wonderful treasury of prayers; in them, too, the mystery of our salvation is present in a hidden way" (Dei Verbum, no. 15).

One of my favorite things about the Old Testament is that God teaches us little by little. There is always a story to go with what we hear; there is always a bit-by-bit explanation for what God is trying to tell us. The Old Testament isn't just strange names and long stories with some songs and poetry mixed in. It is God speaking to us and saying gradually, "Come a little closer... Please get to know me... You will find happiness in me... I want to take care of you... I will send the Messiah to save you... I am your loving Father."

#### For Reflection:

- 1. In light of the insights on the significance of names and genealogy in the Old Testament, revisit Jesus' genealogy in Matthew 1:1-17 and/or Luke 3:23-38. Recall what you know about any of the persons whose names feature in these genealogies. For any names you do not recognize, pause and invite the Lord to help you see more clearly how he accomplishes his work through men and women throughout salvation history.
- 2. Do you have a written or visual "family tree" of your own heritage? If not, consider developing one for yourself or with your family. Take time to pray in thanksgiving for God's presence through your genealogy, and lift up any persons in particular need of healing or mercy.


