



SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following:

1) A **bow** *of the head* is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

—General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275

May 7, 2023

Dear Friends in Christ,

In our Catholic tradition, the month of May is dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God. Just as many people are preparing their flower beds for new growth in May, so too is the entire month of May dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God. Originally, some of this devotion was to counteract and/or Christianize the secular feasts that were dedicated to pagan gods / goddesses who were credited with blooms or blossoms. Its origins are varied, going back to the 1300's. But overall, it was to bring appropriate honor to Mary & her role in salvation history. Many people will make an extra effort to pray the rosary, especially at home. Next Sunday at the 10 am Mass on Mother's Day, we will have the "Rite of Crowning of an Image of the Blessed Virgin Mary Within Mass."

As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints, indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us. Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God, by which account she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace, she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. At the same time, however, because she belongs to the offspring of Adam, she is one with all those who are to be saved. (*Lumen Gentium*, no. 53)

Mary embraces God's will and freely chooses to cooperate with God's grace, thereby fulfilling a crucial role in God's plan of salvation. Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son. In these devotions to Mary, "while the Mother is honored, the Son, through whom all things have their being and in whom it has pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell, is rightly known, loved and glorified and . . . all His commands are observed." The Church honors her as the Mother of God, looks to her as a model of perfect discipleship, and asks for her prayers to God on our behalf. Good news about the additional church pews we have ordered. If all goes well, the additional pews will be installed beginning, Monday, May 22nd. If they do not finish that week, the installers will come back on Monday, May 29th (yes, even though it is Memorial Day). Daily Mass will be moved into Kolbe Hall those weekdays to allow the installers more time each day to work in the church.

In preparation for the installation of the pews, the chairs in both transepts will be removed after the 12 Noon Mass on Sunday, May 21st so that the floors can be cleaned & buffed, starting Monday, May 22nd. Reason: to remove all (or most of) the white scuff marks caused by the chairs. Only time will tell how much progress the installers will make before the weekend of May 27th/28th. There is a chance that weekend that not all of the additional pews will be installed.

Pews will be installed in both transepts & around the baptismal font. The chairs next to the baptismal font which were purchased when the church was built will be moved into the chapel on Sunday, May 21st. The chairs that are in the transepts & chapel are from the original worship space & are some 35 years old. When the church was built, they did not have enough money for all the pews. You were promised that additional pews would be purchased as finances allowed. So some 13 years later, we are securing these additional pews. You are encouraged, if possible, to make a donation to offset the cost of these additional pews of \$209,000. Mark any contribution specifically to "pews."

Hopefully, you have noticed the entire parking lot has been re-striped at a cost of \$23,340, including power washing. The Pastoral Council suggested it should be done. The Council also brought up the issue of safety due to the unfortunate speed by some drivers. After discussion by the Pastoral Council, we are installing "speed bumps" in various parts of the parking lot to control excessive speed. I do not think anyone will be "ecstatic" with speed bumps (at a cost of \$4,492), but safety has to be our primary concern! Money came from the Maintenance & Repair Fund. Please be generous to this Maintenance & Repair Fund.

Hopefully you are noticing & approving the improvements to our landscaping. Once again, say a prayer of thanksgiving for the person who is doing all this work since gardening & the beauty of our campus is her passion.

Crowning of Mary with Flowers Today at 10 am Mass



May is Mary's month! And during May, throughout the Catholic world, special devotions honor the Virgin Mary. "May Crowning" is a traditional Catholic ritual that occurs in the month of May and it recognizes Mary as Queen of heaven and earth. Why May? May is considered the season of the beginning of new life. "May Crowning" marks a new spiritual season. Our Mary,

Queen of heaven and earth, lifted us right out of the last long, cold days of winter & firmly planted our hearts in the warm & promising soil of spring.

Elizabeth greeted the Blessed Virgin, pregnant with Jesus, as 'the mother of my Lord' (Lk 1:41-43). Mary is the perfect follower of Christ. The maid of Nazareth consented to God's plan; she journeyed on the pilgrimage of faith; she listened to God's Word and kept it in her heart; she remained steadfast in close union with her Son, all the way to the foot of the Cross; she persevered in prayer with the Church. Thus, in an eminent way she won the "crown of righteousness" (2 Tim 4:8), the "crown of life" (Jas 1:12; Rev 2:10), the "crown of glory" (1 Pet 5:4) that is promised to those who follow Christ.


