



SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following: 1) A **bow** of the head is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was —General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275 incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

Dear Friends in Christ,

Tuesday is July 4th. It is the 247th anniversary of our nation's independence. We have so much to be proud of. But just like any person, our nation is a work in progress. We have beautiful truths embedded in important rights. We need to continue to live them out even more fully, just as we are called to live out more fully Jesus' commandment to "love one another as I love you (John 15:12).

Remember the liturgical principle of *Lex Orandi, Lex Credendi, Lex Vivendi* (The law of praying is the law of believing is the law of living). See how that principle is embodied in the Collect (Opening Prayer) for the Mass on July 4th which is as follows:

Let us pray:

Father of all nations and ages, we recall the day when our country claimed its place among the family of nations; for what has been achieved we give you thanks, for the work that still remains we ask your help, and as you have called us from many peoples to

be one nation, grant that, under your providence, our country may share your blessings with all the peoples of the earth. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you

in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Notice how we are reminded that God is the Father of all nations & ages, that we give thanks for what has been achieved, that we ask God's help for the work that still remains, that our nation is made up of many peoples and we are to share God's blessings with all peoples of the earth. I am amazed at the beauty of our prayers for Mass. Yet I wonder how often that beauty is perceived by the people who are listening and supposedly praying with the priest celebrant.

Normally on Tuesdays, we have confessions at 6 pm followed by the 6:30 pm Mass. We felt more people would come on this holiday if the Mass were at 10 am, the normal time for such Masses on some major holidays. As a result,

there will be no 6 pm confessions nor a 6:30 pm Mass on this Tuesday only. So I invite you all to come to the 10 am Mass this Tuesday on July 4th "to give thanks to God for what has been achieved," ask that we continue to improve in "the work that still remains" and that we as a nation "share God's blessings with all the peoples of the earth."

Starting at only the 10 am Mass next Sunday, July 9th, we are resuming the Children's Liturgy of the Word where the children will be dismissed prior to the 1st reading so as to hear a message more on a child's level of comprehension. Then the children will be welcomed back at the Offertory for the rest of the Mass. We wish we could have it at the 12 Noon Mass also, but we have only enough volunteers for the 10 am Mass. IF we secure more volunteers, we are receptive to extending it to the 12 Noon Mass time also.

Recently, a mother emailed me, asking IF I would be receptive to a Mother's Group forming here. Mothers need the support & fellowship of other Catholic mothers who share similar values & concerns in their vocation of mother-hood. Many mothers feel "alone & isolated" in rearing their children, sometimes without the benefit of family nearby. I told this interested mother that I would be very supportive of such a group forming here. I consulted Eileen Mace, director of Kolbe Kids EC Program. Eileen & this one parishioner are taking the 1st steps to starting such a Mother's Group here, presuming there is such a desire. Prior to Covid, our parish celebrated our patron's feast day each year on the Saturday normally closest to August 14th, the actual feast of St. Maximilian Kolbe. We are reviving that custom. On Saturday, August 12th, we will have a brief organ recital concert prior to the 5 pm Vigil Mass. When we dedicated our new organ, it was the context of sung Evening Prayer (Vespers) & a musical concert. This August 12th concert will showcase the variety of features of this new organ in a way that was not exhibited at the dedication prayer service. The invited organist will play for the 5 pm Mass & play some postlude music immediately following the Mass. After that 5 pm Mass in Kolbe Hall, we will have our traditional gathering with hamburgers, hot dogs, etc., being served. Mark you calendars for this event, and the return of the International Festival on Saturday, Nov. 4th.



have this money in savings. But that has made a huge dent in our savings. If you are able to make an additional contribution to assist in this project, mark that contribution with a memo toward "pew project."






