A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This morning I was somewhat contemplating what the reaction in the parish would be if I started using our parish media (bulletin, website, and Flocknote...the pulpit) to continually call into question Bishop Vetter's governance of the diocese and cast doubt on his loyalty to the Christ and His Church and the orthodoxy of his faith. If I fed you with a steady diet of such bitterness and diatribe what would the effect on the parish be? What if I included frequent swipes at my brother priests?

I think I know what the result would be. Yet, and yep, here I go again, why do we tolerate such nonsense when it is directed toward the Holy Father and bishops that are not our own?

I was considering these things because we can get so caught up in the unreal of the media we that we fail to see what God is actually doing on the ground, where our feet should be. Things that are actually real.

On Friday, June $23^{\rm rd}$, Kyle Tannehill was ordained a priest. Just consider that for one moment. Here we are living in this insane clown world, and yet, in a cathedral without one empty seat, a young man of great potential, forsaking the vanities of this world and its empty promises, chose to kneel before our bishop and receive the laying on of hands and made a promise of obedience.
