MUSINGS OF FATHER JIM: Dear faithful Catholic citizens,

May you have a Blessed and safe Independence Day! Our 4th of July celebrations hold a deep meaning and value for us as citizens, but even more as Catholics. We have had to become bolder in our participation in the civil discourse of our country to protect the values and freedoms necessary to pass through this world with grace. I fear our identity as defenders of the unborn and of the sacredness of marriage and family is fraught with political hazards, but necessary in our times to stand up for those values which come to us from the Lord.

I have inserted in this week's bulletin a letter addressing an initiative I have been involved in since October. Frankly, I am a little surprised at where I find myself in the promotion of Catholic FM radio. Many of you may have heard the epic anecdote about Sr. Angelica who founded EWTN (Eternal Word Television Network). In her bold foray into radio broadcasting before being propelled into the television market, she had worked for three years to form a radio station. She had ordered the \$100,000.00 equipment needed, but did not have the money to pay for it. The equipment arrived, and she still did not know how she was going to fund it. She had prayed, "Lord, if you want this to happen, you have to do it." That morning, out of the blue, she received a phone call from a man she had never met, who said, "Sister, I hear you are trying to start a Catholic Radio station and I am writing a check today for \$100,000.00.

I have not always appreciated all the programming of EWTN, nor of Sr. Angelica's personality, but I have to admire the legacy of Catholic Radio and TV programming that she has left. Every time I travel to Dodge City, I listen and appreciate particularly "Call to Communion" and "Afternoons with Al Kresta" played through Guadalupe Radio. It will be a personal stress, but I do not believe it will be a stress on our parishes to provide these airwaves in our county. I only ask you to support it in any way you feel called to it and your listening ear.

Our two most treasured freedoms are the freedom of religion and the freedom to pursue happiness, not only happiness in this life, but in the life to come. Thomas Jefferson said that a democracy can only exist and endure with an educated citizenry and freedom of speech. This is the essence of Catholic radio. If it serves God, may it come to be! Fr. Jim
