

MUSINGS OF FATHER JIM: Dear Friends,

It seems strange to be packing even as I am still unpacking. It is a bit awkward to have a welcoming potluck even as I am preparing to leave for three months. My sabbatical hinges on Fr. Ted's graciousness to assume the sacramental duties of the parishes, but I have strived to have things in order for him somehow to leave the space he needs to be away from the parishes during the week and have a retired life apart from the parishes. I am depending on the lay leaders of the parish to assume some of these responsibilities.

I know the Lord only spent 40 days in the desert, but he is the Christ. I need a bit more time. For disclosure, the diocese will pay my monthly salary during these months, from the Continuing Education Funds. I pay my travel expenses and 1/3 of the cost of the Tantur Institute Program, the Diocese pays one/third and each parish will be asked to contribute \$1200.00 to this sabbatical program. Hopefully, I will be able to remain in contact with the parish weekly, and return refreshed and renewed in Advent. Thank you for your welcome and patience in my assuming fully the pastoral care of the parishes and your patience for my return.

It is in many ways an exciting time of beginning. We are extremely grateful to Sarah Weber and Jenny Amerin, who have led the religious formation programs of St. Anthony and St. Patrick parishes, respectively, for many years. I am so grateful to Amy Laudick and Minerva Bernabe for beginning those roles, picking up the mantel, so to speak, and for Heather Flavin for continuing the good work she has begun in Meade.

I also have received permission from Bishop Brungardt to proceed to the next step in the building projects of St. Anthony and St. Patrick, though St. Patrick is much further along in the process and may begin breaking ground as early as this fall. Thank you to all the members of the Building Committees that have been part of this process of discernment. We have begun to look at the concrete needs of St. John Church, also, but are only in the initial phase.

Finally, Fr. Ted has agreed to start the RCIA process with those adults seeking to enter the full sacramental life of the parishes. If you or someone you know would like to enter the river of preparing for full communion, please contact Fr. Ted. I hope to return in time for the rite of Welcoming and Acceptance and continue the formation process towards the Easter Mystagogia.

I hope in the wonder of the worldwide web, to continue to communicate regularly with you. Thank you for your prayers, as daily I will lift you in prayer on the Altars of the Holy Land. Fr. Jim

RACISM & LIFE ISSUES: In their November 2018 Pastoral Letter Against Racism, Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love, the U.S. Catholic bishops wrote, "racism occurs because a person ignores the fundamental truth that...all [humans are] equally made in the image of God." Racism fails to acknowledge the dignity with which God creates each person, and it contributes to a culture of death. The Church in the United States has spoken out consistently against abortion, assisted suicide, euthanasia, the death penalty, and other threats to human life; it is not a secret that these attacks have severely affected people of color. These brothers and sisters are targeted for abortion, disproportionally affected by poverty, have the greatest numbers on death row, and are most likely to feel pressure to end their lives through assisted suicide when facing serious illness. The feast of St. Peter Claver is an opportunity to highlight the connection between racism and various attacks against human life.
