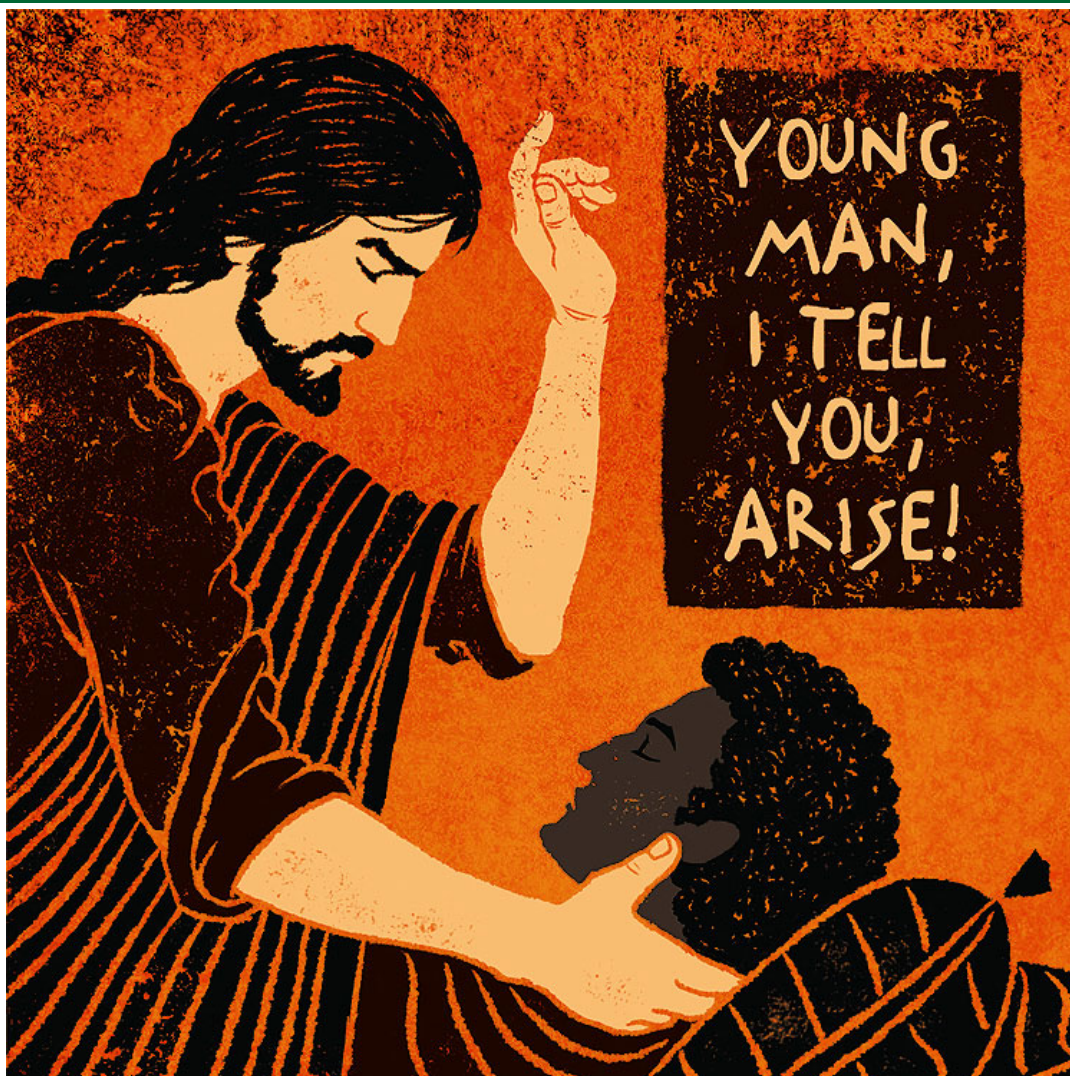

A Message from Our Principal

As we are approaching the end of the 2015-16 school year, we are busily preparing for 8th grade graduation on June 3rd. It is an exciting time as our 8th graders say final goodbyes to their teachers, classmates, and little buddies (kindergarteners). The class of 2016 is a delightful group of individuals, many of whom have been at St. Justin School since kindergarten, and a few who joined during the last few years. For twenty families, this is their last child at St. Justin, so we are saying good-bye to them as well.

Last week we celebrated the class of 2016 with an all-school rally where each class sang a song or shouted a cheer expressing their love for the class. The rally concluded with the kindergarten buddies telling why they love their 8th grade buddy. 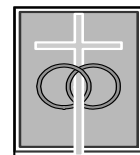

GENERAL INFORMATION

Faith Formation is more than just religious education. It is a life long journey towards a deeper relationship with Christ.

Ongoing Faith Formation Classes

These classes meet on Sundays, Pre-K3 through 1st Grade: 9-10 a.m.
2nd Grade through 8th Grade: 10:15-11:30 a.m.

CLOW (Children's Liturgy of the Word)

During the 9 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Sunday Masses, children are dismissed to the Parish Ministry Center Chapel for an age appropriate Liturgy of the Word. The children return to church during the Presentation of the Gifts.

Sacramental Preparation Program

You may register for this program if your child has already completed one full year of Ongoing Faith Formation or is enrolled in a Catholic school. This program is for *baptized* children in 2nd grade and higher.

High School Confirmation Program

This program begins in September and culminates with the Sacrament of Confirmation in May. The candidate sessions take place on Sundays, 5-6:30 p.m.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Are you an adult seeking baptism? Or were you baptized Catholic as a child but have not celebrated the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist? This program offers the opportunity to learn about, and nourish the Roman Catholic faith. It is a process marked by liturgical rites that are celebrated with the community. This process is centered on the Sunday readings and includes attending Mass. For those who are spiritually prepared, they will receive the Sacraments of Initiation, (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist) during the Easter Vigil.

HOPE AND LIFE

Today's readings tell the story of two widows. The first



reading relates the plight of the widow with whom the prophet Elijah stayed; the Gospel tells about the widow of Nain. In each story, the widow's only son had died. For people who lived in those cultures, the son was the only support of a widow, and the carrying on of the family name by the son was equal to immortality. A widow whose only son has died could lose all hope.

Elijah and Jesus are the restorers of hope; they bring the sons back to life. Saint Paul was metaphorically raised from the dead when he experienced the conversion and call from God that he describes in today's second reading.

What are Christians called to do today? We may not be able to raise the dead, but perhaps we can rekindle hope for a single parent. We may not be able to convert a persecutor like Paul, but if we speak the gospel openly and gently with our lives, we might touch a life with the Good News.

Jubilee Year of Mercy

June 5, 2016

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Half the liturgical year 2016 is completed after six months of *extraordinary* celebrations. The Incarnation mystery: Jesus' advent, nativity, epiphany. The Paschal mystery: Jesus' passion, death, resurrection, Pentecost's Holy Spirit. The solemnities of Holy Trinity and Jesus' Body and Blood. Today the Church resumes Sundays in Ordinary Time, but with a Gospel of *extraordinary* mercy: Jesus raises a dead man to life. Yet the one who benefits most from his *extraordinary* mercy is not the dead son but his widowed mother. With her husband and only son deceased, this woman's material support, in that patriarchal society, had vanished. So had her emotional support, leaving her helpless, abandoned, on society's "peripheries." One of Pope Francis' hopes in calling this *Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy* is to transform us into more *extraordinary* Christians, by making our caring outreach to just such vulnerable people, and our practical self-sacrificing love for them, our *ordinary*, daily, Christian way of life!

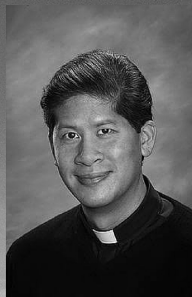
