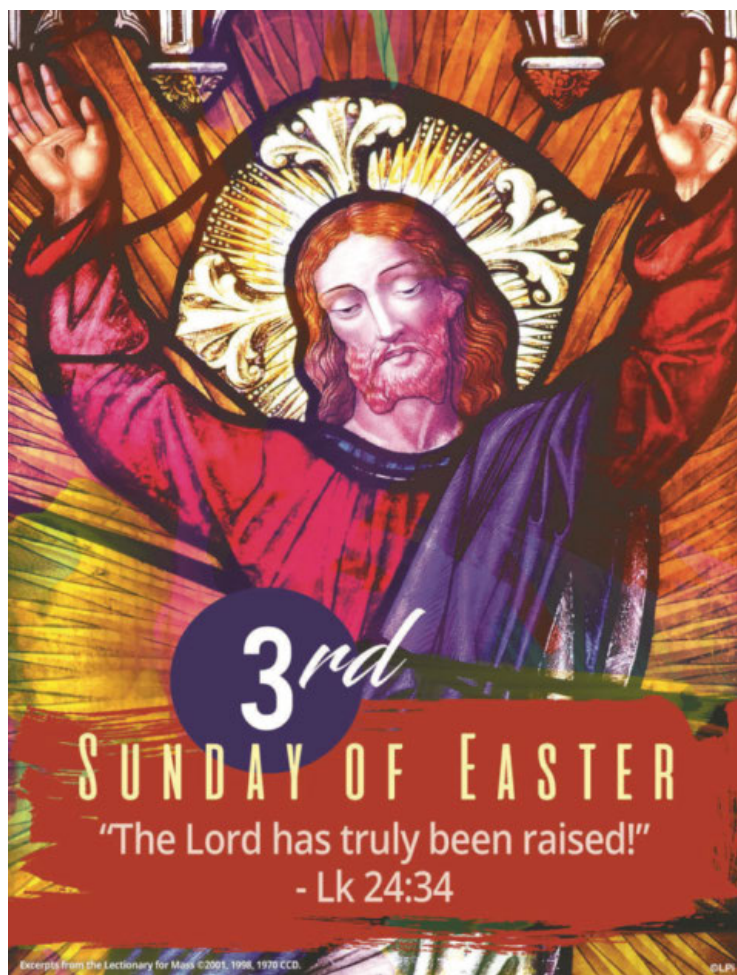

From the Pastor's Desk



In our second reading today from the First Letter of St Peter, we are told to conduct ourselves with reverence during the time of our sojourning. How do we interpret that, "to conduct ourselves with reverence?" Does this mean that we should go through life in formal clothes, always with perfect manners, and always being quiet, with plenty of bows or curtsies?

To conduct ourselves with reverence - don't we form a Norman Rockwell-type image, a husband and wife just standing there with two kids who are perfectly still and attentive? And don't we sometimes think of the Church as the place for the reverent, for the good people, the neat people, the well-behaved people, the middle class people?

I think we all have to admit that we have thought that way, consciously or unconsciously, at least once. But if we think about it further we remember that Jesus said, "He came for those who were lost." He dined with prostitutes and tax collectors. He came to heal, to restore, to redeem, and to save. He sent the Apostles to preach the Gospel to the ends of the Earth.

And so people of every kind are welcome in the Church and should be invited to the Church. Maybe I could send each of you out as evangelizers, boldly speaking out about Jesus the way Saint Peter did in our first reading. You could proclaim Christ's resurrection to all people - people of every race, ethnicity, socioeconomic standing and occupation. I could send you out in pairs to walk, not from Jerusalem to Emmaus, but perhaps from Lake Villa to Milwaukee to Chicago, discussing everything as you walk along. I can't promise that the Lord Himself will appear to you, but anyone you did meet, you could invite them to Church!

When the Scriptures call us to be reverent, they aren't telling us to never have fun. Being a reverent person does not mean that you have to be a boring person. The Church needs fun - loving people who want to live life to the full. We need more laughter in the Church. We need to show the world that our faith fills us with joy and with life. Reverent people live life in Christ, and they live life to the full. Reverent people are not perfect people. But they trust in the perfect love of God. And reverent people don't dismiss people. They want to share the love of God with everyone.

I wish you an enjoyable weekend and a truly blest and faith-filled Easter Season. Alleluia Alleluia

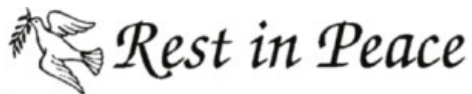

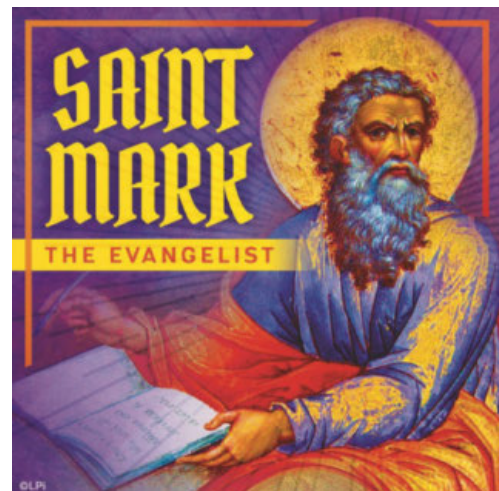

What is the Elijah Cup?

The purpose of the Elijah Cup, a chalice, used during the Consecration of the Mass, is to provide a focal point for prayer. We are all aware of the need for vocations to the priesthood, the permanent diaconate and to the religious life. But sometimes we forget just how powerful praying for an increase in vocations can be. If we pray with the faith of the widow of Zarepheth, our cup will never run dry! We will always have priests to bring us Jesus in the Eucharist.



Background

In 1 Kings 17, during a drought, Elijah tells the poor widow of Zarepheth that if she makes him a small loaf of bread with the last of her flour and oil, her "jar of flour will not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the Lord sends rain upon the earth." In faith, the widow baked the bread and fed Elijah. For the next year, the widow, her son, and Elijah ate bread made from the bowl of flour and jug of oil.

How does it work?

Each month, a family, a couple, or individual, has the opportunity to bring a chalice that has held the Consecrated Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ into their homes. The Elijah Cup serves as a focal point encouraging family prayer for religious vocations, for seminarians and for our serving religious. It is a powerful presence and inspires prayer from adults and children alike.

A Focal Point of Prayer for Vocations

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support God's call to religious life. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured through prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women He is calling in a very special way. We hope that those who bring the cup home will continue to pray for vocations daily.

Interested families or individuals should contact Fr Gerald Walsh, or the Parish office to schedule a month to take the Elijah Cup home. At the end of Mass, (the second weekend of the month, usually the 9:30 am Family Mass) the Elijah Cup will be presented to the family or individual by a Deacon or Priest. The family will then take the cup home, putting it in a place of honor. Each day for a month, during prayer time (morning, bedtime or at meals), the family will pray for an increase and perseverance of vocations. The Elijah Cup should be brought back the second weekend of the month so it can be presented to a new family.

Have You Considered eGiving for Your Sunday Contributions?

There is a “Donate” button on our parish website that you can use for your Sunday donations. This option takes you to the Give Central website, where you can sign up for a regular schedule of contributing that YOU set up. The schedule is completely up to you, and there are several frequency options including weekly, bi-weekly, monthly and quarterly.



You can also sign up for continued Electronic Giving for your Sunday Stewardship contributions through the parish, either by direct debit from your bank account or credit card, on a monthly or weekly basis. A form is available on our parish website or can be emailed/mailed to you at your request.

After signing up for electronic giving, never worry about forgetting your envelope again! It continues your support to Prince of Peace when you are out of town, on vacation or unable to attend Mass.

Parishioners who donate electronically to the Sunday collection receive a quarterly envelope packet, which contains envelopes for any special collections (i.e. St. Vincent de Paul, Holy Day & Archdiocesan collections) rather than the full monthly packet you receive now. Providing you with this new quarterly packet results in a savings to the parish.
