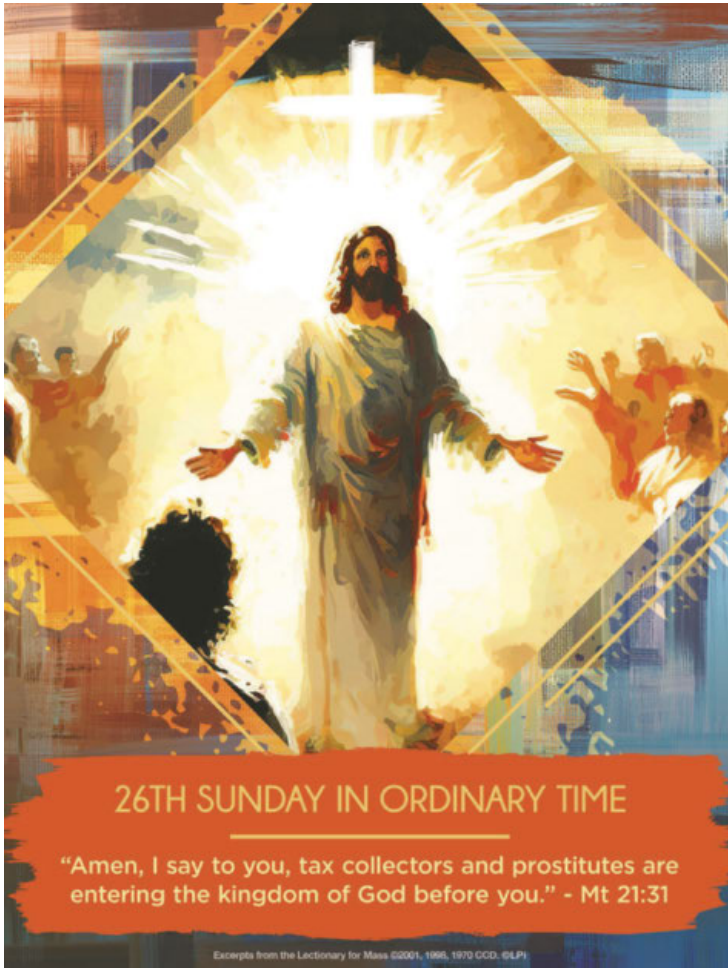

From the Pastor's Desk



In today's gospel Jesus tells the parable of two sons who say one thing and do another. Asked by the father to go and work in the vineyard the first son said "no" but later reconsidered his decision and did the work. The second son, on the other hand, courteously said "yes" to the father but failed to do the work. Who actually did what his father wanted?

In this gospel passage, Jesus is the father, and we are the sons (daughters). The whole point of the story is that neither "son" was right. The first "son" was saying "no" with his mouth, but "doing yes" with his behavior. On the other hand, the second son was saying "yes" with his mouth, but "doing no" with his behavior.

The religious leaders listening to Jesus' story found the first son to be the one who was doing the right thing – the one who said "no" to his father, but ended up doing what the father had asked. And yet, like the second son, the religious leaders (Jesus' audience) were saying "yes" but "doing no." They lived lives that said "we are religious people, we follow all the rules, we are holy." And yet, their behavior did not show it - Jesus could see no evidence of it - no one could.

There are lots of people who live their lives that way. They or we are the second "son" (daughter). So, to make this clear to his listeners, Jesus uses the tax collectors and prostitutes as examples. These people, who were considered by the religious leaders to be sinners, were changing their lives because they believed what Jesus was teaching. Though they had lived lives that said "we are not religious people, we don't follow the rules, we are not holy," in fact, their lives were changing - they were reflecting a belief in the things Jesus was preaching, and Jesus could see that - anyone could! And, there are lots of people who live their lives that way. They/we are the first son. Saying no, but "doing yes."

Again, neither of the sons were right. Clearly, what Jesus was looking for was a "son or daughter" who said "yes" both with their mouth and with their behavior--- a son/daughter who "said" yes and "did" yes.

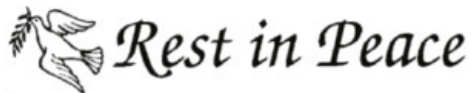

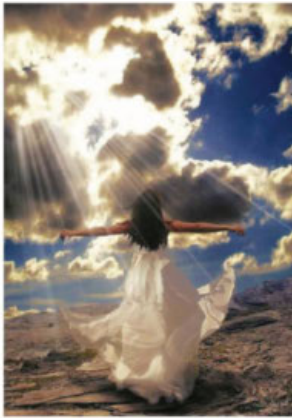

What is the Elijah Cup?

The purpose of the Elijah Cup, a chalice, used during the Consecration of the Mass, is to provide a focal point for prayer. We are all aware of the need for vocations to the priesthood, the permanent diaconate and to the religious life. But sometimes we forget just how powerful praying for an increase in vocations can be. If we pray with the faith of the widow of Zarephath, our cup will never run dry! We will always have priests to bring us Jesus in the Eucharist.



Background

In 1 Kings 17, during a drought, Elijah tells the poor widow of Zarephath that if she makes him a small loaf of bread with the last of her flour and oil, her "jar of flour will not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the Lord sends rain upon the earth." In faith, the widow baked the bread and fed Elijah. For the next year, the widow, her son, and Elijah ate bread made from the bowl of flour and jug of oil.

How does it work?

Each month, a family, a couple, or individual, has the opportunity to bring a chalice that has held the Consecrated Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ into their homes. The Elijah Cup serves as a focal point encouraging family prayer for religious vocations, for seminarians and for our serving religious. It is a powerful presence and inspires prayer from adults and children alike.

A Focal Point of Prayer for Vocations

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support God's call to religious life. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured through prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women He is calling in a very special way. We hope that those who bring the cup home will continue to pray for vocations daily.

Interested families or individuals should contact Fr Gerald Walsh, or the Parish office to schedule a month to take the Elijah Cup home. At the end of Mass, (the second weekend of the month, usually the 9:30 am Family Mass) the Elijah Cup will be presented to the family or individual by a Deacon or Priest. The family will then take the cup home, putting it in a place of honor. Each day for a month, during prayer time (morning, bedtime or at meals), the family will pray for an increase and perseverance of vocations. The Elijah Cup should be brought back the second weekend of the month so it can be presented to a new family.

A note to anyone who may have been a member of the choir at some earlier time, and who happens to still have in their possession a Choir Edition of The Gather Hymnal: you could help the music ministry out significantly.

The choir is growing and with the price of books being what it is now, re-using hymnals is a less expensive option than purchasing all new hymnals. So, run through your shelves and drawers, if you would, and if you happen to have one of these Choir Hymnals (it says "CHOIR" on its spine), would you please consider dropping it off at the office sometime? Even if it's not in brand-new condition, we would certainly be able to make use of it.

Our Prince of Peace St. Vincent de Paul Conference Supports a Family in Need

We met Debbie*, a single mother of three, about two years ago. She called the parish office seeking help. St. Vincent de Paul members conducted a home visit and learned that Debbie was a victim of domestic abuse and was left with multiple past due utility bills after her abusive partner left her life. We partnered with other local organizations to pay her bills to help her stay in her home and care for her children. We also provided clothes and other items for Debbie's one-year-old baby.

Two months later, we learned that Debbie's young adult son, died after being given fentanyl at a friend's house. Debbie's family was devastated, and we provided prayers and comfort to the family during their time of loss. She was very moved when we attended her son's memorial wake to pay our respects. This was not the last difficult situation that Debbie and her children would face.

Earlier this year, Debbie found herself behind on bills and facing eviction due to difficulties maintaining a job while taking care of her toddler. We helped with her car loan and insurance payment so when she lost her housing, she still had transportation while searching for a new home and working intermittently. While Debbie and her two daughters lived in a PADS shelter, we worked to get reduced day care fees for her toddler so that Debbie could work more often.

Fortunately, through the help of partner agencies, Debbie and her daughters moved into an apartment in Antioch in July. Through our SVdP Thrift Store mattress program, we picked up two new mattresses, box springs, and bed frame sets for Debbie and her family to set up their new home. Additionally, we provided food for the family through our Northern Illinois Food Truck and furniture via our Thrift Store.

Happily, Debbie and her girls are doing well and with continued prayers and Debbie's hard work, they are on their way to sustaining themselves in the future. Debbie is working while her young adult daughter is studying to be a therapist. Debbie's toddler is thriving in pre-school and enjoying the park near her new home.

Debbie's story is just one of many we encounter on a regular basis. We can't do this work without your support! Next week, members of St. Vincent de Paul will be speaking at all masses and providing additional information on how you can help.

Have You Considered eGiving for Your Sunday Contributions?

There is a "Donate" button on our parish website that you can use for your Sunday donations. This option takes you to the Give Central website, where you can sign up for a regular schedule of contributing that YOU set up. The schedule is completely up to you, and there are several frequency options including weekly, bi-weekly, monthly and quarterly.



You can also sign up for continued Electronic Giving for your Sunday Stewardship contributions through the parish, either by direct debit from your bank account or credit card, on a monthly or weekly basis. A form is available on our parish website or can be emailed/mailed to you at your request.

After signing up for electronic giving, never worry about forgetting your envelope again! It continues your support to Prince of Peace when you are out of town, on vacation or unable to attend Mass.

Parishioners who donate electronically to the Sunday collection receive a quarterly envelope packet, which contains envelopes for any special collections (i.e. St. Vincent de Paul, Holy Day & Archdiocesan collections) rather than the full monthly packet you receive now. Providing you with this new quarterly packet results in a savings to the parish.
