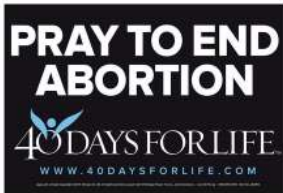

Presentation of the Lord

On **February 2**, the Church celebrates the feast of the **Presentation of the Lord** which occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus. This feast commemorates how Jesus, as a baby, was presented to God in the Temple in Jerusalem. This presentation finds its complete and perfect fulfillment in the mystery of the passion, death and Resurrection of the Lord. The *Feast of the Presentation of the Lord* is a combined feast, commemorating the Jewish practice of the purification of the mother after childbirth and the presentation of the child to God in the Temple and his buying back (redemption) from God. It is also known as the *Feast of the Purification of Mary*, and the *Feast of Candlemas*.

Consider Your Situation

We expect Jesus, the light of the world, to teach a way of living radically different from our culture. In the Beatitudes he challenges our basic values. He says we are blessed (fortunate) if we are conscious of being inadequate (poor in spirit), experiencing the dark side of life (mourning), powerless or unwilling to resist injustice with force (meek), unsatisfied by anything life offers (hungering and thirsting for righteousness), involved in others' problems (merciful), looking at everything through the eyes of religion (single-hearted), ready to lose face, possessions and freedom for the sake of peace (peacemakers), and suffering insults, lies and persecution for righteousness' sake, that is, for our faith.

The key to such a life is love. God is love, and Jesus' great command is to love one another as he has loved us, even to lay down our lives for others. Humility makes love possible; pride always obstructs it. We have to make ourselves the least of all as Jesus did in order to love as Jesus did. Hate springs from pride, taking our own judgment of others as the criterion of truth and falsity.

According to Saint Ignatius of Loyola, the devil's basic strategy is to tempt us to two things which are not sins—affluence and status—in order to lead us into the deadliest sin of all—pride. Jesus' basic strategy is to encourage us to be voluntarily poor and to welcome the humiliations which come from this so that we might grow in humility. Jesus' approach flatly contradicts our cultural values.

Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13;
I Corinthians 1:26-31; Matthew 5:1-12a

Are not people with money treated with more respect than poor people? If we receive more respect or recognition than others, are we not tempted to consider ourselves better than others? If we only think this way about particular qualities, it is not yet pride—simply vanity or conceit. But if because we are “worth more” than others financially we begin to think we are worth more than others as human beings, very shortly we will begin seeing ourselves as the criterion, the standard of what is right and good. Then we are deeply into pride.

If we are rich and respected, it is very hard not to begin thinking of ourselves as the “right kind” of people, to think that our way of living, of thinking, of evaluating things, is therefore the “right” way for everyone. Such ideas make us the standard and that is pride, making ourselves like God.

It is dangerous to be treated as if we were more important than other people because this makes us begin thinking that we are. This makes us assume, perhaps unconsciously, that satisfying our needs is more important than fulfilling the needs of others, the poor and mar-



ginalized, for example. Then we may use our economic and political power to favor the established class. The rich grow richer while the poor suffer exploitation and injustice. But it seems right to us because the “right kind of people” are doing it and what the “right kind of people” think and do must be right.

Riches, prestige and pride contribute to *forced poverty, injustice and marginalization*, which St. John Paul II identified as the basic causes of war. Echoing Zephaniah (“Seek righteousness, seek humility”), he called Christians to live evangelical poverty, respect human dignity and form community with the poor and disadvantaged (World Day of Peace message, January 1, 1993). And Saint Paul reminds us that to begin the Church God “chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are.” If we want to love as Jesus taught, a three-step program is laid out for us: Refuse affluence, shun the prestige which often goes with it and seek the Lord with the “humble of the land.”

REFLECTING ON THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

Fourth Week of the Year

Pray daily: Lord, I believe that you are the Way, the Truth and the Life. Strengthen me to turn away from the way of life that affluence makes possible, from the distorted perceptions into which prestige can lead me and from the living death of indifference to the poor, which is the fruit of pride. Amen.

Monday: Luke 2:22-40 (Presentation of the Lord). “Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord.” How do you present yourself to the Lord? Does the Presentation of the Gifts at Mass or quiet individual prayer remind you that you are “consecrated to the Lord?”

Tuesday: Mark 5:21-43. “When he had entered, he said to them, ‘Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping.’ And they laughed at him.” Have you ever been ridiculed for expressing the truth you know from faith? Has it made you afraid to express your faith?

Wednesday: Mark 6:1-6. When Jesus began to teach in the synagogue, many who heard him were astounded. They said, “Where did this man get all this?... Is not this the carpenter?” Do you think the work you do makes you more important than others? Can you treat with dignity people who do jobs you consider “less important”?

Thursday: Mark 6:7-13. “He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts.” Why did Jesus send his disciples to preach in poverty? What in your life bears witness to the gospel as strongly as this?

Friday: Mark 6:14-29. Herod “was deeply grieved; yet out of regard for...the guests, he did not want to refuse her.” Do you ever do wrong from fear of losing prestige or status in others’ eyes?

Saturday: Mark 6:30-34. The apostles gathered around Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. He said to them, “Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.” When you have a successful day, does it lead you to go aside with Jesus and pray?

LIVING THIS WEEK'S GOSPELS

As Christian: Treat someone with special respect because you recognize him or her as the Body of Christ, and not because of that person’s position, status or prestige.

As Disciple: List three things that give people status in this world. Match them with something Jesus said about what gives people value in God’s eyes.

As Prophet: Identify something you wear, do or display mostly to impress others. Change it.

As Priest: Notice the ways some people around you are treated with less respect. Show them special respect.

As King: Select some way you can live just a little more simply; use the money you save to benefit the poor.
