





SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following:

1) A **bow** *of the head* is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

Dear Friends in Christ,

Refer to the Mass schedule on p. 4 for All Saints Day & All Souls Day. It is a slightly expanded schedule compared to the one posted last weekend. Let me explain. Our normal schedule for All Saints Day & All Souls Day is: 8:30 am & 7 pm Mass on both days. We normally do not have a Vigil Mass for All Saints Day. After posting the schedule last week, I then realized All Saints Day falls on a Wednesday. We have a weekly 6:30 pm Tuesday Mass. As a result, Tuesday, Oct. 31st 6:30 pm Mass becomes a Vigil Mass for All Saints Day & will fulfill your obligation for Wednesday. This Tuesday's 6:30 pm Mass will be like any other Tuesday Mass with minimum music. But the 2 Wednesday Masses (8:30 am & 7 pm) will be more like a weekend Mass with more music. Note the Wednesday, Nov. 1st, & Thursday, Nov. 2nd, evening Mass will begin at 7 pm. Only Tuesday is at 6:30 pm since that is the regular scheduled time for every Tuesday Mass.

All Saints Day is a holy day of *obligation*, and we are expected / *obligated* to attend Mass on that day. If you attend Tuesday's 6:30 pm Mass, that Mass will fulfill your obligation for Wednesday's Mass. All Souls Day (or more formally called The Commemoration of All the Faithful) is a holy day, a special day to remember all those who have died, but it is not a day of obligation to attend Mass. We are encouraged to attend Mass. That is why I am offering a 2nd Mass on All Souls Day.

As Catholics, we believe in the communion of the Church of heaven & earth (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church #954). We believe in the 3 states of the Church. 1) For the living on this earth, some are his disciples who are the pilgrims living, desiring eternal life. Others have died from this life to eternal life. 2) We believe some are in heaven. They "are in glory, contemplating in full light, God himself triune and one, exactly as he is." On All Saints Day, we remember all those people who are now enjoying heaven, whether the formally canonized saints of the Church or all the other holy people who have been welcomed into heaven by a loving & merciful God. 3) Others have died and are being purified. These are the faithful departed who are in purgatory. These are the people we remember in prayer specifically on All Souls Day. Refer to p. 5 for the Memorial Wall & the Book of the Deceased. You may bring pictures of your deceased loved ones who died in the past year. You may enter the names

of your deceased loved ones in the Book of the Deceased.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church #1035-1037 states: "The teaching of the Church affirms the existence of hell and its eternity. Immediately after death the souls of those who die in a state of mortal sin descend into hell, where they suffer the punishments of hell, 'eternal fire.' The chief punishment of hell is eternal separation from God...The affirmations of Sacred Scripture and the teachings of the Church on the subject of hell are a call to the responsibility incumbent upon man to make use of his freedom in view of his eternal destiny. They are at the same time an urgent call to conversion...God predestines no one to go to hell; for this, a willful turning away from God (a mortal sin) is necessary, and persistence in it until the end. In the Eucharistic liturgy and in the daily prayers of her faithful, the Church implores the mercy of God, who does not want 'any to perish, but all to come to repentance."

Next Saturday, Nov. 4th after the 5 pm Vigil Mass, we are having our International Festival in Kolbe Hall, highlighting our diversity of cultures. Please sign up this last weekend after the Masses to bring a specialty dish representing your culture. Also, we are remembering our 40th anniversary of the founding of our parish at this festival. 

Do This in Remembrance of Me, Part 17: Second Reading By Fr. Luke Spannagel: Step-by-Step through the Mass

On Sundays and Solemnities, after the Responsorial Psalm, we always hear the proclamation of the Second Reading, which is taken from the New Testament books (other than the Gospels) & is generally continuous from one week to the next. While St. Paul is the most prolific of the New Testament writers, we also have readings from St. John, St. Peter, St. James, and others. Although the sentences in these readings are sometimes long and a little awkward (because they were originally written in Greek, not English), they are packed with great wisdom and directives for Christian living. As Edward Sri writes, "Though often selected independently of the First Reading and the Gospel, these New Testament writings reflect on the ministry of Jesus Christ and his saving work and the meaning it has for our lives. They also draw out the practical applications of our life in Christ and exhort us evermore to 'put on Christ' and turn away from sin' (A Biblical Walk Through the Mass, p. 64).



How to Live in Christ Every Day As we look through the books of the New Testament, we see how each writer was addressing a person or particular community with their own strengths and weaknesses. The writer knew his audience and, through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, taught these people what God asks of us and how to live in Christ every day. These readings call us to faithfulness and generosity in loving one another. Sometimes we hear joyful words of truth: "Beloved, see what

love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. Yet so we are" (1 Jn 3:1). We also hear words of consolation: "We always pray for you" (2 Thes 1:11). At other times, we will hear exhortations to holiness, such as, "Do you not know that you are a temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" (1 Cor 3:16) and "do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh" (Gal 5:13).

These writings are beneficial to us because St. Paul and the other writers were all helping early Christians understand how to live in an anti-Christian world (recall that Christianity was illegal in the Roman Empire during the first centuries of the Church). The writers provided answers to difficult questions, gave explanations for why we do certain things and not others, and exhorted the people to holiness and fidelity even in the midst of daily struggles and persecutions.

How to Live as a Christian in the World A couple of very common questions today are: "How do I really live as a Christian in the world? How do I make what I do on Sunday last all through the week?" Thanks to these New Testament Readings, we have answers to these questions. Look through the readings for any Sunday, and what do you see? "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ" (1 Cor 11:1); "For you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Gal 3:28); "For he is our peace" (Eph 2:14); "Seek

what is above" (Col 3:1); "that you may not grow weary and lose heart" (Heb 12:3); "Be doers of the word and not hearers only" (Jas 1:19); "Compete well for the faith" (1 Tim 6:12); "Children, let us love...in deed and truth" (1 Jn 3:18); "He will wipe every tear from their eyes" (Rev 21:4); "Always be ready to give an explanation...for your hope" (1 Pet 3:15). Does it feel like we could keep going and going? We really could! At every Sunday Mass and on Solemnities, the Second Reading is packed with wisdom from the saints to help us become saints, too!

For Reflection:

- 1. Invite family members, friends, or fellow parishioners to study a New Testament text (other than the Gospels) together. Find a resource or mentor to guide your prayerful study. Commit to meeting regularly, and experience how these texts addressed to the early Christian individuals and communities can strengthen your community life today.
- 2. Consider the significance of letter-writing in the early years of the Church's development. Which person(s) in your life could use some encouragement or exhortation by way of a letter? Take the time to reach out through this personal communication.
- 3. Popes and bishops still write letters to the faithful. Find the most recent letter your bishop has written, and prayerfully read his message. If you are moved to respond, go ahead!






