

From the Pastor's Desk



Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, the arrival of the Magi. They were Persian astrologers who, as we hear in today's gospel, observed a star at its rising. They believed that this star indicated the birth of a new king. So, to pay homage to him they followed the star over a long distance to bring him gifts. These gifts are special because they are fit for a special kind of king. They brought gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

There is a lot of meaning in their visit. They were not Jews. They were Gentiles from foreign lands. But what is it about this kingly birth that caused them to follow the star and traverse far from their home to Israel? The prophecy of a king to rescue Israel was not unheard of, and was very likely known in lands beyond Israel. And at the star's rising, they interpreted it to be the sign of the king foretold in the prophecy. Interestingly, their coming to seek Jesus foretells Jesus' future acceptance by the Gentiles. Herod's displeasure with the news also foretells the rejection of Jesus by Israel.

And what about the gifts meant for a special king? There is meaning in the gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. The gold that the magi brought to him represents royalty. Jesus is not only the newborn king of the Jews that has been foretold, but today we know him as the King of kings and the Lord of lords. He is the King of the Universe.

Frankincense is tree resin used for making incense. It is used to represent the sweet fragrance of our prayers rising to God. We use frankincense at Prince of Peace for our incense. As a gift to Jesus, the magi are acknowledging his divinity.

Myrrh is a spice that was used in ancient times for perfume and as a burial ointment. Embalming the body of someone who had died was not a widespread practice outside of Egypt and to help offset the odor of the deceased, myrrh was used to anoint the entire body before it was wrapped in linen cloth. The gift of myrrh represents Jesus' death. We acknowledge Jesus' death as his sacrifice for our sins so that we can have the hope of eternal life.

In his Homilies on the Gospels (10), Pope St. Gregory the Great says that the gold, frankincense, and myrrh represent the gifts that we are to present to God in our daily lives: gold is Christ's wisdom, which is to shine in our lives; frankincense is the prayer and adoration we are to give him; and myrrh is our daily self-sacrifices to the Lord.

Let us offer God the gifts that we have received from Him in our work of building His kingdom.

What is the Elijah Cup?

The purpose of the Elijah Cup, a chalice, used during the Consecration of the Mass, is to provide a focal point for prayer. We are all aware of the need for vocations to the priesthood, the permanent diaconate and to the religious life. But sometimes we forget just how powerful praying for an increase in vocations can be. If we pray with the faith of the widow of Zarapeth, our cup will never run dry! We will always have priests to bring us Jesus in the Eucharist.



Background

In 1 Kings 17, during a drought, Elijah tells the poor widow of Zarapeth that if she makes him a small loaf of bread with the last of her flour and oil, her "jar of flour will not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the Lord sends rain upon the earth." In faith, the widow baked the bread and fed Elijah. For the next year, the widow, her son, and Elijah ate bread made from the bowl of flour and jug of oil.

How does it work?

Each month, a family, a couple, or individual, has the opportunity to bring a chalice that has held the Consecrated Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ into their homes. The Elijah Cup serves as a focal point encouraging family prayer for religious vocations, for seminarians and for our serving religious. It is a powerful presence and inspires prayer from adults and children alike.

A Focal Point of Prayer for Vocations

Praying for vocations is the most powerful way to support God's call to religious life. A vocation is a call from the Holy Spirit, a gift from God that is nurtured through prayer. When we pray for vocations, we lift up to our Father those men and women He is calling in a very special way. We hope that those who bring the cup home will continue to pray for vocations daily.

Interested families or individuals should contact Fr Gerald Walsh, or the Parish office to schedule a month to take the Elijah Cup home. At the end of Mass, (the second weekend of the month, usually the 9:30 am Family Mass) the Elijah Cup will be presented to the family or individual by a Deacon or Priest. The family will then take the cup home, putting it in a place of honor. Each day for a month, during prayer time (morning, bedtime or at meals), the family will pray for an increase and perseverance of vocations. The Elijah Cup should be brought back the second weekend of the month so it can be presented to a new family.

Support Group for Separated and Recently Divorced

Divorce is full of hurts, disappointments, losses and changes. We can become wounded and sometimes feel broken. When this happens, there may be feelings of hurt, rejection, failure, guilt, a sense of being punished by others, an increase in the constant irritations in life or a loss of self-esteem.

Why a Support Group For Separated and Divorced?

- It takes time to heal.
- There are several stages that occur.
- Support and understanding come from others who have "been there".
- There is comfort in meeting people who have experienced the same type of loss.
- These gatherings offer a safe place to process the trauma of the separation or divorce.
- Often the group becomes the safest and only place for participants to share their feelings.
- People recognize the love of Christ through one another.

The non-denominational support group for separated and divorced will meet on:





Parishioners who donate electronically to the Sunday collection receive a quarterly envelope packet, which contains envelopes for any special collections (i.e. St. Vincent de Paul, Holy Day & Archdiocesan collections) rather than the full monthly packet you receive now.
