



SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following: 1) A **bow** of the head is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man." —General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275

July 16, 2023

Dear Friends in Christ,

For the last 2 weekends, I have announced the importance of seeing the movie, Sound of Freedom, that addresses the evil of human sex trafficking of children. Many people are pleased the movie is doing much better than ever expected. This movie was delayed in its release by 5 years. There are many supporters of this movie. But of course, not everyone is supportive, criticizing certain parts or characters of the movie or the real life people behind the movie. But what cannot be disputed is the fact that sex human trafficking is a reality in our world, an evil that must be exposed & addressed.

If you have not seen the movie, go see it ASAP. Please stay to watch the entire credits after the movie. There is a 3 minute, special message by the main actor, Jim Caviezel, about this movie that needs to be heard. I am posting this special message on our parish website & on p. 6 of this bulletin & sent it out via Flocknotes.

According to the Department of Homeland Security, "Human trafficking involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act. (It generates over \$150 billion in profits per year.) Every year, 40.3 million of men, women & children are trafficked worldwide - including right here in the U.S. California, Texas & Florida are the states with the highest numbers. It can happen in any community and victims can be any age, race, gender, or nationality. Traffickers might use the following methods to lure victims into trafficking situations:

- Violence
- Manipulation
- False promises of well-paying jobs
- Romantic relationships"

"Language barriers, fear of their traffickers, and/or fear of law enforcement frequently keep victims from seeking help, making human trafficking a hidden crime." Traffickers look for people who are easy targets for a variety of reasons, including:

- Psychological or emotional vulnerability
- Economic hardship
- Lack of a social safety net
- Natural disasters
- Political instability"

"The trauma caused by the traffickers can be so great that many may not identify themselves as victims or ask for help, even in highly public settings....Human trafficking is often a

hidden crime. Victims may be afraid to come forward and get help; they may be forced or coerced through threats or violence; they may fear retribution from traffickers, including danger to their families; and they may not be in possession of or have control of their identification documents."

"Human trafficking exists in every country, including the U.S. It exists nationwide—in cities, suburbs & rural towns. Human trafficking includes sex trafficking. But it is not the only type of human trafficking. Forced labor is another type of human trafficking; both involve exploitation of people. Victims are found in legitimate & illegitimate labor industries, including sweatshops, massage parlors, agriculture, restaurants, hotels & domestic service."

"Forced labor occurs when individuals are compelled against their will to provide work or service through the use of force, fraud, or coercion. This crime happens both in the United States and overseas. The International Labour Organization (ILO) estimated that 24.9 million people around the globe were in forced labor as of 2016. Victims are rarely able to seek help for various reasons. For instance, they may be hindered by language barriers, or they may physically be unable to leave the premises to seek help if their movements are restricted and monitored by their employer."

"Traffickers who exploit people for forced labor do not discriminate. Neither do employers: Victims can be any age, race, religious affiliation, gender identity, or nationality. They may also come from any socioeconomic group. Certain risk factors, however, may make certain individuals more vulnerable to forced labor than others., including:

- Unstable immigration status
- Language barriers
- Poverty & lack of basic needs like food, shelter & safety
- The psychological effects of a recent or past trauma
- Lack of social support systems like friends, family, and community
- Physical or developmental disabilities"

"Traffickers frequently target vulnerable populations, such as children, individuals without lawful immigration status, those with debts, and those who are isolated, impoverished, or disabled, to name a few. U.S. citizens, foreign nationals, women, men, and children can all be victims of forced labor." Source: https://www.dhs.gov/blue-campaign/ what-human-trafficking


