



#### SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

#### SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

#### SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

#### SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

## SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following: 1) A **bow** of the head is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was —General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275 incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate Father's Day. This recognition came to be observed nationally with President Calvin Coolidge's support in 1924. But it was not until 1966 that President Lyndon Johnson issued the 1<sup>st</sup> presidential proclamation honoring fathers on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of June. President Richard Nixon declared it a permanent holiday by law in 1972.

Fatherhood is a beautiful vocation to love, joy & heartache, expectations & anxiety. It is filled with wonderful moments as well as challenges and, at times crosses, always trying to balance fatherhood with other responsibilities such as work, the household, etc. We need to pray for all fathers (and mothers) to be good parents, open to God's graces. Let us pray that fathers lead their children to a faith life with the Lord by their own example of living out the faith. Let us give thanks for the many wonderful fathers. But like all people, at times fathers make mistakes and/or sin. Let us pray for these shortcomings. Let us pray also for fathers who need conversion, especially those who have abandoned their responsibilities as a father (whether to the unborn or born child), or who do not take enough parental responsibility or who suffer from great difficulties, like addictions to alcohol and/or drug abuse, etc. Let us pray for healing in such possible hurts or shortcomings. Pray the prayer for fathers on p. 5.

Last weekend, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ: the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. "In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist 'the body & blood, together with the soul & divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ &, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, & substantially contained.' (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1374)."

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has called us to a National Eucharistic Revival. We are in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of that revival with a focus in the parish studying & appreciating the Eucharist more deeply. In light of that call, our parish passed out the 2 weekends after Easter Sunday the book *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist* by Dr Brant Pitre. Hopefully, you are enjoying its content. To assist you to unpack that book & the Eucharist, we are offering a 10 week lesson on the Eucharist. This opportunity is offered twice a week: at 9:30 am either on Saturday (started June 10<sup>th</sup>) or Thursday (starting June 29<sup>th</sup>). You are invited to attend all 10 lessons OR any lesson that your schedule allows. So if you have missed the Saturday lessons already, you can still come to the remaining sessions.

Studying on your own is acceptable, but there is a value to study with other parishioners. Why? Others will have questions or insights that will help you to learn even more than just on your own. But whatever fits your schedule the best & that you take advantage of these resources is the most important reality. Another resource is: https://www.eucharisticrevival.org/learn-resources We need to be knowledgeable about the teachings of the Catholic Church. There is a sad saying "Ignorant Catholics are future Protestants." It is so unfortunate that some Catholics turn to other denominations not understanding the beauty & truths of the Catholic faith, especially on the Eucharist!

Though we have been in Ordinary Time for some 2 plus weeks, this weekend is the first weekend named as the 11<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, and we start wearing green vestments. The last 2 weekends we had 2 different solemnities: the Most Holy Trinity and the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ. This weekend we return to reciting the Penitential Rite (Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy; Lord, have mercy); the Universal Prayer (known also as Prayers of the Faithful or General Intercessions; we pray to the Lord; Lord, hear our prayer) and the Our Father. We have been singing these parts for the unity / continuity of the Lenten & Easter Seasons, plus the 2 last weekends with the 2 respective solemnities. During these seasons, I have been using incense normally on the average every other weekend, though there have been some back to back weekends, depending on the "festivity" of those weekends.

I am utilizing a variety of legitimate options for the entire year, including using a variety of Eucharistic prayers on different weekends. Some people prefer more singing; others less. Do you realize the Roman Missal encourages us to sing the Creed, which is common in the Vietnamese churches, and to sing the Eucharistic prayer, as the Cardinal does—no, we will not do that here. Some people want incense every weekend; others prefer not to have incense. I use only a "minimum" amount of incense each time. Plus, we use a 'hypoallergenic' incense that is suppose to be best to those who might be more sensitive to incense. But there are many other smells that I do not have control over, such as perfumes, colognes, etc. The variety of options & preferences can be a blessing of variety to enrich the worship here. Let us become ever more knowledgeable of the faith and appreciate the beauty & the options of the Church's liturgy!



## 3rd Saturday of each Month: "The Chosen"

Have you heard the buzz about the show that re-imagines the Gospels showing how Jesus taught and loved? 




