

Sacrament of Baptism

Our Baptismal Ministry is pleased to help your family prepare for the special event of your child's entrance into our faith community. Please contact the parish office at least two months prior to your preferred Baptism date to schedule a preparation class. We encourage attendance at this class well before the baby's birth. The class is usually offered the last Monday evening of each month. Baptisms are scheduled on Sundays at 1:00 p.m.

Saturday from 4:00 p.m. - 4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

Sacraments of Initiation

Adults interested in receiving the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation) may call the Director of our RCIA program, Deacon Tim Leonard.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to your wedding to set a date and to begin your marriage preparation and required paper work.

Home or Hospital Visitation

Anyone who cannot attend Mass because of age or illness, and would like to receive the Eucharist at home, should call the parish office to arrange a visit. Likewise, if you are being admitted to the hospital, and would like a visit, please call. Due to confidentiality reasons, hospitals no longer call the parish to inform us when parishioners are admitted.

From the Pastor's Desk

At the beginning of Lent, the church places us before an open doorway and invites us to embark on a journey of spiritual growth. Like Jesus in the wilderness, we are being led by the Spirit into a forty-day period of prayer and fasting, to help us reflect on the direction our lives are taking. It's an honest and frank attempt by the church to make us come to terms with the harsh reality of the hard work for salvation.

Every important decision we make in our lives takes place in the desert with Jesus; every milestone, every first experience, begins in the wilderness with Christ. This First Sunday of Lent calls us into the desert of our hearts, the wilderness within us where the Spirit dwells. We should not fear the desert, but approach the deserts of our lives with hope and openness: The desert of our hearts is the silent place where God speaks to us of hope and encouragement; it is in the quiet where we clear our heads to realize what is right and good; it is the all-embracing view that opens our eyes to realize the path we should take if we are to become the people of justice and righteousness we seek to become.

When I did my sabbatical with the Redemptorist in Tucson, AZ, on the wall of their church were the words of Hosea, "The Desert will lead you to your heart where I will speak." This Lent is an opportunity to start in that direction.

Here is my favorite Lenten story: A man steps onto the scale. "Darn," he says to his wife. "I started this diet yesterday, but the scale says I'm heavier. Here, hold my robe... It still says I'm heavier! Here, hold my pajamas... Geez, I'm still heavier!" Finally, in desperation, the man says, "Here, honey, hold these donuts."

Lent is the time to put down the donuts that distract us from becoming the people of God we are called to be, that weigh us down with cynicism and fear, that dull our tastes and senses to the compassion of God in our midst. These days before Easter are a time for deciding what we want our lives to be, what values we want to center our lives upon and are truly important to us.

The same Spirit that led Jesus into the desert accompanies us in our desert experiences of fear, despair, confusion and grief. The Spirit calls our souls into the desert in order to discern what God calls us to make of the time we have been given. It's time to put down the donuts, to transform our lives in the life and love of God and re-center our lives with new hope and renewed vision as we continue our journey to the Easter promise.

I wish you an enjoyable weekend and a truly blest and faith-filled week.

Lenten Prayer Experience...

Contemplative and Meditative Prayer: presented by Linda Shea

'Tis a blessing to listen; 'tis a blessing to be present. How many times have you heard the terms contemplative prayer and meditative prayer and wondered exactly what that is? And then you may have wondered, is it something that I could do in my own prayer life? This presentation will help you answer these two questions. The talk will offer insights into centering prayer and its connection to contemplation. If you desire a deeper relationship and friendship with Jesus, then it may be time to say "yes" to God's invitation. In this case, a significant relationship with Jesus can bring about a real change in your life. Centering prayer is one path that can help lead to this stronger relationship. If you desire peace in your life, as well as with those whom you live, then take an hour out of your week to hear about contemplative prayer. You may come away with tools that will lead to a deeper sense of compassion for yourself and for others.

This presentation will help you to understand the busyness of your life. It will also help to show you the self that you present to the world and the deeper self that God created in us. You will learn the two kinds of silence that exist and what centering prayer looks like. Lastly, there will be time to experience centering prayer and to ask any questions that you may have at the end of the hour.

Lenten Almsgiving

One of the spiritual disciplines of Lent is Almsgiving. One of my favorite parables in Luke's Gospel is the story of the Good Samaritan. At the end of the parable, after the Samaritan has helped the man who was victimized by robbers, the Samaritan gives the innkeeper two denari and tells him he will repay him more if needed on his return, thus assuring that the man is well cared for during his recovery.

Almsgiving is giving from our surplus, so that others who are in need are helped. This Lenten season, instead of a specific Lenten project, we are asking that each parishioner/parish family decide for themselves where to give your alms. Over the years the parish has had many Lenten almsgiving projects. This year we are asking that you pick a project that is near and dear to your family's heart.

Here are a few ideas:

- Local food pantries, including the township food pantry and our sharing parish food pantry, are always in need of help.
- Hygiene kits can be assembled for the homeless and dropped off at the PADS shelter at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Lindenhurst.
- Families, including children, can clean out their closets of clothing that does not fit and donate it to St. Vincent DePaul.
- A Safe Place in Zion, which assists victims of domestic violence.
- Zacchaeus Ministries (sponsored by deacons of the Archdiocese) located on the South Side of Chicago, which supports men in transition, post-incarceration.


Lent High School and Young Adult Discipleship Series



Lent and Life


"By our gracious gift each year, your faithful await the sacred paschal feasts the of minds with iov


pure" (Preface of Lent 1). The purpose of Lent is succinctly expressed by this preface. Catechumens prepare for baptism into the paschal mystery. The faithful are reminded of their baptism, and will renew their baptismal vows at the Easter liturgy. Baptism initiates us into the eternal life Christ gives us. The baptized are sons and daughters of God and are members of the Church, the People of Life.

The choices of the baptized are therefore to be shaped by their new identity (see Rom 6:6; Eph. 4:17-24). Christ calls the Samaritan woman to repent as she accepts the waters of new life (see John 4:15-24). Lenten repentance is necessary so that God's people may more deeply become who they are. They are called to see their sins more clearly. Hence baptism is known as "illumination."

Anyone who makes the Lenten journey is called to be more alert to the attacks on human life and dignity around them. The people of life are called to reject sin and all the devil's works and empty promises (Renewal of Baptismal Promises, Easter Liturgy). The "pro-choice" and "right to die" mentalities are two of those "empty promises" which are firmly rejected by the baptized. A firm rejection of these positions is integral to repentance. Lent is the perfect time for us to call our congregations to a clearer understanding of why this is true, and to lead them to a deeper affirmation of life, both natural and eternal, in the celebration of the Paschal Mystery.






