

MUSINGS OF FATHER JIM: Dear people of the parishes of Meade County,

"Friends all gather round the table of the Lord!" These lyrics from a children's song have always been music to my ears. To serve the table of the Lord, the altar of the Lord, is one of the great joys of my life, and I believe all ministers of the Mass share this special joy, from servers, to ushers, to musicians, to greeters, to those in recent years called to serve as extraordinary ministers of communion.

We come to the final, the fifth pillar of the Diocesan Pastoral Plan, "to serve with compassion-accompany all in the Lord, especially the poor", quoting Paul in his letter to the Galatians, "Serve one another through love," at this special moment of Pentecost and the return to public celebration of Mass. What we long to do ritually should only be a prefiguring of what is happening each day in our lives. It is not inappropriate to say that the world becomes our altar. There was a challenging post by an Episcopalian bishop, challenging the notion that our churches have been closed. Yes, our buildings have been closed, at least empty, but his point was that at this time of pandemic particularly is when the Church has needed to be most open for business than ever, that is in the faithful charity responding to the great needs for serving those ill and destitute around us.

I not only share with the faithful the heartfelt missing of the Eucharist together, but the "stay at home" order left me searching desperately for what was essential in my daily ministry and the daily ministry of all believers. I have felt pangs of guilt at not being able to visit the hospital and care homes. I ponder how the faithful have felt the lack of freedom to reach out and touch others in their lives. I know I should have used the phone and internet more effectively, but we have discovered, or maybe knew, the great limitations of virtual social media. There are heroic stories of those who delivered food and provided care for those who have lost loved ones, lost employment, lost income, lost security. But unfortunately, probably too many of us were like the scattered sheep, lost and helpless.

We have the great opportunity to come together for Pentecost, maybe a little like the apostles, locked in and afraid, asking for a great outpouring of the Holy Spirit to animate us once again to serve freely and generously, without fear. We take baby steps in asking for your cooperation to follow the guidelines of the health and church officials, who hopefully, truly, have our best interests in mind. This, too, will pass, but not without leaving the discomfort of the need to avoid close contact and impediments it places upon us to freely serve one another in love.

May we go out from the church, guarded in our social interaction at the doors of the church, but freely enlisted into the mission to go into the world, baptize all nations, teaching them and trusting that the Lord is true to his promise, "I am with you until the end of the age!"

May the Holy Spirit move us! Fr. Jim
