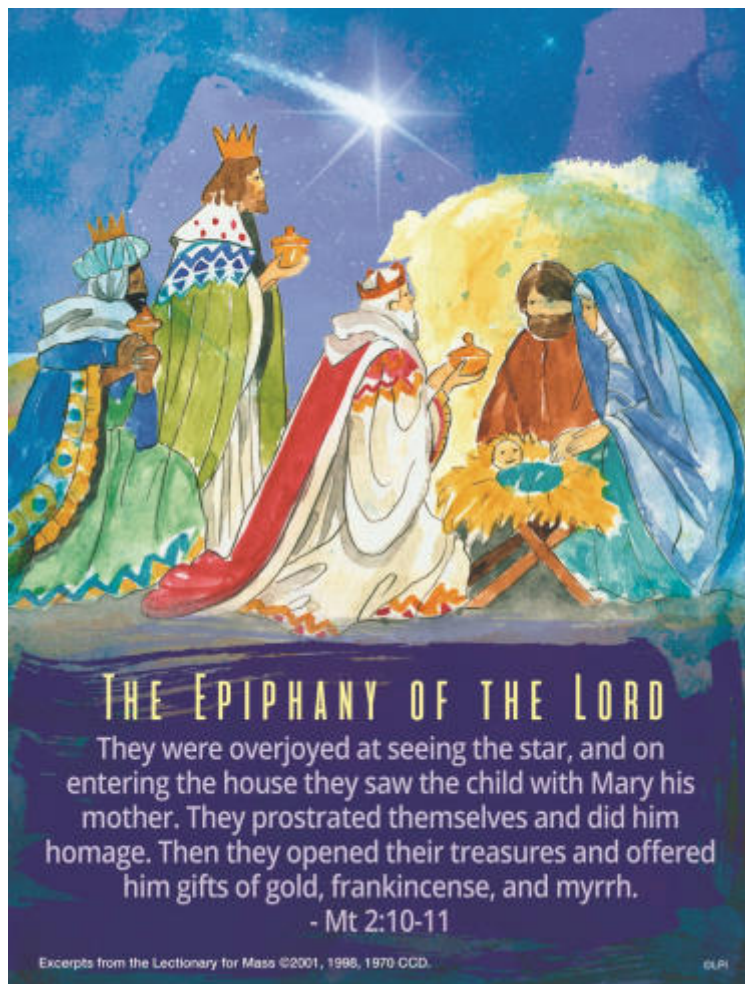

From the Pastor's Desk



Today we celebrate Epiphany. Epiphany means to reveal, to show, or to make known. The enduring insight from the earliest days of Israel to our own modern Christianity is that God is not remote from us; God is actively involved... God cares... God is concerned. So where's God? God is present in the epiphanies of our life each day!

Perhaps we think of these epiphanies only in one way – the good and nice events of our day. I stand on a beach and watch a perfect sunset and say to myself "yes, there is a God." I receive a gift of forgiveness from a friend and say to myself "yes, there is a God."

As believers we know that God comes to us, the essence of God is revealed in the mystery of the crib and the cross. The depth of God's Being is made visible in the vulnerability of a child and in the perfect weakness of a man on a cross. God is present in both the good times as well as the bad.

We find God in the sacrament of everyday life. We encounter God in trials, sufferings, joys, triumphs, hopes, fears, defeats and successes that come to us each day.

...when our best efforts at work go unappreciated, God is present.

...when we make an A in a difficult class at school, God is present.

...when our child is born, God is present.

...when our parent dies, God is present.

The epiphanies of life are not just about us. God is present in the way we serve our neighbor. God is the beggar outside our gate, the victim left on the side of the road and the voice of those who have no one to plead for their needs. We are not just called to be sensitive to God's presence within our own lives but we are also called to extend God's presence through our care for others. Each of us is called to be a living epiphany and a sacrament of God's love to the world around us.

...when we reach into our pocket and give to the poor, God is present.

...when we hug our child, God is present.

...when we work to correct an injustice, God is present.

...when we pray with a friend in the hospital, God is present.

God is with us. Sometimes all we have to do is take the time to open our eyes and see, open our ears and hear, open our hearts and feel the presence. May we all see and hear and feel the epiphanies of God in our lives this day and in each day to come.

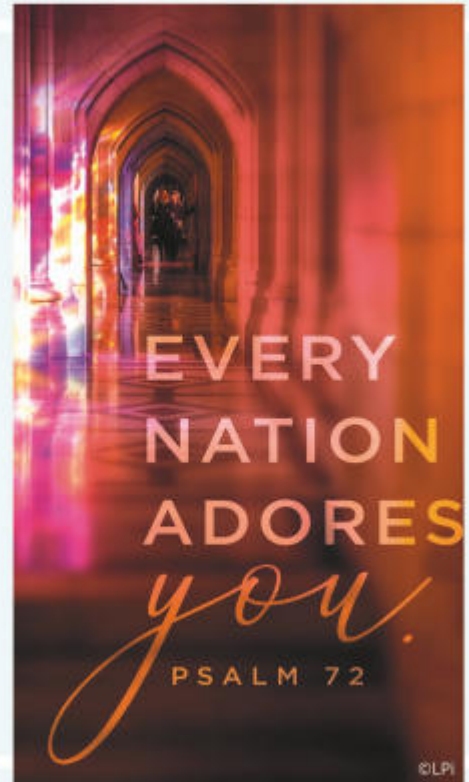

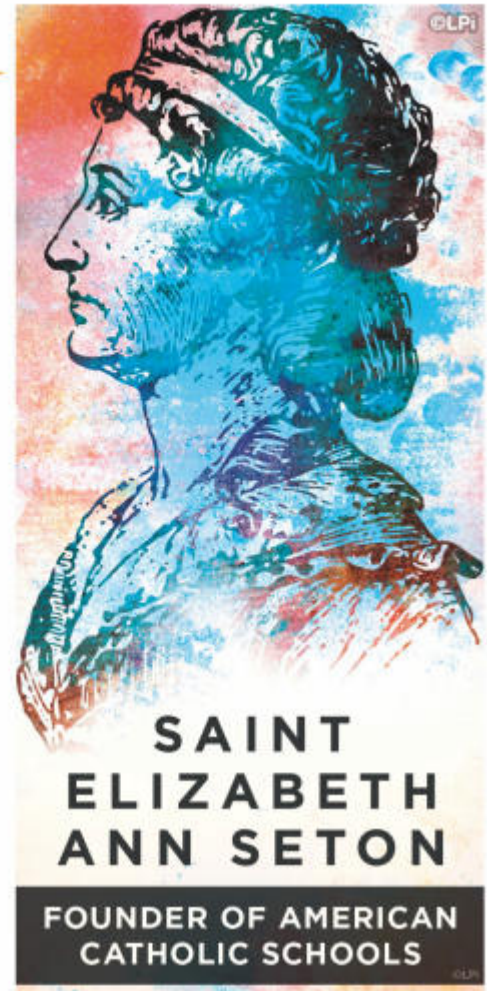

Have You Considered eGiving for Your Sunday Contributions? It's a New Year - Simplify Something in Your Life

There is a "Donate" button on our parish website that you can use for your Sunday donations. This option takes you to the Give Central website, where you can sign up for a regular schedule of contributing that YOU set up. The schedule is completely up to you, and there are several frequency options including weekly, bi-weekly, monthly and quarterly.



You can also sign up for continued Electronic Giving for your Sunday Stewardship contributions through the parish, either by direct debit from your bank account or credit card, on a monthly or weekly basis. A form is available on the next page or on our parish website.

After signing up for electronic giving, never worry about forgetting your envelope again! It continues your support to Prince of Peace when you are out of town, on vacation or unable to attend Mass.

Parishioners who donate electronically to the Sunday collection receive a quarterly envelope packet, which contains envelopes for any special collections (i.e. St. Vincent de Paul, Holy Day & Archdiocesan collections) rather than the full monthly packet you receive now. Providing you with this new quarterly packet results in a savings to the parish.

If you prefer to write a check, or use cash, and use your envelopes, please deposit them in the collection box when you enter the church or mail your Sunday donations to the parish. Thank you for your continued support of Prince of Peace!!

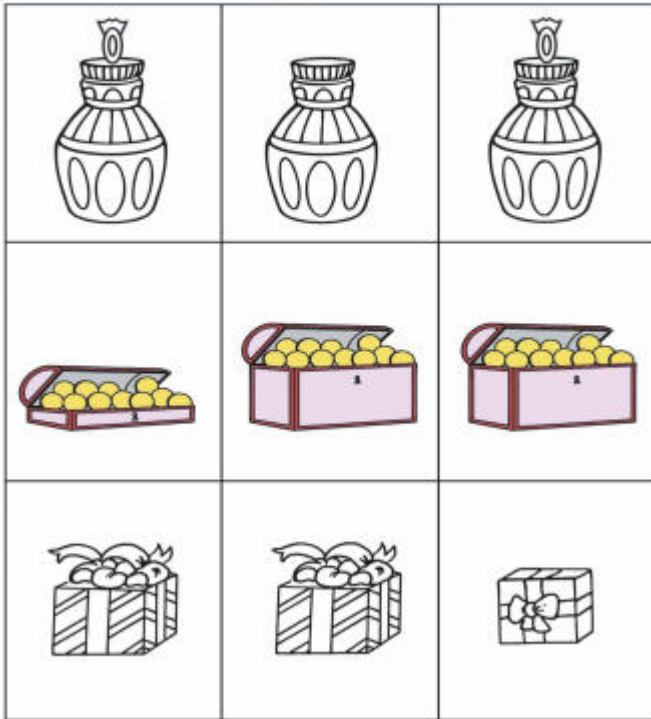


Life: An "Epiphany" of God

"Life is always a good. ... Why is life a good? This question is found everywhere in the Bible, and from the very first pages it receives a powerful and amazing answer. The life which God gives man is quite different from the life of all other living creatures, inasmuch as man, although formed from the dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7, 3:19; Job 34:15; Ps 103:14; 104:29), is a manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory (cf. Gen 1:26-27; Ps 8:6). This is what Saint Irenaeus of Lyons wanted to emphasize in his celebrated definition: 'Man, living man, is the glory of God'. Man has been given a sublime dignity, based on the intimate bond which unites him to his Creator: in man there shines forth a reflection of God himself" (The Gospel of Life, n. 34).

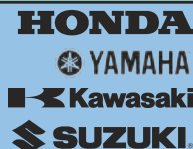
