



SACRAMENT of BAPTISM:

ADULT BAPTISM: Adults who desire to become Catholic will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

INFANT BAPTISM (under the age of 7 years old): We celebrate Infant Baptism on the 2nd Saturday of each month. Parents of infants to be baptized are to attend Baptismal classes, preferably before the child is born. Godparents are encouraged to attend but are not required.

SACRAMENT of CONFIRMATION:

Adults and older youth who have not been Confirmed should contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT of MARRIAGE

Couples who are considering marriage are to contact the parish office, at least six (6) months (preferably earlier) before the couple's projected wedding date.

SACRAMENT of ANOINTING of the SICK:

Any Catholic who is to have surgery due to a serious illness OR whose health is seriously impaired due to a serious illness or old age should be anointed ASAP, preferably before going to the hospital. Contact ASAP a priest to schedule an anointing.



SIGNIFICANCE of BOWING

A bow signifies reverence & honor shown to the names or event being mentioned. We are to do the following:

1) A **bow** of the head is made when the three Divine Persons (the Trinity) are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated.

2) A bow of the body (a profound bow) is made during the Creed with the words "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I announced last weekend, we are making a change in the tabernacle. I am hoping that transfer will be complete by this weekend, unless complications arise. Let me explain how we came to this decision. After consulting the deacons & their wives, staff, Art & Environment committee, Pastoral & Finance Councils & the Cardinal & receiving their complete support, the original tabernacle from our previous worship space will return from storage & be placed in the middle where the current gold tabernacle is. The gold tabernacle will be moved then to the chapel.

Why the change? The current gold tabernacle is very beautiful, but proportionately it is too small for our large church. Various people, including visiting clergy, have made this observation. Plus, the current tabernacle door is only 5½ inches wide. The clergy have to tilt the ciborium (container for the hosts) in order to place it into the gold tabernacle. At times when tilting, the lid shifts. Though we have not had any spillage, I want to avoid any possible future mishap. Due to its small size, the gold tabernacle does not allow very many extra ciboria to be placed into it. The gold tabernacle will be much more suited for the chapel. I will use a smaller ciborium size in this gold tabernacle since we do not need to store much on reserve in the chapel. The original tabernacle will be beautiful, matching the candle stands & ambo as it was designed to do so. See p. 6 for a picture of the original tabernacle, just in case the change is not finished by this weekend.


To facilitate this change, the half wall of stone will remain. But the stone work outlining the gold tabernacle will be removed & returned to its original state of sheet rock when the church was built. Remember: when the church was built, the tabernacle was off to the side behind the area where the Mary & Joseph statues are.

Also, the back wall over the middle exit doors from the baptismal area to the narthex will be re-configured to house a beautiful mosaic of the Holy Spirit. This mosaic was designed, made & contributed by a parishioner. Her husband helped with its framing & hanging brackets. Its location is to signify the Holy Spirit "descending down" upon the waters of baptism & the person to be baptized, as well as our "taking" the Holy Spirit with us into the world when we leave church. See p. 6 for a picture of this mosaic.

The main narthex (both ceiling & walls) will be repainted, as well at the 2 shrines in the church & the ceiling of the transept entrances. Many necessary wall repairs & repaint-

ing to the chapel & its entrance will occur. It is unclear exactly how long all these projects will take. But I am hoping all will be completed by Easter.

All the above projects have the approval of the Finance & Pastoral Councils. Thank you to all who have contributed to the Maintenance & Repair Fund. If you have not contributed in the past, please consider doing so, especially with the additional security projects. More lighting will be installed outside The project to rekey & install a fob system has occurred in the church. The remaining buildings are also having a new fob system. Once that has occurred, a brand new, improved alarm system is being installed.

For those adult Catholics who lack Confirmation, our preparations sessions begin Monday, Feb. 19th: 6:30 pm. Even if you have Confirmation, you are welcome to attend to refresh your understanding of the Catholic faith.

After all the Masses this weekend in Kolbe Hall, Catholic Daughters are coordinating an exhibit of 64 Eucharistic miracles. Our exhibit is part of a world-wide exhibit on such miracles & the Eucharist. I encourage everyone to go over to learn more about such miracles. This exhibit is being offered also for young people in faith formation. Coffee & donuts will be in Kolbe Hall on this Sunday only.

Remember this First Tuesday, Feb. 6th we have confessions 6 pm-6:25 pm, 6:30 pm Mass & then a Holy Hour, Thysía from 7 pm-8 pm. Please come. See p. 8 for the schedule for Ash Wednesday, confessions during Lent, & Stations of the Cross. Also mark your calendar for our Parish Lenten Mission the weekend of Feb. 24th-25th, & Monday-Wednesday, Feb. 26th-28th. Sr. Lisa Valentini who gave the Mission Appeal a few months ago will be returning for this Lenten Mission. The repairs & re-painting of the chapel is scheduled to begin this Monday, Feb. 5th & is expected to take up to 2 weeks to complete. Thus, 24 hour Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament has been suspended, beginning Sunday, Feb. 4th. We will have limited Exposition Monday-Friday, 9 am-5 pm in the parish office area, in what use to be the chapel.

I will not be present this Saturday 5 pm Vigil Mass since I am committed to install a new pastor at Corpus Christi Church at their Vigil Mass. Fr. Michael Grey, C.S.Sp., will be here for confessions & our 5 pm Saturday Vigil Mass. I will be present for the 3 Sunday Masses.

Do This in Remembrance of Me, Part 31: The Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist
By Fr. Luke Spannagel: Step-by-Step through the Mass

As we conclude the Liturgy of the Word and prepare to transition to the Liturgy of the Eucharist, it is a fitting time to reflect on how these main parts of the Mass are united and complement each other. We previously touched on this unity in our reflection on the homily. This time, we will hear from a couple of our recent popes. As *The General Instruction of the Roman Missal* states, "The Mass consists in some

sense of two parts, namely the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, these being so closely interconnected that they form but one single act of worship. For in the Mass is spread the table both of God's Word and of the Body of Christ, and from it the faithful are to be instructed and refreshed" (*GIRM*, 28, also cf. *SC* 56, 48, 51). Perhaps the two main parts of the Mass seem obvious, but how are they "so closely interconnected"? How are the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist related? As two examples, they both strengthen us in understanding our faith and living it out in the world, and they both draw us deeper into true unity with Christ.

The Two Ways Our Lord Nourishes Us

Pope St. John Paul II reflected on how the unity of the Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist goes back to the early Church: "We are well aware that from the earliest times the celebration of the Eucharist has been linked not only with prayer but also with the reading of Sacred Scripture and with singing by the whole assembly. As a result, it has long been possible to apply to the Mass the compar-



ison, made by the Fathers, with the two tables, at which the Church prepares for her children the word of God and the Eucharist, that is, the bread of the Lord" (<u>Dominicae Cenae</u>, 10). This image of the two tables illustrates for us that we are fed in two main ways through the Mass: through the hearing of God's word to us and through the true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. As we have reflected before, through the Scriptures we come to know God as he reveals himself to us; we learn who we are as his people; and we learn how to live our lives in him and with one another. As we will see as we continue through the Mass, in the Eucharist we are nourished in a unique way through the true presence of Jesus and his dwelling with us through Holy Communion. Our Lord nourishes us in two wonderful ways!

Pope Benedict XVI, reflecting on these two tables of the Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist, emphasizes the unity between them: "First of all, there is a need to reflect on the inherent unity of the rite of Mass. Both in catechesis and in the actual manner of celebration, one must avoid giving the impression that the two parts of the rite are merely juxtaposed... There is an intrinsic bond between the word of God and the Eucharist. From listening to the word of God, faith is born or strengthened



(cf. Rom 10:17); in the Eucharist the Word made flesh gives himself to us as our spiritual food. Thus, 'from the two tables of the word of God and the Body of Christ, the Church receives and gives the faithful the bread of life.' Consequently it must constantly be kept in mind that the word of God, read and proclaimed by the Church in the liturgy, leads to the Eucharist as to its own connatural end" (Sacramentum Caritatis, 44).

Relationship and Unity

Pope Benedict's words remind me of the way we grow in relationships. Typically, we first encounter others at a bit of a distance. Maybe we see them in a group, or we cross paths in some way. Next, there is usually a time when we are learning basics, such as names, family backgrounds, schools, or jobs. If the relationship continues to grow, we learn more about what a person thinks, likes, and hopes



or dreams. Over time, a friendship grows and deepens, and with that depth comes greater love and intimacy. Of course, even with a depth of love, we know we still communicate with each other and continue to learn more. Our love helps us to understand each other more fully and our ongoing communication helps us deepen our love. This basic comparison helps me realize more concretely what I think the popes are teaching us: in the Mass, we encounter Jesus both through the Liturgy of the Word and through the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Both tables bless us with growing deeper in our relationship with him. Both lead us deeper in unity. Both invite us to share the fruits of that unity with one another. Both increase our hope for the perfect unity with Christ that awaits us in heaven. For now, a foretaste of the heavenly banquet is coming in the Liturgy of the Eucharist!


For Reflection:

- 1. How do you experience the Liturgy of the Word as nourishment? Pray with <u>Ezekiel 3:1-3</u>, in which the Lord instructs Ezekiel to eat a scroll. Meditate on the image of "tables" set for a feast as a way to awaken your "appetite" for worship as you prepare for Mass.
- 2. As Father Luke quoted, "the faithful are to be instructed and refreshed" (*GIRM*, 28) from the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Prepare your heart to receive instruction and refreshment by asking the Lord to give you these graces every time you participate in Mass. After Mass, take time to reflect on the instruction and refreshment you have received, and give thanks to God.

Feb. 8th is the annual day of prayer & awareness against human trafficking. Feb. 8th is the feast day of St. Josephine Bakhita, who was kidnapped as a child & sold into slavery in Sudan & Italy. Once Josephine was freed, she became a Canossian nun & dedicated her life to sharing her testament of deliverance from slavery & comforting the poor & suffering. She was declared a Saint in 2000.

Human Trafficking: Key Statistics

The International Labour Organization (ILO) & Walk Free Foundation's "Global Estimate of Modern Slavery" (2016) provides alarming statistics on the prevalence of human trafficking worldwide:

- 25% of all victims are children age 17 or younger, representing 10 million girls & boys worldwide.
- Nearly 30% of all victims are men & boys; jumping to 46% for victims of forced labor.
- Of the 24.9 million victims of forced labor & commercial sexual exploitation, nearly 1 of 4 were exploited outside their home country. For every 1,000 people across the world in 2016, 5.4 were victims of human trafficking

Pray for peace in the Middle East, Ukraine & in any other troubled areas, for an end to terrorism & all violence, including those assaulted by guns & other instruments of harm, and for the safety of all those who protect us.




