


## SCRIPTURE READINGS

### THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST

#### First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20

Melchizedek, a priest of God, prayed that Abram would be blessed by God. He also praised God for delivering Abram's foes into his hands.



#### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Paul describes Jesus' actions during the last supper. Jesus broke bread and said it was his body given for us, asking that we do the same in remembrance of him. He then passed the cup and called it his blood. Jesus then asked us to break bread in this manner to remember his death until he returns.

#### Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17

Jesus spoke to a large crowd when his disciples asked that he dismiss the people to give them a chance to find food and lodging. Jesus asked the disciples to give the crowd something to eat, but they had only five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus then blessed and distributed the food, which fed about 5,000 people. Twelve baskets were then collected from what was left over.

**DIOCESAN ASSESSMENTS:** One of the Bishop's Priorities (as written about in the Dialog) has been the *renewal of catechesis*. As a part of this effort, an overall assessment was created for all Religious Education programs throughout the diocese for grades 2 - 8. The assessments are instruments that help us determine what the students learned and how we need to shape and focus our catechesis in the year ahead. Sacred Heart students completed the assessments for the second year in April 2016. It is encouraging to note that our Overall Average Score has increased. I'd like to share the following data with you: (#'s in parenthesis represent last year's data.):

- Total # of PREP Students Registered for Grades 2 - 8: #67 (#68)
- Total # of Students taking the Assessment: #52 -15 not assessed (#52 - 16 not assessed)
- Overall Average Score = 83%(B) (78% ="C")


**Sunday, June 12 or Wednesday, June 15 (new)**

*Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible* helps you uncover the story woven throughout Scripture, so you can get the "big picture" of the Bible and understand what it's all about. The complexity of the Bible is simplified through an easy-to-follow narrative approach, and an ingenious color-coded Bible Timeline Chart. This Chart helps you to follow the story that ties all of Scripture together and makes it easy to understand the Bible.

The study includes eight half-hour videos presented by Jeff Cavins. Jeff will guide you through salvation history. He will explain how the Bible reveals God's loving plan for your life and provide you with helpful advice on how to put your faith into practice. These engaging videos also feature footage from the Holy Land, animated maps, useful charts and graphics, and beautiful art, which add to the overall experience of the study. Each video will be followed by a group discussion.

We will begin both a Sunday and a Wednesday session so you can choose the day/time that is best for you. Registration forms are at the doors of the church. Scholarships are available for those requesting one.
