

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Wary

December 8th Holy Day of Obligation

Mass at Immaculate Conception at 5:30 pm



Contrary to popular belief, the "Immaculate Conception" does not refer to Christ's virginal birth. Rather, it refers to the Blessed Virgin Mary who was conceived without sin.

In the Constitution *Ineffabilis Deus* of 8 December, 1854, Pius IX pronounced and defined that the Blessed Virgin Mary "in the first instance of her conception, by a singular privilege and grace granted by God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the human race, was preserved exempt from all stain of original sin."

Saint Nicholas, Bishop of Myra


Feast Day December 6th

Saint Nicholas of Myra (traditionally 15 March 270 - 6 December 343). also known as Nicholas of Bari, was an early Christian bishop of Greek descent from the maritime city of Myra in Asia Minor (Greek: Μύρα; Modernday Demre, Turkey) during the time of the Roman Empire. Because of the many miracles attributed to his intercession, he is also known as Nicholas the Wonderworker, Saint Nicholas is the patron saint of sailors. merchants, archers, repentant thieves, children, brewers, pawnbrokers, unmarried people, and students in various cities and countries around Europe.



Immaculate Conception Parish is raising funds to purchase a beautiful bronze sculpture of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The sculpture represents the Blessed Virgin Mary and Christ Child, as well as all mothers and children, born and unborn, illuminating the sanctity of life.

The sculpture will be permanently installed in the "Mary Garden" located on the south side of the church.

Our Lady of Life sculpture is a 5'7" x 19" life-size bronze by Sondra Jonson of S L Jonson Studios in Nebraska

Bronze is considered the best material for outdoor sculptures and is expected to last many years.

The estimated installation date is July 2023.

Our Lady of Loreto -- Feast Day December 10th

On Dec. 10, the Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of Loreto. Loreto refers to the Holy House of Loreto, in the house in which Mary was born, and where the angel Gabriel appeared to her at the Annunciation.

According to tradition, a band of angels stopped up the house from the Holy Land, transporting it first to Tersato, Dalmatia in 1291, Recanati, Italy, in 1294, and finally to Loreto, Italy, where it has remained for centuries.
