A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Do not put your trust in princes, in mortals, in whom there is no help. When their breath departs, they return to the earth; on that very day their plans perish. Happy are those whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord their God. - **Psalm 146:3-5**

In the Old Testament we read of how God made a promise to King David that one of his descendants would eventually come to sit upon a throne that would endure forever. Of course, we are able to look back and see that what God was promising and what the Jews believed is that the Messiah (the Christ) would be of the Davidic line, a son of King David. And so He was.

In the course of the history of Israel we can also read of how varied were the kings in the line of David. Some were good and others ok; some were rotten, and others were just downright evil. Israel became a divided kingdom at enmity with each other and ultimately was destroyed by conquest and exile. Clearly, I am painting the history of Israel with very broad brush strokes and the point that I am trying to make is that through all of the ups and downs, and the twists and turns, one thing remained a constant, the love of God for His people and His fidelity to the promises that He had made, despite all of the degeneracy and idolatry.

Considering God's power to save I suppose we should always find it supremely interesting that we are never really interested in God's power but in man's. We would much rather prefer a messiah of our own choosing, democratically elected of course, than the one God has chosen from all eternity, His Son. They cried out, 'Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!' Pilate asked them, 'Shall I crucify your King?' The chief priests answered, 'We have no king but the emperor.' -John 19:15 And so there you have it.

A thing that I find super fascinating is a current that has run fairly deeply in culture these past couple of decades, a way of thinking that somehow believes that in our state of moral degeneracy, which shows no signs of slowing down or even improving, that we still somehow deserve a government that is just, free of corruption and has our best interests at heart, so that we can all pursue our "American Dream" and live as we please no matter how morally corrupt our life may be. However, and without diminishing the goodness of honest men and women who honorably serve in elected office, at the end of the day we have the ruling class that we deserve.

I do not find this to a be a very complicated way of looking at the world we live in, in fact the equation is pretty simple and straight forward. The tyranny, corruption, and moral bankruptcy of those who govern usually do so in proportion to the corruption and moral bankruptcy of those they govern (the tyranny part belongs to those who govern as a consequence of our slavery to our passions). This is the way it has always been, and this is the way it always will be, and unfortunately the innocent, or nearly innocent, must suffer greatly on account of it. (Think of Lot in the Book of Genesis, the brother of Abraham who lived in Sodom. He rescued Lot, a righteous man greatly distressed by the licentiousness of the lawless (for that righteous man, living among them day after day, was tormented in his righteous soul by their lawless deeds that he saw and heard), then the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from trial, and to keep the unrighteous under punishment until the day of judgement—especially those who indulge their flesh in depraved lust, and who despise authority. 2 Peter 2:7-10

What took place at the Whitehouse this past week was outrageous and beyond the pale, almost as if we were trying to debase ourselves as far as we possibly could in the eyes of the world and beg to be made a laughingstock. I don't care at this point what political party you prefer but what we saw take place in our nation's capital should have shocked the consciences of all and grieved every American deeply. Yet, then again, we are only reaping what we have sown.

The good news is that God still loves us and He loves our country, and yes, even yes, He loves the degenerates and perhaps even more so given that people who are well do not need a physician but only sick people. And on this point we cannot be confused. The world must go the way that the world must go and God's love for us never changes. The point I am hoping and will hopefully continue to make is that we *desperately* need a messiah, and I can promise you that he or she does not have an "R" or a "D" after their name. I am *not* sorry to disappoint you on that one small fact. More on all of this later, and there will always be more and in the meantime, can I ask of you a favor? More for yourself than anything; read and engage instead of watching and consuming.


NATIVITY OF SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST Feast Day June 24th


