

MUSINGS OF FATHER JIM: Dear people of the Eucharist,

Eucharistic Revival in the US began June 12, 2022, on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, the bishops of the United States are calling for all dioceses to begin a three-year plan to revive and foster Eucharistic devotion in dioceses, parishes, and the hearts of the faithful. The Eucharistic Revival is proposed to deepen the understanding of Real Presence and create a culture of Eucharistic reverence and devotion in the Church. 2022 is the Year of the Diocese, 2023 is the year of the Parish, and 2024 has been deemed the Year of Renewal.

Please see the bulletin for the five strategic pillars of the National Eucharistic Revival. I would like to begin by reflecting on the first pillar, "Foster encounters with Jesus through kerygmatic proclamation and experiences of Eucharistic Devotion." Kerygmatic is a strange word to us and comes from the Greek word "Kerygma". It comes from a root to mean "to loudly proclaim". In our post-modern time it has become to mean the essential message of the Gospel. My nephew did not like that I expressed my opinion that he was living a "pagan" lifestyle. Without the personal encounter of the Kerygma, a baptized Catholic is no different from anyone who has not truly received the Lord.

It is curious that the kerygmatic proclamation of the Lord is paired with experiences of Eucharistic devotion, which we most often think of in terms of periods of silence before the Blessed Sacrament. I was tempted to use one of my hours with the Extraordinary Ministers of Communion in a Holy Hour, but I have too much I want to proclaim to them of the beauty of the Eucharist, that even one third of the time did not seem a luxury I could offer. We do offer 5 hours of adoration weekly in our parishes, but only a handful of faithful partake. Our churches are open in the daylight hours for Eucharistic visits, but communal adoration has its particularly unique way of proclaiming loudly the Kerygma, the life, death, and resurrection of the Lord.

I invite anyone who even does not feel called to serve as an Extraordinary Minister of Communion, yet feels a need for Eucharistic revival, to join us at the Forst Center in Meade at 3:00 PM on Sunday, August 14th, or repeated on August 21st. Or maybe begin planning to attend the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana Wednesday, July 17 to Sunday July 21, 2024. You can access many resources from https://www.usccb.org/eucharist or google Eucharistic revival for a seemingly infinite number of resources. Joyfully, Fr. Jim EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL: The Catholic Bishops of the US Catholic Conference have asked our faithful to embark on a two year Eucharistic Revival to coincide with the universal Synod and Synodality. Our parishes, with a long overdue renewal of commissioning of Extraordinary Ministers of Communion, largely due to the Covid Pandemic, need a gathering together on this Eucharistic Theme and renewing the coordination of servers with those ministers returning to serve at the Altar. Fr. Jim would like to attempt a combined parish retreat of all three parishes, offered twice to facilitate the participation of as many as possible in these two separate dates. All current extraordinary Ministers of Communion and those needed to fill the absences of those who have left the ministry should plan to attend one of these sessions at the Forst Center in Meade, KS. If you have interest in serving as an Extraordinary Minister of Communion, please contact Fr. Jim. Mark your calendars for Sunday, August 14th from 3:00 until 6:00 PM or Sunday August 21st from 3:00-6:00 PM at the Forst Center in Meade.

<u>DOCTRINE OF THE ASSUMPTION</u>: Because of Mary's participation in the Incarnation of Christ, she was honored as a unique member of the Church. Just as Solomon brought the Ark of the Covenant to the Temple (1Kings 8:17-21), Mary, as the Ark of the New Covenant, was brought to heaven to dwell with Christ.

Though the Assumption of Mary is not documented in the New Testament, it is expounded in Section 966 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians: In giving birth you kept your virginity; in your Dormition you did not leave the world, O Mother of God, but were joined to the source of Life. You conceived the living God and, by your prayers, will deliver our souls from death.
