

Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to your wedding to set a date and to begin your marriage preparation and required paper work.

Anyone who cannot attend Mass because of age or illness, and would like to receive the Eucharist at home, should call the parish office to arrange a visit. Likewise, if you are being admitted to the hospital, and would like a visit, please call. Due to confidentiality reasons, hospitals no longer call the parish to inform us when parishioners are admitted.

From the Pastor's Desk



The scripture readings today, tell us that if we as Christians want to be followers of Christ, then we are to be as open in our attitude to others as God has been in His care for us. We are challenged to love and pardon those who wrong us.

In the book of Samuel, we hear that the relationship between Saul and David was marked by tension, caused by Saul's mistrust of David. Saul saw David as a threat. Saul was jealous of David. Saul pursues David to destroy him, however, it is David who gains the upper hand and has the opportunity to kill Saul, but David was not consumed with the desire for revenge. David does

not harm Saul. Mercy and compassion win over power and greed.

Today's Gospel challenges us to do precisely the opposite of what our human nature naturally wants us to do. The principle of "eye for eye", "tooth for tooth." But the first words of Jesus cut to the heart of the matter: Love your enemies, bless those who curse you, Pray for those who mistreat you, Give to everyone who asks. Do good for your enemies, lend them money expecting nothing back. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. Stop judging, Stop condemning, Forgive and you will be forgiven. Do to others as you would have them do to you.

It is not easy to be a Christian and do all the things the Gospel tells to do, but we must share our lives with one another. This is what discipleship requires.

In our daily lives, we have so many opportunities to be compassionate, as our Father in heaven is compassionate, to all those we meet - in our homes with family, at work and wherever we may be.

Jesus' fundamental principle of "Forgive and you will be forgiven" is a contract we make within the Our Father when we pray, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

We shall receive what we have given to others. When we act with mercy and compassion, God will act similarly toward us. Going beyond what is required will inspire God to be equally generous.

We humans are simply unable to comprehend the lavish generosity of God. When we learn to offer compassion, love and forgiveness to others, we will learn to trust what God is offering to us.

To be a Christian then, is to accept that each person is chosen by God. Each is deserving of love. Each needs to be heard. No one is beyond the mercy of God, and if people need proof of that, then maybe it is to be found in the way we react to them. We need to be open enough to listen, to offer a word of hope, a word of peace, a word of forgiveness. If we wish to perfect our witness to gospel values, we could begin by showing mercy to ourselves and others, and to love and pardon those who wrong us.

The gospel today challenges all of us who hear it! I wish you an enjoyable weekend and a truly blest and faith-filled week.





Hi! My name is Natalie Sekulich and I am writing this on behalf of my son, Makary, who is 10 ½ years old and in 5th grade at Martin Elementary. This year I am including another Prince of Peace and District 41 family, the Carps, who have a son Brandon, who is an 8th grader at Palombi.

For the past several years, ALL the elementary schools in District 41, Prince of Peace and the surrounding communities have been collecting pop tabs for the Ronald McDonald House (RMH). Last year alone we collected 727 pounds...yes you read that right 727 POUNDS!! I am hoping we BLOW that number away next month and get even closer to 1,000 pounds! LET'S DO IT!! COLLECT THOSE TABS!!

This year I am writing a letter in conjunction with the Carps, because we have both have personally experienced all that Ronald McDonald House Charities has to offer families of children who are sick or have major surgery, like Makary did the summer of 2014 when he was just 5 years old, and again this past August 2018. Brandon was diagnosed with a very rare brain tumor in 2011 and had 2 surgeries to remove the tumor.

Makary has Cerebral Palsy in his legs. The first surgery is helping Makary walk better, use less energy to get around, and he is better able to just be a kid and do things just like everyone else, which he was not able to do prior to surgery. The second surgery was to lengthen tendons in both legs. It truly has been life changing for him and us! We stayed at the Ronald McDonald House near Lurie Hospital the summer of 2014 for 48 days/7 weeks while Makary had this life changing surgery in Chicago. We continue to stay at RMH when Makary has his appointments downtown, which is about once every 6 months now.

For Brandon, following the surgeries, he needed Proton radiation therapy out in Warrenville. While their goal was to commute everyday so that he could continue to go to school, there was an RMH near the Proton Center where they would stay when he wasn't feeling well enough to make the hour drive each way. The RMH also started a support group for children going through the radiation process!

The Carp family and I both agree that we can't imagine what our lives would have been like then, and now, without RMH! Staying at RMH gives us the opportunity to stay together as a family. When you have a child in the hospital, only one parent can stay in the room, and there are visiting hours for siblings. Without RMH, my family would have been apart for those 7 weeks, but because of RMH, we were able to stay there and support Makary throughout his entire journey, as a family.

RMH not only gave us all a very comfortable bed to sleep in every night, but we also had home cooked meals and activities provided by the many volunteers that selflessly gave their time at RMH. The Ronald McDonald House has changed all of our lives FOREVER, and we are so honored and feel so blessed to be able to come together with you as a community to continue to support RMH and all that they will offer families in the future.

Here is a very interesting fact...the Ronald McDonald House Charities only gets 20% from McDonald's...while 20% may be a lot...they still have to raise the other 80% by fundraisers, donations and pop tabs! PLEASE start collecting now and continue to do, so that we can help other families stay together!

Collect them all...pop tabs, soup can tabs, pet food can tabs...anything with a tab. <u>BUT</u> just make sure it is aluminum, not metal, by using a magnet if you aren't sure. A metal tab will stick to the magnet and an aluminum one will not. You ONLY want the aluminum ones! NOW GET GOING AND COLLECT THOSE TABS!!






