



SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

Qualifications to be an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC's-lay distributors) OR a Lector / Reader.

- Have Baptism, Confirmation & Holy Communion
- Person of genuine Eucharistic faith.
- Living exemplary Catholic lives (including "regular" confession, i.e., going to confession at least once a year for your grave sins—Canon 989).
- If married, your marriage must be recognized by the Church.
- If divorced but single, one can be an EMHC.
- No impediment to sacramental reception, such as irregular unions (marriages not recognized by the Church), cohabiting, members of forbidden organizations (e.g. Free Masonry, etc.), etc.
- Be CMG trained (Child & Youth Protection Safe Environment Training) & approved by the Archdiocese.
- If you have *any* questions, ask Fr. Lawrence.
- Training session for EMHC's: Tuesday, June 6th after the 6:30 pm Mass.
- Training session for lectors to be announced.

SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following: 1) A bow of the head is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man." —General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275

Dear Friends in Christ,

The Church celebrates Pentecost this weekend. Pentecost has various understandings throughout history. Its roots are in the Old Testament, being the 50th day after Passover. It was called the Feast of Weeks, *Shavuot*, an agricultural festival celebrating and giving thanks for the "first fruits" of the spring harvest (cf. Lev. 23; Ex. 23; Ex. 34). Eventually, this feast began to be celebrated, commemorating the giving of the Torah, the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai, 50 days after Exodus. And now, Pentecost celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the early Church 50 days after Easter.

Pentecost marks the end of the Easter Season. After Sunday, the Paschal (Easter) Candle will be moved from the ambo (pulpit) to the baptismal font. Red vestments are worn today to reflect the tongues of flame that appeared above the disciples' heads. Red vestments are worn also on feast days commemorating martyrs & the shedding of their blood.

This Monday is Memorial Day. Come & participate in the 8:30 am Mass. Mass will be in Kolbe Hall since the pew installers are scheduled to work on Memorial Day. Due to the holiday, the parish office is closed. Memorial Day is a U.S. federal holiday in remembrance of all the men & women who *died* while serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, particularly those killed in armed conflict. It is celebrated on the final Monday of May and was known formerly as Decoration Day. It originated after the U.S. Civil War to commemorate both the Union & Confederate soldiers who died in that war. By the 20th century, Memorial Day was extended to honor all men & women who died in military service. See p. 7 for a prayer. Since holidays involve more travel & seem to "encourage" more drinking (& other substance usage), let us be mindful of driving more carefully & soberly.

On Tuesday, May 23rd, there were several workers unloading a large tractor trailer full of pews. The project manager hopes to install as many pews in the transepts (arms) of the church, as well as around the baptismal font. We are not sure if all the pews will be installed by this weekend.

After the new pews are installed, then all the existing previous pew & kneeler cushions will be replaced with brand new cushions with the upholstery matching the new upholstery. The existing previous upholstery is no longer availa-

ble. So that we do not have the church with previous, 13 year old upholstery & all the new pews with brand new, different fabric, the decision was made to make everything to match. Plus, they will be replacing all the existing pew kneeler hardware with a more sturdy metal that supposedly will not break as easily at the previous hardware. This project will take up 2 full weeks to complete.

Concerning the fabric selection, the decision was a joint, <u>unanimous</u> decision of <u>several</u> people, some with interior design expertise. We felt the darker fabric matched the space better & would not show dirt/stains as much. We also liked the small cross signs & the shell symbol. There was a limited number of fabrics that actually would have been suitable for our church.

Thank you for the volunteers who moved on 2 different days the chairs out of the church/chapel into the hall. Thank you to those who cleaned & mopped both chapel, choir & baptism area in preparation for the new pews. The chairs in the chapel are the chairs that were around the baptism font. These chairs were purchased when the church was built.

The pew project is costing about \$209,000. That includes \$4,150 for cleaning & polishing the floors in both transepts. To be honest, we are fortunate to have money in savings. But that makes a huge dent in our savings. So I am asking if you can afford to make an additional contribution to assist, mark that contribution with a memo toward "pew project." Any contributions will be welcomed!

We are doing rather well with our DSF contributions. But we lack \$49,775 to meet our mandatory amount by June 30th. If you remember, I challenged everyone that if we meet our goal by June 30th, then I will not speak about DSF, other than to give you updates in the bulletin. IF you have not made your contribution, please do so ASAP. The easiest way is to use the QR code for DSF at the bottom of p. 7. Or you use the DSF envelopes in the pews.

I ask you to pray about the opportunity to serve as a distributor of Holy Communion. The next training session is Tuesday, June 6th in the church after the 6:30 pm Mass (about 7:15 pm). See p. 2 for the qualifications. We always need more people to distribute Holy Communion, just as we need more lectors (readers), ushers, sacristans (those who get all the items ready for Mass), altar servers, choir members, operators for the projection screens, etc.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading—When the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles, they were able to speak in diverse languages, & this enabled people from different nations to comprehend the gospel's message. This occurrence marked the inception of the Church, & it led to the conversion of thousands of individuals (Acts 2:1-11).

Psalm—Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth (Ps 104).

Second Reading—Paul teaches that there are various gifts given by the Holy Spirit, which are meant to be used to benefit the entire body of Christ. He emphasizes the unity of the Church, explaining that just as the human body is made up of many parts that work together, so too are the members of the Church united as one body in Christ through the Spirit (Cor. 12:3-13).

Gospel—Jesus appears to his disciples after his resurrection. He greets them with peace, shows them his wounds, & then breathes on them, giving them the gift of the Holy Spirit & commissioning them to forgive sins (John 20:19-23).

Since we are remembering the Holy Spirit, let's review the 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit that come with the Sacrament of Baptism & are sealed in the Sacrament of Confirmation:

Wisdom is both the knowledge of and judgment about "divine things" and the ability to judge and direct human affairs according to divine truth. This enables us to know God and esteem divine things above worldly things.

Understanding is penetrating insight into the very heart of things, especially those higher truths that are necessary for our eternal salvation—in effect, the ability to "see" God. Helps us to understand our Catholic Faith, the Bible and Saints.

Counsel allows a person to be directed by God in matters necessary for salvation. This is the knowledge necessary to guide ourselves and others to do God's will. It helps us help others get through spiritual and temporal problems.

Fortitude denotes a firmness of mind in doing good and in avoiding evil, particularly when it is difficult or dangerous to do so, and the confidence to overcome all obstacles, even deadly ones, by virtue of the assurance of everlasting life. This is the strength we need to endure and have courage. It helps us suffer persecution and adversities for the sake of good.

Knowledge is the ability to judge correctly about matters of faith and right action, so as to never wander from the straight path of justice. This helps us to know God, ourselves and others as God knows.

Piety is, principally, revering God with filial affection, paying worship and duty to God, paying due duty to all people on account of their relationship to God, and honoring the saints and not contradicting Scripture. The Latin word *pietas* denotes the reverence that we give to our father and to our country; since God is the Father of all, the worship of God is also called piety. This gift infuses us with love for serving God and see Him in all events through a holy life of prayer.

Fear of God is, in this context, "filial" or chaste fear whereby we revere God and avoid separating ourselves from him—as opposed to "servile" fear, whereby we fear punishment. We have such reverence for God that we do not want to do anything that will cause harm to our relationship with God or do anything that will displease or offend God.

Most of the above definitions come from St. Thomas Aquinas' writings in the 13th century.




