



#### SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

**ADULT BAPTISM:** Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

**INFANT BAPTISM** (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

#### SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

#### SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

#### **SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:**

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.

#### SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following:

1) A **bow** of the head is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

#### September 3, 2023

Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend is Labor Day Weekend where many, not all, celebrate the national holiday of Labor Day. Occurring on the 1<sup>st</sup> Monday in September, Labor Day was a creation of the labor movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of U.S. workers. Since it is a national holiday, let us pray for the safety of those who might be traveling and for enjoyment on this holiday.

Let us remember all those who are unemployed, especially those who are not valued as much since they are older, or discriminated against for other reasons, and for those who are "under-employed." Pray for more opportunities in trade schools, skilled training or apprenticeships. Pray for those in college who are preparing for their careers.

On the first Tuesday in August, we had in the church a Holy Hour (7 pm—8 pm) concluding with Benediction (blessing the assembly with the Consecrated Host), immediately after the 6:30 pm Mass. That was so well received that we have decided with consultation from the Pastoral Council that we will have such a Holy Hour every first Tuesday of the month, starting this Tuesday, Sept. 5<sup>th</sup>. See p. 5 for info.

Though we are so fortunate to have 24 hour Exposition & adoration, the Church encourages us to have such "Holy Hours" with Benediction. The hour will be filled with some music, reading of scripture, a brief reflection and plenty of silent prayer, all elements of what the Church ideally expects in a Holy Hour. For some people, a guided prayer hour is very helpful in their prayer. The coordinators of this Holy Hour have named it *Thysia*, which is a Greek word for sacrifice or offering. What a great opportunity to offer up an hour of prayer & adoration to our Lord. Come & pray in the Church before the exposed Blessed Sacrament on Tuesday, Sept. 5<sup>th</sup>, immediately after the 6:30 pm Mass (7 pm-8 pm). To keep it simple to remember, this Holy Hour will occur every first Tuesday of the month.

I also remind you that every Tuesday, I am available for confessions some 30 minutes plus before the Tuesday 6:30 pm Mass. I encourage you to take advantage of confession and/or 6:30 pm Mass. (Since I will be on vacation in the middle of September, there will be no 6 pm Tuesday confessions on Tuesday, Sept. 12<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup>.)

I will be present at all this weekend's Masses except at the 10 am Mass. Fr. Wayne Ly will be the celebrant & homilist at 10 am. I will be at our neighboring parish, St. Matthew the Evangelist, installing the new priest as the Administrator (akin to being a Pastor. But one is named Administrator

when the priest is getting his first parish in charge, during his first year. Then afterwards, he is given the title pastor.) I will return here for the 12 Noon Mass.

Though the Faith Formation deadline has passed, if you have not registered your children yet, please contact the office immediately to see if there is any room left for your children. We are still in need of more faith formation teachers. Please volunteer for the privilege of passing on the truths of our faith to our younger people. Contact the office.

If you are not baptized, or baptized in another Christian denomination or you are a baptized Catholic who has not received your First Holy Communion & Confirmation (or you know someone), our RCIA process is for you. Contact the parish office ASAP since RCIA sessions begin shortly.

Check out the new, weekly Bible Blitz on p. 5 to see how good your knowledge is of the Sunday Scripture readings. Another Adult Faith Formation process is beginning Sept.  $10^{th}$  or  $15^{th}$ . It is a 10 session study on the Prophets of the Old Testament. See p. 8 for more info. For those who want to view the popular series, "The Chosen," it has moved to the  $2^{nd}$  Saturday of the month after the 5 pm Vigil Mass. The next session is on Saturday, Sept.  $9^{th}$  at about 6:15 pm. See p. 8 for more info. For men who want faith formation & fellowship, TMIY meets every Friday at in the Education Bldg, 5 am-7 am. They are beginning a new series "The Light of Men" on Friday, Sept.  $15^{th}$ . OR on the 2nd Saturday of the month (Sept  $9^{th}$ : 7:30 am-9 am) in the Education Bldg, Fishers of Men meet. For women, stay tuned for future meeting times for the Sisters of the Spirit.

If you have not picked up your Fall Festival raffle tickets, you may do so after the Masses. Many volunteers are needed for the festival. Volunteer your time & talent by speaking to the Festival people after Mass.

Please participate in the Houston Coalition for Life's Run/Walk for Life on Saturday, Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>. Walking is a great witness for life! But also make a pledge to sponsor either Fr. Lawrence OR any of the other parishioners listed on the web site. You can use the QR code on p. 10 or go to the parish website. IF every walker of our about 150 walkers from St. Maximilian would have 5 people to make a pledge of \$25 each, then that would raise some \$18,750. If we had 300 walkers, then twice the amount! Naturally, some people would pledge more or less. To date, I personally have \$10,768 in pledges with 60 donors (10 parishioners, 5 Anonymous, 45 donors from previous parishioners). 
#### Firefighter Mass 2023 Save the Date





Time is a gift. God gives time to us with certain expectations of how we'll use it. However, our free will allows us to do whatever we want with it—good or bad. We can cherish our time, but we can also neglect it. We can hoard our time, but we can also share it. We can invest our time, but we can also squander it...



#### Do This in Remembrance of Me, Part 7: Greeting By Fr. Luke Spannagel: Step-by-Step through the Mass

"Hello, Joe. How are you?" Whenever we see someone we know, we might greet him or her in this way. However, the Mass, the gathering of the family of God, doesn't begin like this at all. Why not? Without a doubt, the Mass isn't just like meeting people on the street. When we come to Mass, we aren't just passing by an acquaintance: we are encountering and worshipping Almighty God. After the Sign of the Cross, the priest says, "The Lord be with you," or one of the other versions given in the Missal, such as "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of

the Holy Spirit be with you all;" or "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." This greeting indicates right away that what we are about to do is going to be very different from the normal daily routine. Also, it recalls that we are part of something greater—the universal celebration of the Liturgy—God with all his people.

Far from Ordinary If the only thing the priest said was something like, "I'm glad to see you" or "Boy, it's cold today," he might give the impression that we are just entering into familiar chatter. We could miss that something sacred is about to happen. So, the universal greeting helps us prepare to enter more fully into the celebration of the Mass and helps us to realize this will be a sacred gathering with Almighty God present before us. If you think about the words, they are actually a prayer said by the priest asking that the grace, peace, love, etc., of God be with each person—now that's a way to start a gathering of God's people! The faithful then respond with their own part of the prayer, asking a similar grace for the priest by responding, "And with your spirit."

**Whose Spirit?** Why do we say, "And with your spirit?" Our English translation of the phrase is actually a direct word-for-word translation from the Latin prayers of the Mass: "Et cum spiritu tuo." This phrase also clearly connects us to several places in the Bible. For example, we see the priest's greeting, "The Lord be with you," in Ruth 2:4; & we see the people's response, "The Lord be with your spirit," in 2 Tim 4:22.

Okay, Father, I see where those lines are in the Bible. But what does "spirit" mean here? According to several saints and Christian writers, "spirit" refers not to the soul of the priest but to the spirit he has received through the sacrament of Holy Orders. As Edward Sri writes, quoting Jeremey Driscoll for support: "By saying 'and with your spirit,' the people are acknowledging the Holy Spirit's unique activity through the priest during the sacred liturgy by virtue of his ordination. As Jeremy Driscoll explains, 'The people are addressing the "spirit" of the priest; that is, that deepest interior part of his being where he has been ordained precisely to lead the people in the sacred action. They are saying in effect, "Be the priest for us now," aware that there is only one priest, Christ Himself, and that this one who represents them now must be finely tuned to perform his sacred duties well". (A Biblical Walk Through the Mass, p. 28).

The greeting at the start of Mass is a prayer that the Lord will be present with the people and a prayer back from the people acknowledging the spiritual gift God has given to the priest to help lead us in prayer. It is definitely a more formal greeting than we would use out and about. However, what we do at Church is definitely different than meeting each other at a ballgame or a restaurant. The priest may very well go on to give some words of welcome or make a comment on the weather, but those comments follow the opening dialogue: "The Lord be with you," "And with your spirit." Now, let's pray together as God's family!

For Reflection: Read Ruth 2 and 2 Timothy 4:19-22 to see our liturgical greetings in these contexts. 


