

CERVICAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

January is Cervical Cancer Awareness Month, a great time to talk about how cervical cancer can be prevented through screening and human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccination. VAMS - NOT A SCAM

Vaccine Administration Management System (VAMS) is an optional, webbased application that supports planning and execution for temporary, mobile, or satellite COVID-19 vaccination clinics, as well as traditional medical practices that do not have existing IT systems for vaccination clinic management. VAMS will verify your registration and then follow up with important scheduling information. CORONAVIRUS - COVID-19 KNOW YOUR STATUS

Permanent testing sites are fixed locations to expand testing opportunities and provide more testing locations across the state. They are state-affiliated testing sites. The type of test (oral/saliva or shallow/deep nasal) varies by location. Pop-up testing sites are drive-thru, walk-up, and Curative trailer locations, and change regularly. Parish Council Meeting Minutes January 20, 2021

Attendance: Fr. Mac, Deacon Cousar, Linda Abili, Lorraine Eckrich, Doris Matthews, Cheryl Riviere, Loretta Young **Absent:** Stephanie Bolden, Tom Gallagher, J. Barcon Hilton, John Rando, Cheryl Riviere, Deidre Ann Robinson

- Fr. Mac opened meeting with a reading from the Acts of the Apostles and prayer.
- Fr. Mac welcomed new member Lorraine Eckrich who has been appointed because of her involvement with the music ministry moving forward.
- Discussion to encourage all parish council members to attend meetings because it's important to hear and understand the changes/improvements underway.
- Fr. Mac provided the following updates:
 - Finances: Regular Checking \$37,000, Building/Maint. Checking \$12,000, Investment Acct. \$33,000

Parish Updates - Fr Mac:

- Website has been reworked and updated with more outward facing enhancements. Such as forms added to register with the parish, for first communion, etc. The goal is to have a form for each sacrament so that the request is completed on-line. All are encouraged to view the website.
- Lighting is important to the ambiance in church and safety in parish center. We're working toward adding more lighting in dark areas.
- Working to add mailbox to the front of parish office to enable secure and regular mail delivery from postal service.
- We have more people attending mass now.
- Live-streaming is going well. Livestreaming enables our reach beyond the walls of the church. 75 views from last Sunday's mass versus 30 or 40 previously.
- Music ministry: Jenny Traynor will play and serve as the cantor on Saturdays. On Sunday's Lorraine Eckrich will
 be the cantor and Kevin Benjamin will play until his Methodist Church resumes regular service. At which time,
 Jenny will play on Sundays and Kevin will play on Saturdays. They will fill-in for each other as needed.
- Mobile Food Pantry on Saturday, January 23. Volunteers have registered on our website. People have preregistered to receive food. We will accept registration onsite.
- We plan to do an additional COVID testing event in collaboration with the State. (Update since meeting the date is Feb 3, 10am—4pm)
- Fr Mac will be on vacation Feb 5—Feb 17. Fr Eliazar Sandoval, SMA will cover the masses and hear confession during this time.
- Food Pantry in kitchen of Fellowship Hall, items available to the parish after mass. Non-perishables are located on shelving, perishables are in the refrigerator and freezer. Parishioners must remember to social distance.

• Building & Maintenance - Deacon Bob

- Heater issue in the church. Reskovitz called in and cleaned up mud found in the sensing line and completed a preventative maintenance check.
- Commercial refrigerator in fellowship hall is not cooling as it should. Will start first with a service call to determine if unit can be repaired and associated cost. We were advised in 2019 that condenser is not holding up. If it's a condenser issue, vendor advised it would be best to replace unit. Replacement cost is approximately \$4,000.
- Leaks in second floor of parish center. Received itemized quote in 2020 to address this issue which included brick pointing. Important to get this addressed to avoid further damage. Fr Mac will review previous quote.

New Business

- Fr Mac shared concern that we do not have proper and descent vessels for our Liturgy. Vessels (chalice and paten) must be made of precious metal. We cannot use glass or porous material. Fr Mac will ask his brother priests if anything is available and will check Archdiocese of Phila resale shop, as well. In addition, Fr. Mac is asking ministries of the parish (Sodality, KPC, KPCLA, Kateri Circle, etc.) to contribute toward this effort. For new vessels estimated cost would be approx. \$500-800. Two sets are needed. Doris will ask Sodality, Lorraine will ask KPCLA and KPC. Each vessel will be engraved with name of contributor. Plan to have quality vessels by Easter and present to the community.
- The Pope has designated this year as the Year of Saint Joseph. The parish will plan something special for the Feast of St Joseph's (3/19). Suggestions: a novena, boxed lunches maybe something during the weekend masses (3/20 & 3/21).
- Fr Mac, again, asked council members to reach out and encourage greater participation from all members of parish council. It's important to keep everyone engaged.
- Fr. Mac adjourned meeting with the Lord's Prayer.
