

From the Desk of Deacon Jim Minor



What Does it Mean to Love?

If I were to take a survey and ask people what it means to love, depending on the person and the context, I am sure I would get a bunch of different answers. Some would be quite simple, such as I love ice cream. (And yes, to me ice cream is the greatest of treats!) I could also look out at nature on a hike, a camping trip, or sitting on a lake, and say, I love a beautiful sunrise or sunset. We could then go a little deeper and I could say I love my wife, my children, my grandchildren and when I am with them, especially in tender moments, that is what defines love

for me. All of these examples are definitions of love.

In the Gospel for this weekend, Jesus is asked a question about which is the greatest of the commandments. In His usual brief style He says, love God and love your Neighbor. But... this type of love He is talking about is not the love you and I are used to. In His reply to the Pharisees and Sadducees, He is telling them that they need to love God with their whole heart, their whole soul, and their whole mind and then they need love their neighbor as themselves. On the surface these two commandments seem very simple, but when we try to put them into practice, we find that it's not so simple after all.

In other words, we need to be all in. Jesus is not telling us, "Well, love God just on Sunday or show your love to God in prayer or love God only when times are tough. He's also not saying to love the people that are easy to love, such as your friends or family. This is where following these commandments gets pretty tough. It's almost as if the test is being thrown back at us to see if we can rise above and truly love God and love our neighbor every moment of our lives.

That means having a relationship with Him. When God is compassionate, we have to be compassionate. When God forgives, we have to forgive. It means that we can't not love our neighbor and still love God at the same time. They have to go hand in hand. If we do not love our neighbor, we are in effect, not loving God as well. Our faith flows from these two commandments.

All of us encounter people that we find difficult to love. We struggle because maybe they did or said something that was hurtful to us. Or we see people who hold values that are different than ours. It becomes a real struggle to love them. We see people living on the margins, whether they be the poor, the homeless, the immigrant, those who fail to respect and cherish life, all those we consider it difficult or sometimes even impossible to love. But God tells us those others have to be loved by us too.

How do we put that into practice? One of the rabbis of the Talmud- the Jewish law- Rabbi Hillel said that "what you hate for yourself, do not do to your neighbor. This is the whole law- the rest is commentary." As we go about our day trying to put these commandments of love into practice, it would help us that before we acted against our neighbor, we would ask if we ourselves would hate that for us. And if we would, maybe we're not acting out of love.

Finally, we have to examine our heart. When we love from the heart, the love is pure, kind and rich. It affects our soul and each time we love, each time we show compassion and mercy, God sees this, and our heart grows ever closer to Him. That is the greatest of the love we can have!







We Are a Resurrection People By Deacon Jim

As we get closer to the month of November, we enter a time when the Church remembers those who have gone before us in faith. First we remember those who we have canonized saints and then November 2nd, we remember our faithful departed. First and foremost, we remember them through our prayers. These can be individual prayers for those who have died in our families and among our friends. And we also gather as parish community to remember those in our parish family who have died this past year, as well as those who are grieving a loss. We commend those who have died to God's loving care while at the same time allowing ourselves to feel the support of our parish family.

As a part of that parish family, it important to know that everyone is invited to our parish All-Souls Liturgy on November 2nd at 7:00 pm. We can help let those who grieve know they are not alone during this difficult time.

We also invite you to write the names of those who have died in the last year in the Book of the Dead which will be displayed in church.

Finally, as we have done the last few years, once again we invite you to bring in pictures of your loved ones who have gone before us. They will be placed on the sanctuary steps and can be dropped off at the parish office. We do ask that you please put some identifying label on the back of the picture so that we can make sure they are returned to you. The pictures will be available for pick up during the following weekend's Masses (November 4, 5).

Also, before the All-Soul's Mass, we will show a slide show of pictures of our beloved dead. If you have a digital picture you'd like to include, please forward it to minor@princeofpeacelv.org. If you have submitted a digital photo in the past, there is no need to re-submit. We will use the one from the previous years.

Grieving the loss of a loved one can be a difficult time for everyone. The value of a support system within a parish allows those experiencing grief to not grieve alone. Here at Prince of Peace, there might be those who have had time to process their grief as well as those who have just recently experienced a loss. Wherever you may be in the grief experience, know that the parish is here to support you. God is present in your loss. We are available to help through individual appointments, grief support groups here at the parish and through referrals to other resources. If you are struggling in any way, please do not hesitate to contact us.

The Results are in!

Several months ago, Prince of Peace participated in a parish-wide survey, the Disciple Maker Index. The results are in!

More than 164 of our parishioners completed the survey. Those numbers compare favorably with the other participating parishes.

A more detailed analysis of the complete survey results will be released from time-to-time as we continue to unpack the data and discern its implications.

Disciple Maker Index Snapshot

- 100% would recommend the religious education program here at Prince of Peace!

The responses are very encouraging and highlight some opportunities for growth. It is a good snapshot of how things are going here at POP.

Have You Considered eGiving for Your Sunday Contributions?

There is a "Donate" button on our parish website that you can use for your Sunday donations. This option takes you to the Give Central website, where you can sign up for a regular schedule of contributing that YOU set up. The schedule is completely up to you, and there are several frequency options including weekly, bi-weekly, monthly and quarterly.

You can also sign up for continued Electronic Giving for your Sunday Stewardship contributions through the parish, either by direct debit from your bank account or credit card, on a monthly or weekly basis. A form is available on our parish website or can be emailed/mailed to you at your request.

After signing up for electronic giving, never worry about forgetting your envelope again! It continues your support to Prince of Peace when you are out of town, on vacation or unable to attend Mass.

Parishioners who donate electronically to the Sunday collection receive a quarterly envelope packet, which contains envelopes for any special collections (i.e. St. Vincent de Paul, Holy Day & Archdiocesan collections) rather than the full monthly packet you receive now. Providing you with this new quarterly packet results in a savings to the parish.

"Hope is always possible. To those who care for the sick, the scene of the Cross provides a way of understanding that even when it seems that there is nothing more to do there remains


