## From the Padre's Desk:

#### **My Dear Friends:**

We begin the final week of Lent with these familiar readings. This year, we hear the Passion from the Gospel of Luke. These readings for Palm Sunday and the Passion used to be read on successive Sundays. Now they are combined into a single feast, so that we may see the whole sweep of the glory and the suffering played out. Jesus accepts the adulation of the crowd, the foreshadowing of his glory in the Resurrection. He bids farewell to his disciples in his last Passover and forgives his tormentors as he dies on the cross. Later this week, we enter the Holy Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, when the whole story of our redemption will play out once again.

#### RE-ENVISAGING THE SOCIAL ROLE OF PROPERTY

<u>SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION RETURNS TO THE DIOCESE OF RALEIGH</u>: Beginning Easter Sunday, April 17, 2022, Bishop Zarama has lifted the dispensation that has been in place for the Mass obligation for Sundays and Holy Days for the faithful in the Diocese of Raleigh.

For centuries, the Catholic Church has had in place an obligation for Catholics to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. Importantly, the Church specifies that the elderly, sick, those with pre-existing health conditions or other vulnerable people are always dispensed from this Mass obligation. In some instances, the bishop or pastor may "lift the dispensation" among the faithful. This may occur during severe weather, for instance. Most recently, this has been the case during the COVID pandemic.

As so many of the faithful gather for Easter Masses, Bishop Luis offers this reminder that the obligation to attend Mass is also an invitation to return to our churches and renew ourselves in receiving God's love through the Eucharist. "The doors of our churches are wide open," said Bishop Luis. "Now let us open our hearts, embracing each other in community and fully embracing the gift of God's love with an open and joyful heart." <u>SECOND COLLECTION:</u> The second collection for April 15, Good Friday is for the Holy Land.

<u>FAITH FORMATION</u>: No Faith Formation classes on Sunday, April 10, Palm Sunday and Sunday, April 17, Easter Sunday. Students will be back Sunday, April 24.

<u>CHRISM MASS</u>: Join us for the Annual Chrism Mass on Tuesday, April 12 at 10:30am at Holy Name of Jesus Cathedral in Raleigh. Bishop Luis Zarama will preside the Mass, consecrate the Sacred Chrism and bless the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of the Catechumens which will be used in the parishes of the Diocese throughout the year. Also at this Mass, the priests gathered will renew their priestly promises.

<u>HOLY THURSDAY</u>: Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ, when our Lord established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to his arrest and crucifixion. It also commemorates His institution of the priesthood. Christ washed the feet of his Disciples, who would become the first priests. The Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated Thursday, April 14 at 7pm in the Price Building. Mass will be bilingual.

GOOD FRIDAY: Good Friday is the day on which Christians commemorate the death of Jesus Christ on the Cross, the act that brought salvation to all who believe. The Celebration of the Lord's Passion will take place on Friday, April 14, at 7pm in the Price Building. The Celebration will be bilingual. Also, all our Parishioners are invited to the Living Stations of the Cross on Good Friday at 4pm.

HOLY SATURDAY: Holy Saturday is the final day of Lent, of Holy Week, and of the Easter Triduum, the three days (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday) immediately preceding Easter, during which Christians commemorate the Passion and Death of Jesus Christ and prepare for His Resurrection. The Mass of the Vigil will be celebrated Saturday, April 16 at 8:30pm in the Price Building. Mass will be bilingual. EASTER SUNDAY (SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD: Sunday, April 17. The Easter proclamation has been spread throughout the world with the joyful song of the Alleluia. Let's sing it with joy, but above all let's sing it with all our hearts and lives, with a life that is simple, humble, and fruitful in good works. Christ our hope has risen, to go before us. The Risen One will go before us and guide us along the paths of the world. He is our hope; He is the true peace of the world. Amen! (Pope Benedict) Happy Easter!
