Reflecting Deeper on **THE GOSPEL**

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

There is a thing called “false piety.” It is when we wear a religious disguise of devotion, attend to our obligations, and outwardly abide by rules while being inwardly unkind, uncharitable, and exclusive. Wearing the right clothes, saying the proper prayers, being in sacred places, and reading devotional books, those exhibiting false piety craftily try to control others using the pretense of love. The Pharisees, consistently criticized by Jesus, are prime examples. Thinking they are superior to others, they foolishly believe they are better positioned with God and more worthy of God’s attention. Forming an exclusive “club,” they divide things between “mine” and “yours” and “us” and “them.” They quickly criticize and point out flaws and errors in rituals and thinking. Conformity becomes the first commandment and control is the game’s name.

The requirements for “club membership” are clear: do what we do, think what we think, and believe what we believe. Attempting to control others using the lure of “status” or “salvation,” they seduce others into thinking that conformity is the only way to holiness. Clinging to “my beliefs,” “my parish,” “my way of thinking,” they fail to see the more significant relationship with God that is veiled in all of these superficial rules and practices. Shallow, hollow, and empty vessels, they gloss over the more important virtues of justice, mercy, faithfulness, and forgiveness. Sparkling clean on the outside, but dirty on the inside. Spiritual arrogance is a grave sin. It alienates and hurts the little ones, those considered “least” in the kingdom.

God knows no favorites. Everyone belongs regardless of whether you are an official, bona fide member. Sometimes membership may be a detriment to actually living the Gospel if you’re joining the team for the wrong reasons. The genuinely humble ones may not appear to be overly “pious.” They may not know all of the proper prayers or abide by all of the correct rituals, but they know that they are broken and need mercy. There is no shame in being broken. In fact, many things need to be broken in order to be what they truly are! There is a reason Jesus told us to pray in private. It’s only between you and God. It is nobody else’s business.

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Reflexión sobre **El Evangelio**

Alentando un Entendimiento Más Profundo de la Escritura

Recuerdo, como si fuera hoy, el principio de la pandemia, y como el Papa, obispos, párrocos y catequistas nos invitaban a orar por el fin de la pandemia. Luego, a principio de este año surgió otro urgente pedido de orar sin cesar por el fin de la guerra en Ucrania y por otros países donde la violencia es el pan de cada día. Necesitamos paz, vivir con tranquilidad, como derecho de la persona. Dios da la paz y nadie tiene derecho a quitarla por simple capricho. La paz se obtiene cuando el corazón de la persona está en armonía consigo mismo. Por lo tanto, el reto de este domingo es iniciar nuestra relación con Dios por medio de la oración.

El Evangelio de hoy, nos presenta a dos personas en el templo haciendo oración. Las dos son muy diferentes, pero tienen algo en común: ambos acuden a orar. Cada uno lo hace a su manera, uno frente al altar y el otro atrás. Uno lo hace mejor que el otro. Pero las dos personas hablan con Dios. ¿Cuál es la enseñanza de estas personas para mí? Creo que, acudir a Dios por medio de la oración en cualquier circunstancia de la vida. ¡Que nunca deje pasar un día sin oración! Con el valor del publicano, que ni siquiera se atrevía a mirar al cielo por vergüenza de sus pecados. A Dios no podemos presumirle, ni tampoco ocultar lo que somos, él nos conoce. “Dios mío, ten piedad de mí que soy pecador” (Lucas 18,13).

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OUR SAINT *of the* WEEK

SAINT ANTHONY MARY CLARET | OCTOBER 24

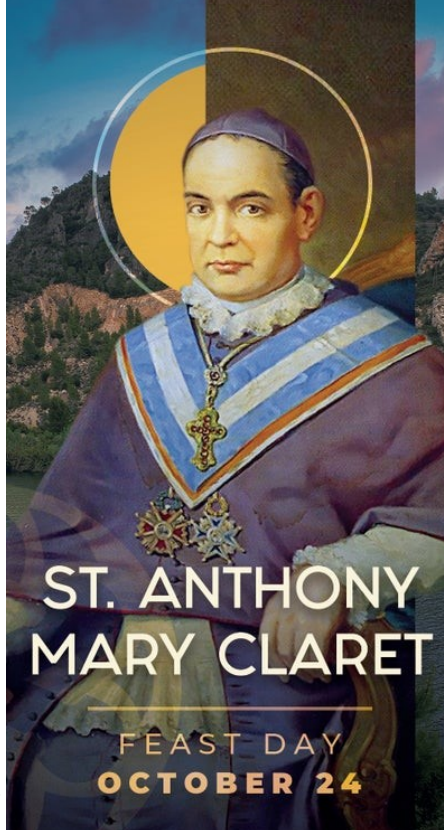
SAN ANTONIO MARÍA CLARET | OCTUBRE 24

Saint Anthony Mary Claret is also known as the “spiritual father of Cuba.” He was born in Salient in Catalonia, Spain, in 1807. He became a weaver, like his father, and was very talented. But he studied in his spare time to become a priest and was ordained in 1835. In 1849 the saint founded the Claretians, a religious institute of missionaries, and a companion order of women religious who served as teachers for girls.

From 1850 to 1857 he served as Archbishop of Santiago de Cuba, Cuba, where he worked diligently to reform both clergy and laity. He opposed concubinage and instructed black slaves, and championed family-owned farms instead of the mass farming of a sugar cash crop. These stances were vehemently opposed by many, and Saint Anthony was the target of assassins.

He was recalled to act as Queen Isabella II's confessor, a duty he reluctantly agreed to, with the exceptions that he would reside away from the court, attending the household only to hear confessions and instruct the children. While in Spain he founded the Religious Publishing House and wrote or published 200 Catholic books and pamphlets. He went into exile to France with the Queen's household during the Spanish Revolution of 1868.

The saint returned to Rome to Participate in Vatican I where he defended the infallibility of the Pope. He died in France in 1870 and was canonized in 1950 by Pope Pius XII.



San Antonio María Claret es también conocido como el “padre espiritual de Cuba”. Nació en Salient en Cataluña, España, en 1807. Se convirtió en tejedor, como su padre, y tenía mucho talento. Pero en su tiempo libre estudió para ser sacerdote y fue ordenado en 1835. En 1849 el santo fundó los Claretianos, un instituto religioso de misioneros y una orden de compañeras religiosas que servían como maestras para niñas.

De 1850 a 1857 se desempeñó como Arzobispo de Santiago de Cuba, Cuba, donde trabajó diligentemente para reformar tanto al clero como al laicado. Se opuso al concubinato e instruyó a los esclavos negros, y defendió las granjas familiares en lugar de la agricultura masiva de un cultivo comercial de azúcar. Muchos se opusieron con vehemencia a estas posturas, y San Antonio fue el objetivo de los asesinos.

Fue llamado a actuar como confesor de la reina Isabel II, un deber que aceptó a regañadientes, con la excepción de que residiría fuera de la corte, asistiendo a la casa solo para escuchar confesiones e instruir a los niños. Estando en España fundó la Editorial Religiosa y escribió o publicó 200 libros y folletos católicos. Se exilió a Francia con la casa de la Reina durante la Revolución Española de 1868.

El santo volvió a Roma para participar en el Concilio Vaticano I donde defendió la infalibilidad del Papa. Murió en Francia en 1870 y fue canonizado en 1950 por el Papa Pío XII.

More Than a Buzzword

If you roll your eyes at the mention of the term stewardship, it's probably because, in the modern Church, stewardship has become something of a corporate buzzword. It's often used interchangeably with the concepts of financial endowment and volunteerism.

What's wrong with supporting your parish monetarily? What's the issue with giving of your time in service and ministry? Nothing at all, in fact — we should all be doing more of these things.

But as we do them, we should be constantly asking ourselves the all-important questions: Why am I doing this? How am I doing this? For whom am I doing this?

A donation to the parish school is a great thing. But ideally, the donor would have made the gift regardless of the ability to name the school gym. A tireless volunteer who always finds time for her parish certainly glorifies God with her commitment. But hopefully, her commitment would be just as enthusiastic if she knew there was no prospect of being written up in the bulletin as Volunteer of the Month.

God knows no favorites. The prayer of the Pharisee in the temple did not justify him because the Pharisee didn't really mean it as a prayer. His intent wasn't to thank God, his intent was to draw attention to his gifts. God did not reject the Pharisee's fasting and his tithes, he rejected the spirit in which they were offered.

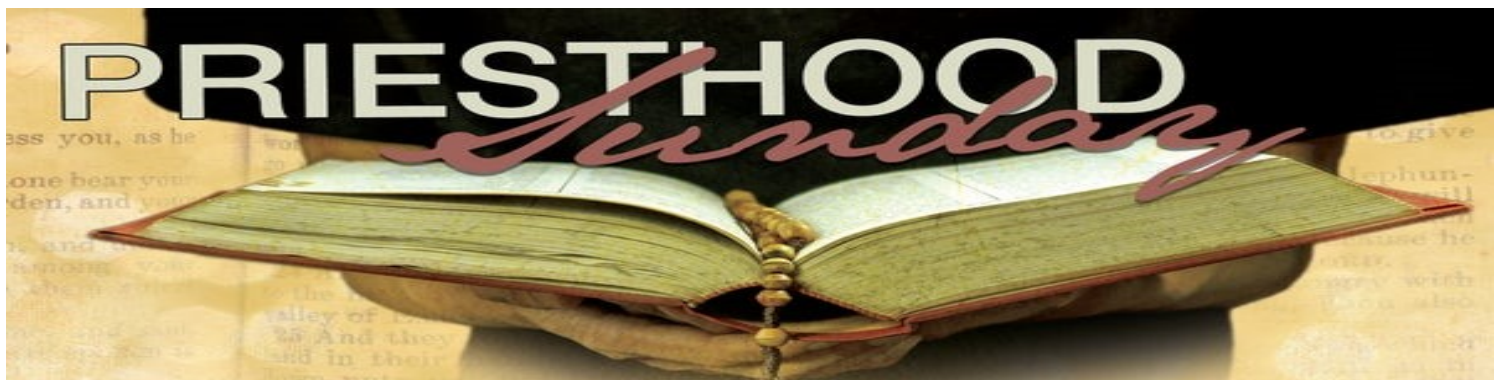
God desires to transform us — our hearts, our souls, our communities. When we give of ourselves — either through money or through time — he is honored by the act of giving, not the gift itself. We should never make the mistake of thinking that stewardship is “time, talent, and treasure.” Stewardship is the spirit of offering these gifts freely.
