THOUGHTS FROM FATHER TED: In the first reading for this Sunday from the Book of Exodus, Moses approaches the bush that was burning but mysteriously not being consumed by the fire. God stops Moses and tells him to remove his sandals from his feet because he was standing on holy ground. We also have "holy ground" in our churches. We have the real presence of the risen Christ in the form of the Eucharistic Bread that has been transformed into Christ's Body. I am concerned that we are losing our awareness of this "holy ground". We need to recapture a sense of reverence in our churches. They are not auditoriums or meeting halls. Our churches are truly holy places. They are made holy by Him who abides in them, the actions that are performed in the Eucharistic Sacrifice and by the gift of ourselves that we offer to the Father in union with the crucified and risen Christ. While we may not need to remove our shoes, we do need to reverence Christ present by our bodily actions and by our interior awareness of His presence.
