



#### SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

**ADULT BAPTISM:** Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

**INFANT BAPTISM** (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

#### **SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:**

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

#### SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

#### **SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:**

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

#### SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following:

1) A **bow** of the head is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A **bow** of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

—General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*). This feast is a moveable feast. In some countries, it is considered a holy day of obligation when it falls on Thursday after Trinity Sunday, 60 days after Easter Sunday. In the U.S., it is transferred to the following Sunday after Trinity Sunday. It has been celebrated universally since the year 1264.

The Eucharist is the central teaching unique to the Catholic faith. From the beginning, we have held that the Eucharist is the real presence of Jesus & not just a mere symbol. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states #1374: "The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as 'the perfection of the spiritual life & the end to which all the sacraments tend.' In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist 'the body & blood, together with the soul & divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ &, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, & substantially contained.' 'This presence is called 'real' - by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be 'real' too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a substantial presence by which Christ, God & man, makes himself wholly & entirely present."

I want to clarify an incorrect usage of terminology that is very prevalent unfortunately, and many clergy & lay leaders are guilty of such usage, as well as different parish bulletins. So often when a person refers to a lay person as a distributor of Holy Communion, that distributor is called incorrectly a "Eucharistic" minister. According to our Catholic teaching, there is only one "Eucharistic minister" who is a Catholic priest or bishop (not a deacon). Canon 900 §1 states: "The minister who is able to confect the sacrament of the Eucharist in the person of Christ is a validly ordained priest alone." Redemptionis Sacramentum #154 states "the only minister who can confect the Sacrament of the Eucharist in persona Christi is a validly ordained Priest"....the name 'minister of the Eucharist' belongs properly to the Priest alone."

There is a difference between a "Eucharistic minister" who is only a bishop or priest (not a deacon) & a distributor of Holy Communion. There are 2 different distributors of Holy Communion: the Ordinary Minister of Holy Communion (bishop, priest & deacon) & Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC: a designated lay person trained to

distribute Holy Communion). The Ordinary Minister of Holy Communion is clergy who should always be distributing Holy Communion since it is a role inherent in his ordained ministry, unless there is a legitimate reason that prevents him from distributing Holy Communion, like a broken arm, inability to stand for a prolonged period of time, etc. When there is enough clergy present like at an archdiocesan liturgy, then only the clergy should be distributing Holy Communion. If there is not enough clergy available like at most regular parish Masses, then the laity are called to assist to distribute Holy Communion as "extraordinary" ministers. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, #182 states the proper role of a deacon is to distribute the Chalice (The Blood of Christ).

Canon 910 §1 states: "The ordinary minister of Holy Communion is a bishop, presbyter (priest), or deacon. Canon 910 §2 states: "The extraordinary minister of Holy Communion is an acolyte or another member of the Christian faithful designated according to the norm of canon 230, §3." *Redemptionis Sacramentum* #156 states "This function is to be understood strictly according to the name by which it is known, that is to say, that of extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, and not 'special minister of Holy Communion' nor 'extraordinary minister of the Eucharist' nor "special minister of the Eucharist."

I believe it is important to use correct terminology, just as we want to be called by our correct names. When I train lay people to distribute Holy Communion, I tell them they are not "bread" or "wine" ministers or are not giving out "bread or wine," but rather they are the distributors of The Body of Christ (consecrated Hosts) or The Blood of Christ (Chalice). What was previously bread & wine has been transformed into the Real Presence of Christ, His Body & Blood!

This weekend it is the archdiocesan custom that the <u>entire</u> <u>primary</u> collection of all parishes goes to St. Mary's Seminary to support the education of our seminarians so that we will have future priests.

I hope you like the new additional pews and how all the seat & kneeler cushions now match. Unfortunately, one pew was made incorrectly. The pew manufacturer will be sending a new pew, but due to its size, that one new pew must be shipped on an extended truck trailer. It will arrive hopefully in July when another church in Texas is getting new pews.

I am most grateful to David Ricke, our parishioner & on the Finance Council, who oversaw this entire pew project, including being present most of the installation time to ensure all was done correctly. Thank you for all who helped move chairs, clean the floors & clean the new pews.
