Solemnity of the Assumption to Mary into Heaven, August 15th: Whenever January 1, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, or August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption, or November 1, the solemnity of All Saints, falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated. This decree of the Conference of Bishops was approved and confirmed by the Apostolic See by a decree of the Congregation for Bishops (Prot. N. 296/84), signed by Bernardin Cardinal Gantin, Prefect of the Congregation, and dated July 4, 1992. Because of the Covid-19 Pandemic, the suspension of the obligation to attend mass on Sunday's and Holy Days of Obligation remains in force as well, therefore there will be no Mass celebrated from our Parishes for the Solemnity. Fr. Jim will be assisting the Engaged Encounter in Great Bend. Fr. John Strasser, retired priest residing in Garden City will come to celebrate the Saturday evening Mass and the two Sunday Masses in English. Deacon Oscar Rodriquez from Liberal will provide a Spanish Communion Service.
