The class is usually offered the last Monday evening of each month. Baptisms are scheduled on Sundays at 1:00 p.m.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to your wedding to set a date and to begin your marriage preparation and required paper work.

Home or Hospital Visitation

Anyone who cannot attend Mass because of age or illness, and would like to receive the Eucharist at home, should call the parish office to arrange a visit. Likewise, if you are being admitted to the hospital, and would like a visit, please call. Due to confidentiality reasons, hospitals no longer call the parish to inform us when parishioners are admitted.

From the Desk of Deacon Jim Minor



As children we often learn by being exposed to different opportunities. This is also true of our faith and spiritual life. I remember going to church from an early age, sitting in the same pew for the 12:00 noon Mass at St. Thecla Parish on the Northwest Side of Chicago. Interestingly enough though, if I looked down the pew at members of my family, they each prayed in different ways. My dad, a convert from the Southern Baptist faith, listened intently at the homily. My mom, always talked about how good or not so good the music was, my grandmother simply spent her time praying for others, and my great-grandmother, who was an immigrant from Poland and did not speak English, spent her time at Mass up to communion, praying the rosary. I remember being impressed by and loving the prayers of the

Mass, especially the Our Father; and when I was old enough to understand the Eucharistic Prayers, they added a richness to my prayer at Mass. That was just one part of my prayer life and didn't take into account the prayers we said at home as a family.

Each one of us have our own prayer style that suits us and where we feel the most comfortable. We also learned to pray in a way that is unique to us. Perhaps we learned in school or religious education, or from our grandparents or parents, or even by simply coming to Mass and repeating the same prayers over and over. But, as with anything done in a repetitive way, there are times when prayer might become a little dry. It is in those times that we might need to change things up a little and try something different. The Church, over the centuries, has developed countless ways and forms of prayer. We should each be spending time every day in prayer, even if for only fifteen or twenty minutes. Taking the time to nurture a relationship with God allows us to turn to Him when our lives become challenging. It also allows us, when we receive graces and blessings, to turn to Him in thanksgiving for those good things. When we have a strong prayer life, there are times when we can simply sit and try and listen to Him talking with us.

As we begin the Lenten season this coming week, we know that one of the spiritual disciplines of Lent is prayer. We would like to provide our parishioners, and any guests or friends you might want to invite, the opportunity to experience different forms of prayer, other than Mass and reading from Scripture. Now of course, we will not be able to cover all types of prayer that we have available to us, but we would like to provide a sampling for you.

Each Tuesday of Lent, from 7:00 pm - 8:00 pm in the church, will be devoted to a presentation of a different prayer form. Everyone will then be allowed to experience that particular prayer form. We invite everyone to join us for this time together.

The schedule will be as follows:

March 5th- join us for the third evening of our parish mission (also March 3rd and 4th as well)

March 12th- Contemplative and Meditative Prayer (Presenter: Linda Shea)

March 19th- Prayer using storytelling, parables, and praying as a family with children (Presenter: Deacon Jim)

March 26th- The Liturgy of the Hours, Adoration and Benediction (Presenter: Deacon James)

April 2nd- Prayer in a troubled world (Presenter: Very Rev. Jeffrey S. Grob, JCD, Judicial Vicar & Archdiocesan Exorcist)

April 9th- Parish Reconciliation Service

April 16th- Prayer using sacramentals, such as prayer books, the rosary, and novenas (Presenter: Beth Best)




Source and Summit Saturdays

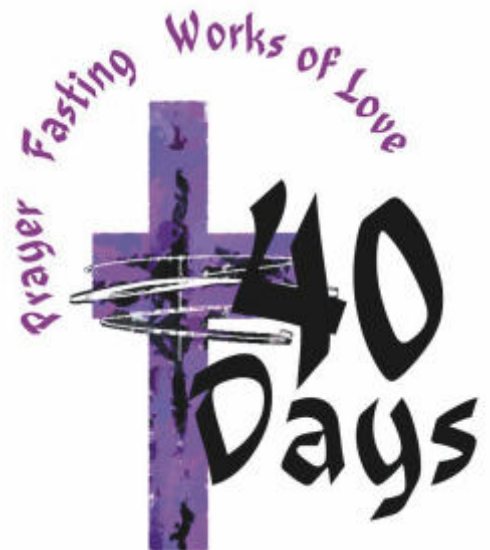


Lenten Disciplines of Fasting & Abstinence

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

Father Tom is an experienced teacher, administrator, retreat director and parish mission preacher. He is a native of the South Side of Chicago. He grew up in St. Adrian Parish in Marquette Park. He graduated from Villanova University with a B.A. in Communication Arts. He also has a Master of Arts in Educational Administration from Lewis University.

Fr. Tom entered the Midwest Province of the Augustinian Order, made his solemn vows as an Augustinian Friar and in 1994 he was ordained to the priesthood. Fr. Tom is currently the Director of the Augustinian Marylake Shrine of Our Lady of Grace in King City, Ontario, Canada and is the Prior of the Marylake Augustinian Monastery. Fr. Tom was named a Papal Missionary of Mercy by Pope Francis in 2018.

Hi! My name is Natalie Sekulich and I am writing this on behalf of my son, Makary, who is 10 ½ years old and in 5th grade at Martin Elementary. This year I am including another Prince of Peace and District 41 family, the Carps, who have a son Brandon, who is an 8th grader at Palombi.

For the past several years, ALL the elementary schools in District 41, Prince of Peace and the surrounding communities have been collecting pop tabs for the Ronald McDonald House (RMH). Last year alone we collected 727 pounds...yes you read that right 727 POUNDS!! I am hoping we BLOW that number away next month and get even closer to 1,000 pounds! LET'S DO IT!! COLLECT THOSE TABS!!

This year I am writing a letter in conjunction with the Carps, because we have both have personally experienced all that Ronald McDonald House Charities has to offer families of children who are sick or have major surgery, like Makary did the summer of 2014 when he was just 5 years old, and again this past August 2018. Brandon was diagnosed with a very rare brain tumor in 2011 and had 2 surgeries to remove the tumor.

Makary has Cerebral Palsy in his legs. The first surgery is helping Makary walk better, use less energy to get around, and he is better able to just be a kid and do things just like everyone else, which he was not able to do prior to surgery. The second surgery was to lengthen tendons in both legs. It truly has been life changing for him and us! We stayed at the Ronald McDonald House near Lurie Hospital the summer of 2014 for 48 days/7 weeks while Makary had this life changing surgery in Chicago. We continue to stay at RMH when Makary has his appointments downtown, which is about once every 6 months now.

For Brandon, following the surgeries, he needed Proton radiation therapy out in Warrenville. While their goal was to commute everyday so that he could continue to go to school, there was an RMH near the Proton Center where they would stay when he wasn't feeling well enough to make the hour drive each way. The RMH also started a support group for children going through the radiation process!

The Carp family and I both agree that we can't imagine what our lives would have been like then, and now, without RMH! Staying at RMH gives us the opportunity to stay together as a family. When you have a child in the hospital, only one parent can stay in the room, and there are visiting hours for siblings. Without RMH, my family would have been apart for those 7 weeks, but because of RMH, we were able to stay there and support Makary throughout his entire journey, as a family.

RMH not only gave us all a very comfortable bed to sleep in every night, but we also had home cooked meals and activities provided by the many volunteers that selflessly gave their time at RMH. The Ronald McDonald House has changed all of our lives FOREVER, and we are so honored and feel so blessed to be able to come together with you as a community to continue to support RMH and all that they will offer families in the future.

Here is a very interesting fact...the Ronald McDonald House Charities only gets 20% from McDonald's...while 20% may be a lot...they still have to raise the other 80% by fundraisers, donations and pop tabs! PLEASE start collecting now and continue to do, so that we can help other families stay together!

Collect them all...pop tabs, soup can tabs, pet food can tabs...anything with a tab. BUT just make sure it is aluminum, not metal, by using a magnet if you aren't sure. A metal tab will stick to the magnet and an aluminum one will not. You **ONLY want the aluminum ones! **NOW GET GOING AND COLLECT THOSE TABS!!****
