



SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.



SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following: 1) A bow of the head is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man." —General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275

In lieu of the normal Pastor's Message, a refresher on what happens during Holy Week & why. p. 3

Each year, I re-run an explanation of what occurs during Holy Week as a refresher. We begin Holy Week, the most holy of all weeks, when we remember the Paschal Mystery: the suffering, death, resurrection & ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. Make this Holy Week truly special & holy, different by not only attending the liturgies but striving to pray more & to live out more folly the great commandments to love God, neighbor & self. On Passion/Palm Sunday, we commemorate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem by hearing the passion according to Matthew.

At the 7 pm Chrism Mass on Tuesday, April 4 at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, Cardinal DiNardo will bless the Oil of the Sick (used in the Anointing of the Sick) & Oil of Catechumens (used to anoint individuals prior to Baptism). The Cardinal will consecrate the Chrism Oil. All 3 oils consist of olive oil. But only the Chrism Oil has the fragrant perfune of balsam, symbolizing the sweetness of Christ. The Chrism Oil is used at Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders (both for priesthood & the episcopate but not for the diaconate) & the dedication of a new church and/or new altar. These 3 oils will be brought to each parish,& they will be presented here at the 7 pm Holy Thursday Mass. Since Fr. Lawrence & some of the deacons will be at the Chrism Mass, there will be no 6:30 pm Mass on Tuesday, April 4 here at St. Maximilian (and no confessions prior to that Mass).



The Sacred Triduum

With the 7 pm Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, we enter the Easter Triduum—3 high holy days that conclude with evening vespers on Easter Sunday. The Church advises us not to have any Masses until the evening on Holy Thursday. At 7 pm, we remember Jesus' example of service when He washed the feet of his 12 apostles in the Gospel. In the Roman Missal, the washing of the feet is an option, not mandatory. But the Gospel mandate is that we all are called to serve one another. We remember the institution of the Eucharist & the ordained priesthood. We keep watch until midnight, praying before the Blessed Sacrament. Can you spend at least one hour in prayer, spending time before the Lord?

On Good Friday, we have the 3 pm Liturgy of Friday of the Passion of the Lord. This liturgy has 3 main components: 1) the Liturgy of the Word with the reading of the Passion from the Gospel of John; 2) the Veneration of the Cross: everyone is asked to venerate the cross with some sign of reverence: a kiss, touching the cross, a genuflection or bow, etc. But the Roman Missal does allow a "corporate" veneration of the cross from the pews; 3) Distribution of Holy Communion that was consecrated the evening before on Holy Thursday. Good Friday is the only day of the year that Mass is not offered.

Good Friday is a day of fast & abstinence (See p. 5).



On Holy Saturday, we have the great Easter Vigil that begins at 8:30 pm since the Church insists that this liturgy does not begin prior to nightfall. There is no 5 pm Saturday Vigil Mass this Saturday only. This liturgy consists of 4 parts: 1) A Service of Light with the lighting of the new Paschal Candle & singing of the Exultet, the Easter Proclamation; 2) Liturgy of the Word with scripture readings reminding us of salvation history, with the sung Gospel Alleluia returning after its Lenten absence; 3) Reception into the Church either through Baptism or non-Catholic Christians joining the Church. Also 3 baptized Catholics will receive Confirmation & Eucharist; and 4) Liturgy of the Eucharist. At the end of the Easter Vigil, a final blessing & dismissal is given, unlike at the end of Holy Thursday & Good Friday. On Easter Sunday, we have our normal Mass times (8 & 10 am; 12 Noon).

Make every effort to enter into this most Holy Week.

For many Eastern European countries, it's a tradition to have a basket of food blessed on Holy Saturday. This Catholic ritual has been cherished for centuries among many families. It has now been adopted by people of all ethnic backgrounds who enjoy this richly symbolic custom. What goes into a food basket depends on the one's preferences. Typical foods are bread, ham, sausage, butter, decorated eggs & wine, but can be any food that will be used on Easter Sunday to break the paschal fast of the Easter weekend. Decorate a food basket or simply bring your Easter food to be blessed & start a family tradition! Blessing will be held in the Chapel. Come to 8:30 am Morning Prayer, followed by blessing of the foods.



DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY, APRIL 16th



In the 1930's, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary:

"The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment...Let no soul

fear to draw near to Me...It is my desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy."

There will be a <u>special prayer service</u> to honor God's great attribute, that of His loving Mercy. We invite you to join us on <u>April 16th</u>, at 2:30 pm in the Church to pray and sing in recognition and thanksgiving for God's tremendous mercy.







Good Friday is a day of fast & abstinence.(Canon 1251)

Fasting binds all persons who have completed their 18th birthday through those who have completed their 59th year, unless prevented by poor health. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's own needs. Eating between meals is not allowed although fluids may be taken. (Canon 1252). If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering & death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully & to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

<u>Abstinence</u> binds all persons who have completed their 14th birthday, unless prevented by poor health. (<u>There is no upper age cut off for abstinence as there is for fasting.</u>) On days of abstinence during Lent (Ash Wednesday & Fridays), the consumption of meat of mammals or fowl is not allowed. The Church strongly encourages the observance of Friday abstinence throughout the year, but failure to do so is not regarded as sinful. (Canon 1252)

How does one even approach a person about abortions?


The best way to approach someone about abortion is not to bombard them with endless facts, statistics and science. The best way to discuss difficult issues is by using the Socratic method – that is, asking questions. When you ask questions & respectfully listen to their answers, the person might come to realize the

inconsistency of their arguments for themselves. Here are a few example questions you could ask:

- What is the cutoff line for when a baby should not be aborted?
- Is your support for abortion (or any restrictions on it) based on science or more of a "gut" feeling?
- Do you think the human dignity of babies in the womb increases over time? More questions to come.
