



SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.



SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following: 1) A **bow** of the head is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man." —General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last weekend was Divine Mercy Sunday. Pope Francis preached on God's abundant mercy. "The wounds of Christ, still visible after his resurrection, are the greatest sign of God's love & mercy....Let us ask ourselves, however, if in the name of this love, in the name of Jesus' wounds, whether we are willing to open our arms to those who are wounded by life, excluding no one from God's mercy, but welcoming everyone -- each person like a brother, like a sister, like God welcomes everyone."

Pope Francis said the community of the church "is where you will find me (Jesus); that is where I will show you the signs of the wounds impressed on my body: the signs of the love that overcomes hatred, of the pardon that disarms revenge, the signs of the life that conquers death....Christians should ask themselves where they look for Jesus.... Is it 'in some special event, in some spectacular or amazing religious manifestation, solely at the emotional or sensational level?' Or do they look for the Lord 'in the community, in the church, accepting the challenge of staying there, even though it is not perfect?' Despite all its limitations & failures--which are our limitations & failings--our mother church is the body of Christ....It is there, in the body of Christ, that, now & forever, the greatest signs of his love can be found impressed."

Based upon what the Pope said, let us all pray for people who have left the active practice of the Catholic faith because they have been hurt by clergy or laity. If they have gone to another parish or denomination, I wonder how long will it be before another hurt occurs since every body of believers is made of people who are capable of hurting others. If the offended person has given up on any church assembly, then how sad that is. As the Pope stated: "It is there, in the body of Christ, that, now & forever, the greatest signs of his love can be found impressed." Invite people to come home to church.

This Sunday is our parish blood drive. Please give the gift of life by donating blood. You can reserve a time to donate (tinyurl.com/yk8hznt9). Walk-ins are welcome. With our last blood drive, we collected 26 pints of blood. Though grateful for these donations, I think our parish could donate much more. There is no substitute for blood. It cannot be manufactured. The only way is to donate blood. While 1 in 7 hospitalized people will need a blood transfusion in a life-

time, only 1 in 20 eligible blood donors actually donate. Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center needs 1,000 donations every day of the year to serve patients in our community. Giving on an ongoing basis helps ensure blood components are always available for the patients. Your donation could mean the difference between life & death for someone. With each donation of blood, you are saving up to 3 lives because a whole blood donation can be divided into 3 components—red blood cells, plasma & platelets.

- Red blood cells are used to treat cancer, surgery & trauma patients.
- Plasma often is needed to replace fluids in burn & trauma patients.
- Platelets help cancer & bone marrow transplant patients recover.

Last week we distributed the book "Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist." If you did not receive your copy, you may pick up such a copy on Saturday after Mass from the ACTS ladies in front of church or on Sunday during Coffee & Donuts. It is an excellent book to help us understand the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread & wine become the Body & Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit & the instrumentality of the priest. The whole Christ is truly present -- body, blood, soul & divinity -- under the appearances of bread & wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Have you noticed that the parking lot has been restriped? Funds from the Maintenance & Repair Fund helped cover the cost of \$22,000+. Continue to be generous to this fund to help fund other necessary projects. Also, there are some "able-bodied" people who should not be parking in the handicapped parking spaces. These spaces are reserved solely for those who are "handicapped" & should have a handicap permit to do so. For safety issues, drive slowly in the lot.

What are <u>appropriate signs of reverence</u> with respect to the Body & Blood of Christ?

"The Body and Blood of Christ present under the appearances of bread and wine are treated with the greatest reverence both during and after the celebration of the Eucharist (cf. *Mysterium Fidei*, nos. 56-61). For example, the tabernacle in which the consecrated bread is reserved is placed "in some part of the church or oratory which is distinguished, conspicuous, beautifully decorated, and suitable for prayer" (Code of Canon Law, Can. 938, §2). According to the tradition of the Latin Church, one should genuflect in the presence of the tabernacle containing the reserved sacrament. In the Eastern Catholic Churches, the traditional practice is to make the sign of the cross and to bow profoundly. The liturgical gestures from both traditions reflect reverence, respect, and adoration."



Please take note below

(What the U.S. Bishops are saying!)

"It is appropriate for the members of the assembly to greet each other in the gathering space of the church (that is, the vestibule or narthex), but it is not appropriate to speak in loud or boisterous tones in the body of the church (that is, the nave) because of the presence of Christ in the tabernacle."

"Also, the Church requires everyone to fast before receiving the Body and Blood of Christ as a sign of reverence and recollection (unless illness prevents one from doing so). In the Latin Church, one must generally fast for at least one hour; members of Eastern Catholic Churches must follow the practice established by their own Church."

U.S. Bishops' Pro-Life Chairman on Chemical Abortion Drug Ruling by Circuit Court APRIL 14, 2023 BY THE USCCB'S

WASHINGTON — On Wednesday night, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 5th Circuit partially upheld a recent district court ruling to reverse preliminarily the U.S. Food & Drug Administration's loosening of access & safety standards for the abortion drug, mifepristone. The circuit court overturned, however, part of the lower court's ruling, which would have suspended the approval of mifepristone to be on the market while the case continues to proceed in the courts. Bishop Michael F. Burbidge of Arlington, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, provided the following statement in response:

"The 5th Circuit was right to recognize the dangers of unrestricted chemical abortion to women's health & safety. We are grateful for the restoration of protections, and any limitation on the use of these lethal drugs. We hope that the final ruling will result in removal of chemical abortion from the market altogether. Abortion is never the right choice for a difficult or unexpected pregnancy, as it always ends one life and risks another. We pray ardently that our nation will authentically support and accompany women, so that ending the lives of their children alone in their own homes will be unthinkable."






