Liturgy of the WordToday we celebrate the Liturgy of Confirmation. We're blessed and thankful that we also celebrate the two additional Sacraments of Initiation - Baptism and the Eucharist. These three are the foundation of our Christian life. In the first reading we hear that if we believe, our eyes will be opened and our hearts enlightened. In the reading from Acts of the Apostles we hear of how the Apostles received instructions to go into the world, preach the whole gospel bringing people to the faith so that we will know and love Him; and in the Gospel, Jesus asks us to keep His commandments as an expression of our love for Him. As the Sacraments of Initiation are conferred on our young people we pray that their faith and their relationship with the Lord continues to grow. And, like the Apostles, we pray that the parish will be an example of how to share the Good News of our Savior Jesus Christ and to honor the Commandments as an expression of our love and faith in Jesus.



Father Glenn's 10th Anniversary Ordination to the Priesthood

On Sunday, July 9th we will celebrate Father Glenn's 10th Anniversary of Ordination as a priest with Mass and a luncheon in the fellowship hall. Father Glenn was ordained on June 8, 2013 and we've been blessed to call him pastor for nearly two years.

Several parishioners have asked "What type of gift is most appropriate to give Father Glenn?" Personal gifts are always appreciated, but Father believes that everything comes from God and that we must give back to God.

Father has taken on several BIG projects such as replacing the damaged St. Joseph's statue. We're hopeful that our new St. Joseph's statue will be delivered within the next few months.

The most recent project he would like us to accomplish is to replace the carpet in the church with new marble flooring. We've learned that the flooring project also requires the removal of asbestos tiles. The good news - Father has secured private donations to cover the majority of the flooring expense, but additional funds are still needed. By the grace of God, we're hopeful to start and complete the flooring project by the end of summer.
