

Sacrament of Baptism (Temporarily Suspended)

We are pleased to help your family prepare for the special event of your child's entrance into our faith community. Please contact the parish office at least two months prior to your preferred Baptism date to schedule a preparation class. We encourage attendance at this class well before the baby's birth. The class is usually offered the last Monday evening of each month. Baptisms are scheduled Sundays at 1:00 p.m.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Temporarily Suspended)

Saturday from 4:00pm—4:30pm or by appointment.

Sacraments of Initiation

Adults interested in receiving the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation) may call the Director of our RCIA program, Deacon Tim Leonard.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to your wedding to set a date and to begin your marriage preparation and required paper work.

Home or Hospital Visitation (Temporarily Suspended)

Anyone who cannot attend Mass because of age or illness, and would like to receive the Eucharist at home, should call the parish office to arrange a visit. Likewise, if you are being admitted to the hospital, and would like a visit, please call. Due to confidentiality reasons, hospitals no longer call the parish to inform us when parishioners are admitted.

From the Pastor's Desk



Today is known as Good Shepherd Sunday, and it is a Day of Prayer for Vocations; and by vocations we mean vocations to the Priesthood, Diaconate and the Religious Life. There are certainly many other vocations such as married life, or vocations to various professions such as nursing or teaching, but today we are thinking about vocations for service specifically within the Church.

First of all, what is a vocation? The word "vocation" comes from the Latin word meaning "to call." It is a call from God to serve Him more perfectly.

It is important to remember, that a vocation does not always come in the way it came to the Apostles, where Our Lord verbally called them as they were out fishing or mending their nets. Usually a religious vocation is not an extraordinary manifestation, although it was, perhaps, for some saints. We must not be misled into thinking there will be a voice in the night, an apparition, or some other unique mystical experience in which God will manifest His call. Usually that is not the case.

Let us thank God for calling women and men to vowed life in service to the church and the world. Let's recognize and pray for all those men and women who, like Saint Paul, have listened for and responded to that call with the gift of their lives.

I would add, as we reflect on the Good Shepherd, that today is also a day for every Catholic to recognize the importance of encouraging others, particularly young people, to consider religious life as a priest, sister, nun, deacon or brother. Research shows that the top vocation influencers are parents and grandparents. A key factor in those who have entered religious life is having received an invitation to seriously consider a call to religious life from a pastor, mentor, family member, or friend.

And yet, too few talk about religious life, let alone encourage young people to consider the option seriously. In fact, many young people who do voice interest in pursuing that life path are met with derisive comments that call into question their character or readiness to face life — when in fact they are conscientiously asking one of the hardest questions anyone can face.

Perhaps the biggest deterrent is that we live in a culture that avoids deep discernment in general. Each of us has a vocation. We are all called to listen deeply within to discover the dream God has for us, the dream God planted in our hearts.

We need to continue to create a "culture of vocation," which means encouraging widespread practice of listening, imagining, and discerning what God is calling each of us to today, this year, this lifetime. Here are the five steps suggested every Catholic can take.

- 1. Pray (for your own conversion and to grow in holiness)
- 2. Evangelize (Share your faith in word and, especially, deed.)
- 3. Experience (Invite young people to worship, community, service, and witness.)
- 4. Mentor (accompany and share wisdom and knowledge with young people in the process of discernment)
- 5. Invite (Be direct! Say, "Have you ever thought of religious life? From what I see of you, I believe you would make a fine priest, sister, brother.")

Ultimately, discovering one's calling, God's dream for us, is all about relationships. It requires a close, authentic, and healthy relationship with the Lord, with ourselves, and with others who have chosen the path of religious life. It involves listening to others who take seriously their own discernment process, and serving people in need who will always present to us the face of Christ.

Or maybe you know someone who has all the necessary qualities and whom you imagine would make a good priest, deacon or religious. If so, you should tell them. Don't be shy about it because this might be just the encouragement they need to take that important step, that leap of faith, in order to test their vocation.

And you should, of course, pray for them. Indeed we all should pray for more vocations in the Church, and we should especially pray for those who are trying to discern their vocation.

As we live during this unusual time in our history, as you have been without access to the Sacraments for over a month, it scares me that this could be what our life would become without future vocations to the priesthood.

I wish you an enjoyable weekend and a truly blest and faith-filled Easter Season. Alleluia Alleluia.

Heavenly Father, Your divine Son taught us to pray to the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into His vineyard. We earnestly beg You to bless our Archdiocese and our world with many priests and religious men and women who will love You fervently, and gladly and courageously spend their lives in service to Your Son's Church under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

We pray that their lives may be always centered on our Eucharistic Lord;
that they be always faithful to the Holy Father;
and that they may be devoted sons and daughters of Mary, our Mother,
in making You known and loved; and that all may attain Heaven.

Bless our families and our children and choose from our homes those whom You desire
for this holy work. We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.



During this time, many of us have been asked to assume roles that maybe are not familiar to us. For example, for the first part of this time, Nancy and I have had my daughter and my four grandchildren living with us. In addition to my son who already lives with us, this has certainly changed the dynamic of our household. I feel very comfortable in the role of grandfather, as I spend much time every summer with the grandchildren anyway. It has been somewhat challenging though, to find things to do with parks closed and other activities we would normally do on hold. The normal routine of parish life and other roles that I play has now been taken away as well. So, when a situation arises in our household during this time, where one of us might be feeling stressed or might need a change of pace, I have come to realize that relying on my gift of listening has been valuable.


Perhaps some of you have had to assume roles you are not familiar with. Parents are now, in addition to children's teachers, being asked to homeschool. Adult children are separated from aging parents, and there is a worry there as well. Caregiving from a distance, making sure relatives are OK and safe and healthy are all challenges we are facing. Some of us even are now working from home and trying to develop that new reality. These are all changes many of us have been going through. Perhaps God is asking us all to sharpen our listening skills. Perhaps He is asking us to be present to our family, including our children, and avoid the temptation to multi-task.

But listening, whether through a video call, a traditional phone call, an email or face-to-face, always needs to occur with love. This is a gift we as followers of Christ can offer the people in our lives. Listening and being truly present to someone is a powerful and enduring gift. By doing this, no matter what turn this crisis takes, we can bring the sacred, the presence of God into the situation. All of us would admit that many aspects of this crisis are overwhelming and uncontrollable but listening with compassion allows us to bring the calm of Jesus' message into the situation.

In the Gospel from this past Sunday, with the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, Jesus did not immediately identify Himself to them. He allowed them to tell Him how they were feeling and then He offered His words of comfort. Perhaps that is how we can listen in love this coming week as we all experience this time of crisis. So be present to one another, listen in love, and reflect on the love of Jesus for each of us.

Allow us at this time of trial to then serve as instruments of that love to all we meet.



How do I handle my Sunday Contributions during this Time ...

For the past several weeks, since we have been unable to attend Mass, the Sunday contributions received have been significantly lower than what we normally experience. As our lives and finances are impacted during this time, please remember the church's expenses continue. We are present to meet the needs of our parish community as we are able.

There is a "Donate Now" button on our parish website that you can use for your Sunday and Easter donations. You can also sign up for continued Electronic Giving for your Sunday Stewardship contributions, either by direct debit from your bank account or credit card, on a monthly or weekly basis. A form is available on our parish website or can be mailed to you at your request. After signing up, never worry about forgetting your envelope again! It continues your support to Prince of Peace when you are out of town, on vacation or unable to attend Mass.

When we return to Mass, there are cards available on the credenza in the gathering space that say, "I Support the Parish through Electronic Giving." The card can be placed it in the collection basket instead of your envelope.

Parishioners who donate electronically to the Sunday collection receive a quarterly envelope packet, which contains envelopes for any special collections (i.e. Sharing Parish, St. Vincent de Paul & Archdiocesan collections) rather than the full monthly packet you receive now. Providing you with this new quarterly packet results in a savings to the parish.

If you prefer to write a check and use your envelopes, please mail your Sunday donations to the parish. Thank you for your continued support of Prince of Peace!!



May 3, 2020 • Psalm 23:1-6






