



#### SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

**ADULT BAPTISM:** Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

**INFANT BAPTISM** (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

#### **SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:**

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

#### SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

#### SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.



#### SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following:

1) A **bow** of the head is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

—General Instruction to the Roman Missal, #275

#### January 14, 2024

Dear Friends in Christ,

Many times I "repeat" myself when teaching because repetition is how we learn. But also, each year we have new people and/or people now "hear" for the first time. The Christmas Season ended after Monday, Jan. 8<sup>th</sup> with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. (In some years, this feast day falls on a Sunday.) Prior to 1969, some might remember that the Christmas Season lasted for 40 days through February 2, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the temple (also known as Candlemas).

We began the 1<sup>st</sup> Week of Ordinary Time on Tuesday, Jan. 9<sup>th</sup>. Only then do the Christmas decorations come down. There is no such 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time since the Baptism of the Lord preempts it when it falls on a Sunday. Ordinary Time includes all those times outside of Advent, Christmas, Lent and the Easter Season. Remember "Ordinary Time" does not infer this time is not special, distinctive, interesting or does not include important events in the life of Jesus such as forgiveness, healings & other miracles.

Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas & Easter seasons) or in penance (as in Advent & Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ.

The vestment color during Ordinary Time is green. Why green? Green for many signifies hope and growth, just like the first buds in spring time. We are hopeful and grow when we hear the life and ministry of Jesus.

Tomorrow, Monday, Jan. 15<sup>th</sup>, is a national holiday commemorating the life of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. It is observed on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of January. He was born on Jan. 15, 1929 & was killed on April 4, 1968. He was the prominent leader & spokesperson for the Civil Rights Movement from 1955 until he was assassinated in 1968. President Ronald Reagan signed the MLK holiday into law in 1983, and it was first observed 3 years later. Initially, some states resisted observing the holiday. Finally in 2000, all 50 states began to observe it.

Fr. Lawrence W. Jozwiak Pastor Pope Francis has stated that we must combat the indifference to what is happening around us. We must make an effort to be informed & then to do something! Likewise, Dr. Martin Luther King stated "Nothing in all the world is more dangerous than sincere ignorance & conscientious stupidity." Once we become aware, then we must make a decision: strive to do something or to do nothing. Dr. King said: "He who passively accepts evil is as much involved in it as he who helps to perpetrate it. He who accepts evil without protesting against it is really cooperating with it." Whatever the injustice, we are all called to be knowledgeable, concerned & somehow we are to respond. Injustice, violence,

hate, prejudice & discrimination have no place in society.

To be knowledgeable: January is Human Trafficking Awareness Month. Although slavery is commonly thought to be a thing of the past, human traffickers generate \$150 billion in profits by trapping millions of people in horrific situations around the world, including here in the U.S. Traffickers use violence, threats, deception, debt bondage & other manipulative tactics to force people to engage in commercial sex or to provide labor or services against their will. Estimates vary worldwide, but some 24.9 million are in forced labor, including 3.8 million adults & 1 million children in forced sexual exploitation. 71% of all human trafficking are women & girls. 25% of them are children. **First Reading**: In the temple, young Samuel hears the Lord's voice thrice but confuses it for Eli. Eli recognizes the divine call & advises Samuel to respond, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." Samuel obeys, & from then on, he grows in God's presence, with his words carrying significance. (1 Sm 3:3-19)

**Psalm**: With patient anticipation, I waited for the Lord. He inclined to my plea, gracing me with a new song of praise. I offer not sacrifices, but an open ear to obey. In the scroll, it's written—my joy is in fulfilling Your will, & Your law resides within my heart. I proclaim Your righteousness boldly, my lips unbridled in the assembly. (Ps 40)

**Second Reading**: Remember, our bodies are meant for the Lord, a temple of the Holy Spirit. United with Christ, we must avoid immorality, as it dishonors both ourselves & God. We were bought at a cost, so let's honor Him in our bodies. (1 Cor 6:13-20)

**Gospel:** John the Baptist points out Jesus as the Lamb of God. Two of his disciples decide to follow Jesus, & he invites them to see where he stays. Andrew, one of the disciples, excitedly tells his brother Simon Peter that they've found the Messiah, & Jesus gives Peter a new name, Cephas (Peter). (Jn 1:35-42)

#### Do This in Remembrance of Me, Part 28: The Creed as Profession of Faith By Fr. Luke Spannagel: Step-by-Step through the Mass

What does the word *Creed* mean? According to Fr. Guy Oury, "A Latin word for the Creed is *symbolum*. Its first meaning is that of a sign, a mark of recognition by which an envoy is accredited or

strangers know each other as belonging to the same group. The 'symbol' of faith identifies Christians. People who are not Christian cannot profess it without a lie on their part" (*The Mass*, p. 71). In addition to being a sign of our unity, the Creed also is a summary of core doctrines we believe in and an important part of the Mass. The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* states, "The purpose of the Creed or Profession of Faith is that the whole gathered people may respond to the Word of God proclaimed in the readings taken from Sacred Scripture and explained in the Homily and that they may also honor and confess the great mysteries of the faith by pronouncing the rule of faith in a formula approved for liturgical use and before the celebration of these mysteries in the Eucharist begins" (*GIRM*, no. 67). In summary, Charles Belmonte says, "The symbol or Creed expresses our response and assent to what we have just heard in the readings and in the homily" (*Understanding the Mass*, p. 99). Having heard the truths of the Faith in the Liturgy of the Word, now we profess them in the Creed.

**Stand and Profess** Why do we stand up to profess our Faith? As the Diocese of Peoria teaches, "Through the Creed, we as a community of believers stand and profess, in precise terms, the foundations of our faith. We stand for the Creed because of its importance in our Church and in our lives. Of important note is another gesture the Church asks of us as we profess the Creed. As we say '[and by] the Holy Spirit [was incarnate] of the Virgin Mary and became man,' we are to bow in adoration of the Incarnation and birth of our Lord. Interestingly, on those respective solemnities



(Annunciation and Christmas) we are to retain the ancient custom of genuflecting during those lines" ("A Study of the Mass," p. 10). As we have reviewed previously, each of the gestures and postures within the liturgy has a meaning and can help us pray more deeply. Throughout the Mass, we stand together for the principal prayers. In a very practical way, standing is another way of giving our assent, as when a crowd stands in applause. Standing adds an additional fervor to the recognition. In a similar way, standing to pray together adds an element of strength to the words we proclaim. Bowing while we recall the Incarnation acknowledges in a humble way how much we honor that significant moment in world history. Genuflecting on the Solemnities of the Annunciation and Christmas adds even more solemn praise to the joy of that moment, reflecting our adoration of our Lord who took on a human nature, becoming man for our sake.



As we profess our faith together, we are joined in a unity that began at our Baptism. "As on the day of our Baptism, when our whole life was entrusted to the 'standard teaching,' let us embrace the Creed of our life-giving faith. To say the Credo with faith is to enter into communion with God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and also with the whole Church which transmits the faith to us and in whose midst we believe" (*CCC*, no. 197). The *Catechism* quotes St. Ambrose: "The Creed is the spiritual seal, our

hearts' meditation and ever-present guardian; it is, unquestionably, the treasure of our soul'" (CCC, no. 197).

Reflecting upon St. Ambrose's words recalls for me the amazing gift we have been given through our Baptism, being invited into the very life of God. That is definitely worth standing up and professing together!

#### For Reflection:


1. Consider your posture(s) during various forms of prayer. What prompts you to stand in respect and fervor? What leads you to bow your hand in awe and wonder? Pay attention to praying with your whole self, including your bodily posture.

2. The next time you pray the Creed alone, call to mind your unity with all Christians who profess this faith.
