

From the Desk of Deacon-candidate George Schmelter



Today we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. This feast is the birth of the Church. Our Lord told the disciples before He rose to the father, that He would send an advocate "that will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." The New American Bible translated the word *advocate* which comes from the Greek word *parakletos* which is represented in English as Paraclete. A Paraclete was someone who could provide help and assistance to a person in a trial setting in a Greco-Roman courtroom.

In the Gospel, the Holy Spirit serves as a Paraclete for the disciples. He appeared to the disciples in the Upper Room as tongues of fire which filled them with the knowledge to understand all that Christ had told them. The disciples then were able to speak in different languages, to heal the sick and to raise the dead. The Paraclete comes to their aid and comforts them in the years to come as they set about the world to preach the Good News. The Paraclete helped the disciples to find the words to use when preaching the Gospel to the sometimes hostile, and unbelieving crowds. When they were tortured and imprisoned, the Paraclete was with them to give them the strength to endure. The Paraclete as the Holy Spirit guided them in starting our Holy Mother Church and still guides the Church today.

We oftentimes forget about the Holy Spirit when we pray. He gets lost between the Father and the Son. That is a shame because without Him, we would have no Church. We would not be able to really understand scripture. Our prayer life would be stale. The beautiful thing about the Paraclete is that each of us through baptism and confirmation have received the same gift of the Holy Spirit as the apostles did. Ask any of our priests and deacons and they will tell you that the Holy Spirit is essential help when preaching. I prayed for His assistance when writing this reflection! When I have had to speak in church, the Holy Spirit has given me the words to say and help to calm my natural fear of public speaking. When we invoke the Holy Spirit, scripture comes alive for us. The Mass takes on deeper meaning, and we draw closer to Christ. The closer we are to the Holy Spirit, the closer we are to Jesus and then to the Father. Let us take the opportunity this Pentecost to place more focus on the Holy Spirit. Jesus sent Him to make sure that we were never alone, and we never will be.

What is the Elijah Cup?

The purpose of the Elijah Cup, a chalice, used during the Consecration of the Mass, is to provide a focal point for prayer. We are all aware of the need for vocations to the priesthood, the permanent diaconate and to the religious life. But sometimes we forget just how powerful praying for an increase in vocations can be. If we pray with the faith of the widow of Zarapeth, our cup will never run dry! We will always have priests to bring us Jesus in the Eucharist.



Background

In 1 Kings 17, during a drought, Elijah tells the poor widow of Zarapeth that if she makes him a small loaf of bread with the last of her flour and oil, her "jar of flour will not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the Lord sends rain upon the earth." In faith, the widow baked the bread and fed Elijah. For the next year, the widow, her son, and Elijah ate bread made from the bowl of flour and jug of oil.

How does it work?

Each month, a family, a couple, or individual, has the opportunity to bring a chalice that has held the Consecrated Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ into their homes. The Elijah Cup serves as a focal point encouraging family prayer for religious vocations, for seminarians and for our serving religious. It is a powerful presence and inspires prayer from adults and children alike.

A Focal Point of Prayer for Vocations

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support God's call to religious life. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured through prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women He is calling in a very special way. We hope that those who bring the cup home will continue to pray for vocations daily.

Interested families or individuals should contact Fr Gerald Walsh, or the Parish office to schedule a month to take the Elijah Cup home. At the end of Mass, (the second weekend of the month, usually the 9:30 am Family Mass) the Elijah Cup will be presented to the family or individual by a Deacon or Priest. The family will then take the cup home, putting it in a place of honor. Each day for a month, during prayer time (morning, bedtime or at meals), the family will pray for an increase and perseverance of vocations. The Elijah Cup should be brought back the second weekend of the month so it can be presented to a new family.

It is with mixed emotions that we announce that after 15 years Gina Stanley will be leaving the parish staff. Gina has been a true blessing to the parish lending her talents to both the parish and religious education offices. She will be taking some time for family and to watch her grandchildren grow. Rest assured she is not leaving us though. She will remain active in the many ministries she is involved in and promised to come into the office weekly to take care of our plants. Gina has the only green thumb among us!


"Face the Truth" Tour



A Prayer for Vocations:


