The color blue relates to the blue-colored uniforms predominantly used by these services. The Mass is an opportunity for the community to show gratitude to first responders and their families. This year the Blue Mass will be celebrated by the Most Rev. Michael Mulvey, STL, DD. 

SEPTEMBER 11th PATRIOT DAY!



On September 11, 2001, at 08:45 on a clear Tuesday morning, an American Airlines Boeing 767 loaded with 20,000 gallons of jet fuel crashed into the north tower of the World Trade Center in New York City. The impact left a gaping, burning hole near the 80th floor of the 110-story skyscraper, instantly killing hundreds of people and trapping hundreds more in higher floors. As the evacuation of the tower and its twin got underway, television cameras initially appeared to be a freak accident. Then, 18 minutes after the first plane hit, a second Boeing 767–United Airlines Flight 175–appeared out of the sky, turned sharply toward the World Trade Center and sliced into the south tower near the 60th floor. The collision caused a massive explosion that showered burning debris over surrounding buildings and the streets below. America was under attack!

What is the Association with Columbus?

The Genoan explorer who discovered the New World in the 15th century believed from early on that it was his destiny to carry the Gospel of Christ across the water. The Catholic Columbus, whose first name means "Christ Bearer," is almost universally regarded as a national hero. It was for these reasons and more that in 1882 he was chosen as the patron for the Knights of Columbus. This allowed the Knights to remind the entire country of the Catholic roots of the New World. It also highlighted the truth that Catholics can also be good citizens – a view not widely held in the late 1800s.

KNIGHTS DECLARE SEPTEMBER 11th A 'WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR PEACE'

The Knights of Columbus called on all people of faith to observe Sept.11, 2022, as a "World Day of Prayer for Peace." The Knights began observance of a World Day of Prayer for Peace in 2004 with a resolution passed at the Order's annual convention.

A full page ad in the *New York Times* on September 11 brought a simple message to more than a million people with the words: "September 11th: A day to pray for peace and those working to achieve it."

"As we pray for peace on Sept. 11, we not only honor the memory of those who were killed that day five years ago, but also in a special way all the brave men and women of the military who have sacrificed so much, even their very lives, to bring about true peace rooted in justice," said Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson "Faced with a situation in the Middle East where peace seems ever more elusive, now more than ever we must 'implore from God the precious gift of peace' as Pope Benedict has encouraged all believers to do."

The Knights of Columbus was one of the first organizations to provide financial assistance to the families of the fallen emergency personnel. Within two days of the attacks in 2001, the Knights began providing checks of \$3,000 – for immediate needs – to family members of emergency workers who lost their lives in the attacks, regardless of their religious affiliation. Ultimately more than \$1.49 million was disbursed – with a minimum of red tape – to wives and children of police, fire and other emergency workers. Recipients would later receive a second check for more than \$500.

The Knights has marked each subsequent anniversary of 9/11 with special events. In 2002, a memorial Mass was held at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. to honor and pray for those killed. In 2003, a September 11 exhibit was unveiled at the Knights of Columbus Museum in New Haven, Conn. And since 2004, the Knights of Columbus has called on its members and all people of faith to recognize the day as the "World Day of Prayer for Peace."

Grant that those whose lives were spared may live so that the lives lost may not have been lost in vain. Comfort and console us, strengthen us in hope, and give us the wisdom and courage to work tirelessly for a world where true peace and love reign among the nations and in the hearts of all. Amen.


