

Introduction to the Liturgy

The Holy Spirit gathers us together today as we begin this forty day season of Lent. Life is full of temptations, and we are especially aware of them during Lent. We are tempted to do things we find desirable, even when we know they're wrong. We are tempted to avoid things that we believe to be undesirable, even when we know they're the right thing to do. Today, we hear the serpent successfully tempt Adam and Eve and the devil unsuccessfully tempt Jesus. May the Holy Spirit, who accompanied Jesus in the desert and accompanies us wherever we go, give us the strength to resist temptation.

Refresher on the Rules of Fasting & Abstinence During Lent 2023

Abstinence: All who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

Fasting: Everyone, from the celebration of their 18th birthday to their 59th birthday, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means eating only one full meal each day. Two other partial meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken; but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

Almsgiving: Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church: through regular stewardship to their parish, support of charities, and their generous response to the diocesan Catholic Stewardship Appeal.

Prayer: To deepen one's love for Christ, Catholics are urged to participate in the sacramental life of the Church during Lent by attending daily Mass and frequenting the sacrament of Reconciliation.

Reconciliation Monday: Lent is also a privileged time for celebrating the sacrament of Reconciliation. On Monday, April 3rd, 3:00—8:00 pm, Father Evers will be available for anyone wishing to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation before Easter.




Question of the Week

PUT PREVENTION INTO PRACTICE

TEEN DATING VIOLENCE AWARENESS & PREVENTION MONTH

February is recognized as Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month, which is a nationwide effort to raise awareness about abuse in teenage relationships. While this may not be a topic that is frequently discussed, it is an issue that affects millions of teenagers across the United States. According to the U.S. Department of Education, about one in three U.S. teens ages 14 to 20 have been victims of dating violence and about the same number say they have committed relationship violence themselves. But Delaware is making moves to help end teen dating violence. People's Place Delaware provides prevention services for teen dating violence. NATIONAL CANCER PREVENTION AWARENESS MONTH

February is National Cancer Prevention Month, and while preventive testing should remain top of mind year-round, this month is a good reminder to schedule preventive screenings for cancers. The best way to detect cancer early and increase your chances for better outcomes is to get the routine cancer screenings and checkups recommended for you Early detection of cancer can mean less extensive treatment, more treatment options and better chances of survival. The five-year survival rate for many cancers, when caught early, is as high as 90%. During National Cancer Prevention Month, we're focused on helping you understand the screening habits, healthy choices and other lifestyle changes that can lower your risk for several types of cancer. INTERNATIONAL PRENATAL INFECTION PREVENTION MONTH

Pregnancy should be a time of excitement and joy, but for many expecting mothers, it's also a time of worry. Infections during pregnancy are common. Although exact numbers aren't available, it's estimated that over 60% of women in the United States have at least one infection at some point during their pregnancy, most commonly during the first trimester (first three months). Infections like the common cold are very unlikely to cause serious harm, but others can affect the baby's development and/or cause premature birth.

The most common and generally accepted infection prevention step that anyone can do is proper and frequent hand washing. This reduces the risk of infection spread by touch. Pregnant women and anyone coming in close contact should wash their hands: Women can't prevent all infections, but with good prenatal care, they can reduce the risk.
